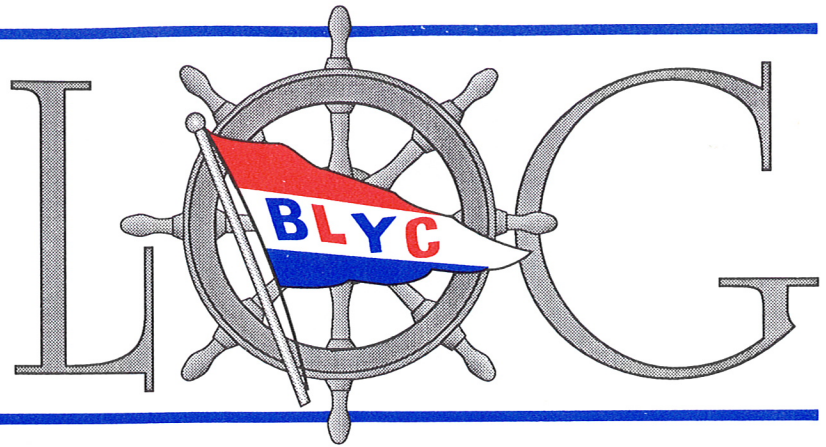

I would like to wish all the members of BLYC and their families a Happy and Safe Holiday Season this year. See you around the Club.

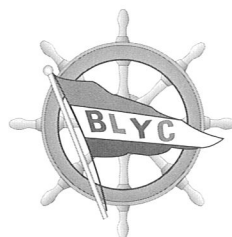

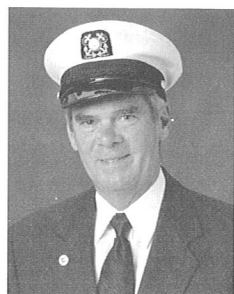
## Membership

## Race & Regatta

Ed Riley has done a great job building a database for boat performance during the 2004 racing season. PHRF data is inherently unreliable. It attempts to take a particular cruiser design and gives that cruiser a single speed factor, ignoring that each boat within that design has many special features, and that every ocean, lake, or bay has special features, which also affect the boat's performance. Leaving our fleet of cruisers frozen in the same PHRF, and ignoring actual performance during the races, creates an uncompetitive environment, where for any particular race at Buckeye Lake a particular boat has an unreasonable advantage against other boats sailing the same race. The best way to balance the boats is to look at actual performance and use that as the benchmark for future handicapping. This also optimizes the challenge to each individual boat, since if it continues to outperform other boats, it is racing above its statistical average.

Attempting to create an optimal competitive environment, Ed and I have carefully gone over the data for the 2004 racing season, and after discussions with Stone Parker, the Cruiser Fleet Captain, I have established the following handicaps for the 2005 Lambrecht Cup Series. Whenever a

particular design had multiple entries, such as the O, Day 25 and O, Day 26, the handicap reflects the best performing boat for that particular design. See Table 1.

On many Sundays we have one design boats, which have crew, but do not have a legal class, since there are less than three boats willing to race. I have, therefore, generated provisional handicaps for one design boats based upon their TOT performances in 2004 over the same course under the same wind conditions. One design boats desiring to compete with the cruisers can do so using these provisional handicaps. However, any score by a one design during a provisionally handicapped race would not apply to the Lambrecht Cup. It would simply give that skipper and crew an opportunity to enjoy an afternoon of sailboat racing, where the skipper and crew could evaluate their performance and the boat's performance against the cruisers competing against it on that particular day.

Provisional handicaps for recreational racing with the cruiser fleet

Thistle 1.19277 (provisional)  
Flying Scot .99413 (provisional)

I also would like to show a spirit of sportsmanship to non members desiring to race, allowing them to compete as a guest boat. As a non member they would not be eligible for the Cup, scoring for the Cup would be based on eligible boats competing. Guests will be welcome to race with our fleet up to three days per season.

Racing Sunday afternoon at 2 p.m. is a great Buckeye Lake Yacht Club tradition. Unfortunately in 2004, neither the Flying Scots nor the Thistles could generate a sanctioned class for the Lambrecht Cup. In an effort to give more opportunities to race, I am including a provision for specially scheduled races. If a one design fleet schedules a race on a day other than Sunday and, prior to the race, obtains the necessary approval from the Race and Regatta Governor, and establishes that it will have sanctioned scoring, that race can then be applied to the one design's overall race data. This will give the one designs more of an opportunity to get 15 races in during the 2005 racing season.

Sailboat racing at Buckeye Lake is a great part of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. Maintaining an accurate and competitive handicapping system will promote our races, and hopefully, increase the number of boats that are in competition during the racing season. A handicapping system will never be completely neutral. Too many things change even during a race to make a handicap completely fair. Even in one design racing, boat speed can be changed dramatically by subtle adjustments. As competitors we would all like to go to the line with the knowledge that if we sail well, and maybe get a few breaks, we will get the bullet at the end of the race. I will continue to evaluate and adjust the scoring system to maximize that expectation for each and every boat as it goes to the line.
