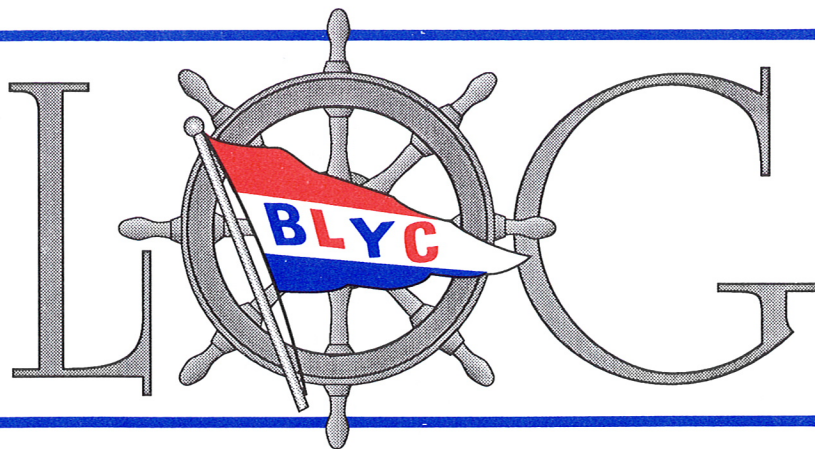

- Race and Regatta - Governor Bendig is going to add an additional spark this year. I have never seen a Governor so enthusiastic and ready


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to get started. If you haven't sailed, or don't have a boat, contact Chuck, try crewing or just ask for a ride.

As requested by Commodore Geiger, I am including a few comments about the Inter-Lake Yachting Association, of which our Club is a member, which makes all our members, members (what a sentence, I hope my English teacher never sees this).

The I-LYA was established in 1885 for the basic purpose of protecting and promoting the interests of boat owners and water sports fans in the enjoyment of their sport. The I-LYA's membership includes 141 Canadian and American clubs in the Lake Erie area. I-LYA works hand-in-hand with the U.S. Sailing Association and class racing associations, and is the appeals body for race protests in its area.

The I-LYA is our watchdog for proposed legislation that may affect yachting and yachtsmen, and serves as a clearing house for yachting information.

The I-LYA is the leader in generating junior sail racing in the Midwest. Its Junior Race Week is a model for others all over the country. The winning skipper and crew and the second place finishers of the I-LYA Junior Championship are awarded scholarships to the college of their choice. These scholarships are a gift of the Yachtsmen's Fund.

The I-LYA is the leader in developing future power boaters with its Powerboat Junior Leadership Training and Navigation Contests.

The I-LYA established a foundation, the Yachtsmen's Fund, to support training, education, and junior activities.

The I-LYA seeks corporate sponsorship to improve its services and con-

trol costs. And we get all this for one dollar per member.

Of course, you are eligible to join the Yachtsmen's Fund as a personal member by sending the I-LYA as little as \$10 for a one year membership or as much as \$500 for a life membership (you can also get a life membership by sending \$100 a year for 5 years).

The burgees displayed behind the bar are burgees of I-LYA member clubs, and since these are the clubs of people that are most likely to be visiting sailors, we wanted to show their burgees in a highly visible way.

The paddle over the bar with the thistle on the blade represents our one-design fleet, Thistle Fleet #83, and we hope to add more paddles as we get more one-design fleets (there have been suggestions that we hang an outboard motor to represent the PHRF fleet, but PHRF is not really a one-design fleet).

The sailing camp application form is elsewhere in the *Log*. Please consider enrolling your children in one or more of our camps this summer.

The area is a bit unstable and requires some structural as well as cosmetic repair. The good news is that it is at the far end of Area 8 and is not used by many members.

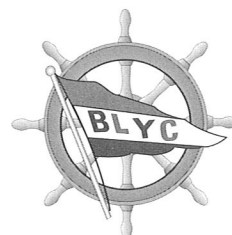
