

e've had a couple of months now to refocus upon bar and kitchen operations. Our General Manager Fritz Reterman and Chef Troy English have devoted themselves to instituting cost control measures that as of our October 03 financials appear to be on target. Two separate committees have been meeting weekly with Fritz and Troy as adjustments are being made that should enable us to hit our 04 budgetary projections. I want to thank Vice Commodore Steve Harris, Rear Commodore Mark Russell, Governor Terri Gatton, Commodore/Head Trustee Tim Maite, Commodore/ Trustee Nick DeSantis, and our Secretary/Treasurer Keith Dotson for their efforts on these committees. Both committees will continue to meet to assist both Fritz and Troy as we work together to insure that our '04 budget, with respect to bar and kitchen cost centers (goods, labor, and miscellaneous

costs) are aligned according to our monthly projections. The benefit of this effort from a member's perspective is that we will be able to maintain a high level of personalized service, high quality product, and a pricing structure enabling us to realize a break-even margin throughout the year. As I hear on the radio each morning, "it's your money" and as I have stressed in each bar and kitchen committee meeting, it's your (members) Club. The Bar and Kitchen Survey form is still available, continued input (positive and negative) will help us meet our budgetary objectives. Please refer to Rear Commodore Mark Russell's article for further information. Mark has been doing a great job working directly with Fritz and

Speaking of our budget, the January Log and your monthly bill will include a summary of income adjustments for 04 that have been approved by the Board and Trustees. A thirty-five dollar increase in Active Member dues, a ten percent increase in dock fees, and an approximate three-hundred dollar increase in the initiation fee for new members should enable us to reach our goal of operationally breaking even, and functionally having funds for much needed house and grounds (capital) repairs and renovations. However, as per the last paragraph, it is imperative that we control bar and kitchen costs if our budgetary projections are to be realized. Consequently, efforts will continue to monitor and scrutinize all expenditures to insure budgetary integrity.

One huge factor that has contributed to our ability to keep income fees at a minimum as per our '04 budget has

been the addition of a new administrative accounting staff resource. Cathy Hull has returned to the BLYC. Her efforts, along with Secretary/ Treasurer Keith Dotson's direction and guidance, have given us an increased level of confidence to provide a high level of quality service and product, and concurrently operate our bar and kitchen within budgetary parameters. Welcome back, Cathy !!!

The Board has approved two Hou and Grounds projects. One will be the replacement of the Commodore's Lounge door, and the second is the renovation of the "pool room" which will now be referred to as the game room.

Governor Stone Parker has worked with the Jr. Sailing Committee and the Board to establish a game room use policy to insure (along with renovations,) that the game room will become a place all members will be able to use with pride. Use of the game room will be controlled by a manager's log and a key and control sheet will be available at the bar. The game room use policy will be posted throughout the Club. Governor Parker's work and leadership on this project represents the spirit of a working Board of Governors, a Club tradition.

Vice Commodore Steve Harris is also demonstrating strong leadership with respect to House and Grounds daily maintenance and repair/renovation projects. New standards are being established. Refer to Steve's article for an update on Porch Committee progress.

Governor Terri Gatton has also been working diligently to upgrade our entertainment schedule to provide more

Use Of BLYC Game Room

- 1. The game room will remain locked except when in use.
- 2. Smoking is not allowed in the game
- 3. The cabinets built into the wall in the game room are off limits.
- 4. Active members and their guests, and junior racing team members (age 12 or older) and their guests (age 12 or older) may use the game room.
- 5. Children under age 12 may only be in the game room when under the direct supervision of a member or a responsible adult of the member's designation who follows the procedures listed

- herein. The member will assume all responsibility for the use of the game room.






