

S pring has sprung and there's plenty going on at the Club to get our facility ready for the coming season. At the March meeting of

the Board of Governors, bids for new carpeting on the front porch were reviewed and accepted. Weather permit ting, we will have the carpet laid the first week of May. Thank You to the BLYC Auxiliary for your generous donation to help spur the porch project along! In addition to replacing the carpet, we are also looking at other modifications and improvements to the porch - primarily, we hope to replace the porch railing which is definitely showing its age. We hope to install new railing that better reflects the "beadboard" design and style of the original Clubhouse. As always, suggestions and comments on how we can best improve the porch are always appreciated. There will be a period of time in May that the porch will be undergoing renovation. The porch will be usable, but perhaps not too attractive. We are working to have all renovations completed by Memorial Day and appreciate everyone's patience during construction.

With the coming of spring, one major project will be the landscaping at the Club. We are fortunate this year that we now have a Master Gardener among our members who is willing to

- Possible installation of the new 20' umbrella in the pool area

We'll get started around 8:30 a.m. with coffee and doughnuts and begin work about 9:00. Lunch and beverages will be provided for all who work.

Work day is a great day to get involved, help your Club, and enjoy the fellowship of the BLYC. Anyone who would like to offer their special skills or specific projects you would like to work on, please let me know.

# Race & Regatta THE GREAT

THE GREAT RACE

East National Thistle Races at Saint Petersburg Yacht Club in Tampa Bay, Florida, from March 1-5, 2004. This is the 49th annual meeting at the Midwinters. A fleet of 62 boats participated in this race. Eight of these 62 boats were skippered by either past Olympic sailors or by sailors who had qualified for Olympic sail offs. Many of the teams were sailing with professional endorsements. Sailing in Tampa Bay was extremely challenging. Currents and tides combined with high winds made for a very challenging sail in the Thistle. Walter, Sr., had to withdraw from the competition after two days, leaving Walt, Jr., and Brett to race this boat in high winds and challenging conditions.

This left the boat disadvantaged without the extra weight on the rail. They stayed in the regatta, and by Friday the last day of racing their best finish was 28<sup>th</sup> in a fleet of 62, which is outstanding given the competition and the boat being too light for conditions.

Friday was the last day, last race. Walt and Brett made the tactical decision to start at the pin/port side of the starting line, even though the rest of the fleet had been starting at the committee boat/starboard side of the starting line. This starboard side start was considered advantaged because of currents, which interfered with boat speed on the port side start. The port side turned out to be a brilliant start of the race for our team. They passed the pin right on the gun, and pulled ahead of the fleet with clear air, with the rest of the fleet stalled. They held the lead through the windward mark. On the downwind leg, one of the week's leaders overtook them. However, using wind shifts and working the boat, Walter and Bret were able to regain the lead and take a first place for the final race of the regatta. Getting a "bullet" in a fleet of this quality is truly a great achievement for any sailor. The entire fleet of Thistle sailors was so impressed with this brilliant sailing, that Walt Jr., as skipper, received the award for "Most Awesome Move of the Week."

To me, the most impressive part of this win is that they not only got a brilliant start, but were able to hold the lead with a boat that was disadvantaged, without the third person on the rail that the rest of the competition had working in the race.

We at Buckeye Lake Yacht Club should all congratulate the Grubbs and Brett on their perseverance, dedication, and brilliant sailing. This type of success is a great motivator for the rest of us in the fleet, and is one of those great moments that we as racers all remember. Congratulations again to our BLYC Thistle Team. Best wishes for many more great races.




