

ooking back to our June Log, I need to make a couple of corrections.

Thanks, Ray, for a job well done! Governor Kent is also working diligently to secure bids for a new Clubhouse roof. I don't know when, but we cannot wait much longer to replace our roof, if we want to avoid costly repairs in the future.

s promised the BLYC webcam is up and running at camerawebpage.com/ blyc. When you first visit the site you will need to download Java. It is

free, the screen prompts you to it with the "no image? click here!". I have downloaded it without any interference with my other software. I do not know if there is a patch that will work with Apple computers. If anyone gets it working, please let me know. We have already had over 2000 hits in less than three weeks of use. The camera has a control for each user to pan 270 degrees from the race shack all the way around to the pool and North bank looking west. The camera does not have audio connected since it is an all weather outside connection. I was a little disappointed with the lack of high resolution zoom, but the tech rep explained the club's line speed prevents transmitting any higher resolution.

Boats are sailing. We had a great Memorial day weekend with the best BLYC long distance race I have ever sailed. Matt and Michael Davis crewed for me, and Michael got his first experience with high wind racing. Great conditions. Most weekends so far have been good wind, June 6 was light, and we had to cancel May 16 due to no wind. I try to get an accurate wind reading at the start of each race. We do not count the race if wind at the start is less than 5 mph. Race results are showing different winners, which validates the handicap system. I would still like to tweak it a little for different wind conditions for next year. Has anyone ever seen a handicap comparing Thistles, Flying Scots and Highlanders to cruisers? We have members with one designs who like to race, but can't get three of their class on the line. Maybe next year we could agree on a handicap for the one designs, so they could at least get a race with the cruisers. The problem, of course, is that the one designs are so much faster. It would be hard to match them up under all wind conditions.

I continue to post the results for the weekend races not only on the board in front of the Club, but also on our group site at <a href="http://">http://</a> groups.yahoo.com/group/blycsailing/. Vice Commodore Steve Harris has put links for both the BLYC web cam and the BLYC sailing yahoo group on the BLYC home page. The link for the sailing group is in the Race and Regatta window.

Thanks to Sally Day, Pam Green and Don Day for race shack duty. I honestly don't know how I would get the races done without them, and sometimes they even take over so I can run down to my boat and get in a race. Their help is sincerely appreciated.

Please also be aware of and report any suspicious individuals or activities. As a reminder, the chain locks on both gates at the yard must be locked. It has been relayed to me several times that the gates are unlocked. I have heard a multitude of reasons why this occurs, but it does not change the fact that we must lock our premises when we are done.

We have ordered new port-o-let facilities for the Eastport yard. There will be both men's and women's facilities. The installation should be complete by the time you read this article. 


