

with the disadvantage of shorter length at waterline, a traditional hull design, and no dry dock, was able to show dramatic sailing skill this season of racing, and win the Chris J. Lambrecht Cup for 2004. He consistently finished neck-to-neck with many of the other boats in the fleet, even though his boat is significantly disadvantaged because of its reduced waterline. I know I personally have made adjustments in the way I sail downwind, thanks to watching Bill sail by me in a boat that is supposed to be slower than my boat. Again, congratulations to Bill and Sally.

I continue to work on the handicapping issues for next year's racing season. Ed Riley and I will review the results of this year's racing and discuss handicapping with the fleet captain for the cruiser fleet. I believe handicapping has to be reviewed every season in order to continue to provide all boats with a

fair adjustment. Handicapping becomes extremely complex when boats are of so any different sizes, sail areas, and weights. A good handicapping system produces a race where every boat has an equal chance of winning the race as it goes across the starting line, where the skills of the skipper and crew determine the outcome of the race. Unfortunately, no system achieves that perfect result.

As I finish my first year as the Race and Regatta Governor and start another year, I again thank all of the people who have made my job so enjoyable. Sally and Don Day and Pam Green have been regulars at the starting shack all season. Ed Riley has been great handling the statistics for us. John Watson, as usual, has done a great job with the Snowball Regatta. The volunteers working with the sailing program exemplify the friendliness and cooperation of our Club and its members.
