

Governor Stone Parker has published or will soon publish the 2004 handicaps for the cruiser fleet. USSAILING.org has an excellent article on converting PHRF to time on time multipliers, which is how we run our races. Generally, the system has a different factor for average wind, heavy wind, and very

light wind. As a racer, I know some conditions favor some boats over others on the same course. Unfortunately, we have not consistently measured wind for our races. I will record wind this year, and compare race results using all three wind factors. At the end of the year I would hope to have a pattern established, to suggest a wind adjusted handicap. The objective would be to give every boat a fair race in all wind conditions.

Past Commodore George Fisher gave an excellent lecture in January. One of the points I picked up was the growing preference for a two leg windward leeward race course. We may start using this course more often, when wind conditions create a poor jibing

mark, or when wind forces a course where the windward mark would have to be rounded to starboard.


