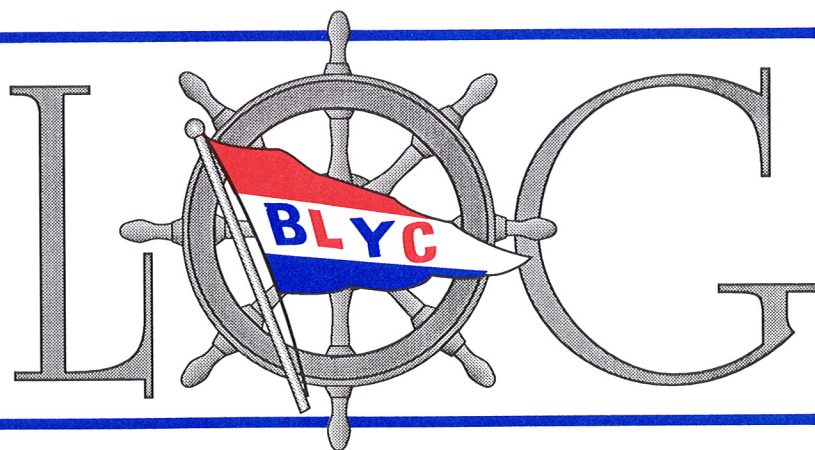


Good-bye Winter and Hello Spring!!!! (Thought you'd never get here!!!!)

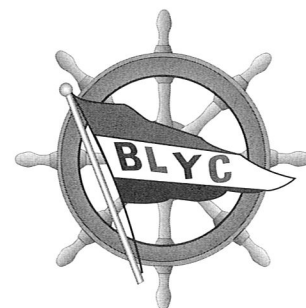
The Annual Easter Egg Hunt will be on Sunday, March 27th. Bring your children and grandchildren for a fun filled afternoon with the "Easter Bunny".

Centennial Celebration Committee

The Centennial Celebration Committee has been meeting since last May, planning a fantastic celebration affair to take place in the year 2006. For the 50th anniversary in 1956, Kyle Armstrong wrote a history of the first 50 years of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. The committee is making arrangements to have that book reprinted. The committee is seeking a person to volunteer to write a history of the second 50 years. Frank Foster III has historical files or references. Proposed amendment to BLYC by-laws; Article II:

Section 6. (a) REINSTATEMENT OF MEMBERSHIP. Any living person whose membership has been terminated for any reason, or for cause, shall be eligible to reinstatement of membership and membership may be reinstated, subject to favorable action of the Governors taken by the concurring roll call vote of not less than two-thirds of their total number; provided that if application for such reinstatement is made within one year after such termination, that such application shall be accompanied by payment of any and all previously unpaid indebtedness to the Club

and of any and all dues and fees which would have been required in absence of such termination.

(b) If more than one year has passed, the person seeking reinstatement shall be subject to the above rules with the exception that "dues and fees" shall be the lesser of either the difference between the initiation fee originally paid and the current initiation fee, or the payment of dues and fees which would have been required in the absence of such termination.

(c) If the person seeking reinstatement was terminated contemporane-

ously with that person's change of principal residence more than 100 miles from the Clubhouse for a period of at least 2 years, that person will have the additional option to pay reinstatement "dues and fees" in the amount of the difference between the present value of the initiation fee that person originally paid (computed by compounding at a 5% annual interest rate the initiation fee originally paid) and the current initiation fee, or the payment of dues and fees which would have been required in absence of such termination.

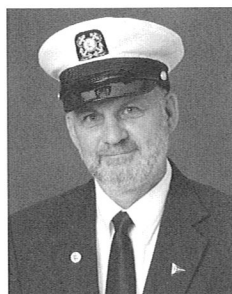

Rentals and Docks

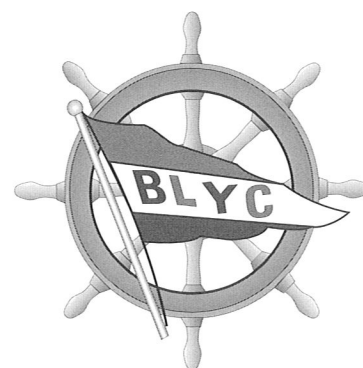

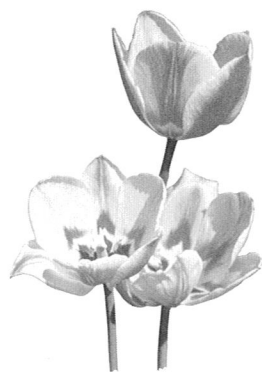

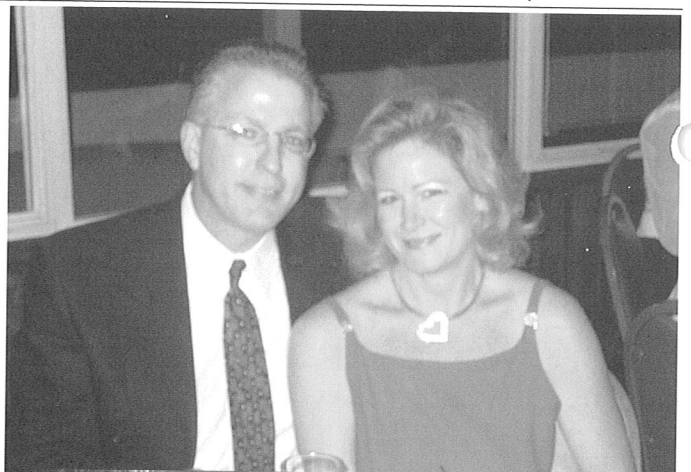

The decision to host a booth at the Columbus Boat and Vacation show turned out to be a good one.

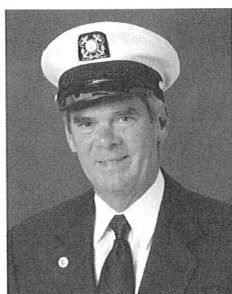
We generated a good deal of interest in the Club from those who visited the booth. We already have one membership that was a direct result of our presence at the show. That application is in the approval process and will be announced next month.

Buckeye Lake Yacht Club Board of Governors Meeting 10 March 2005

By-Laws Amendments Approved

1. Article I, Section 8

Delete the current section and replace with:

Article I. Section 8 (b) DISTAFF MEMBERS who were married to active members with membership dates prior to August 14, 1997 shall be permitted to continue as distaff members. Distaff members may become regular members without the payment of an initiation fee

2. Article I, Section 7

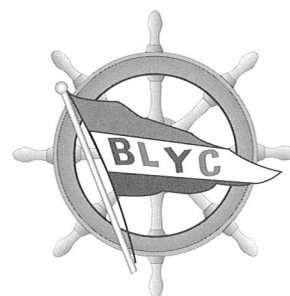
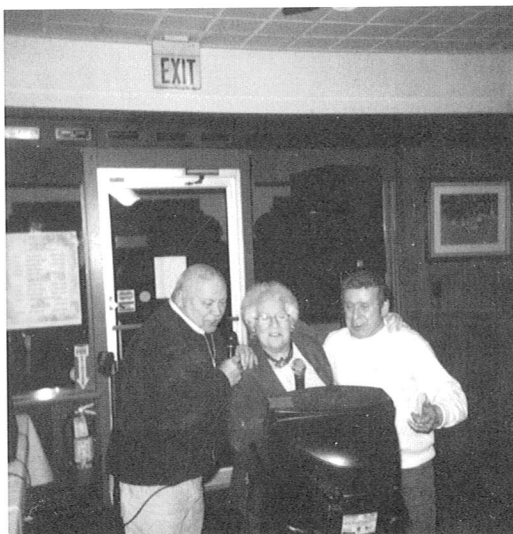
Delete the following section:

Article 1. Section 7 (a) SOCIAL MEMBERS...

3. Article I, Section 5 (b)

Add the following:

Article 1. Section 5 (b) FAMILY MEMBERS. Children of an active member in good standing or the spouse of such active member may be an active member by paying 50% of the initiation fee if they submit their application for membership, or a letter requesting active membership before the following time limit and if they otherwise meet the requirements for membership. The application must be submitted before reaching the age of 40.

The results are very impressive. They finished 35th out of 63 overall and 3rd overall in the B class. "B" class is for skippers that have not competed to at least an 8th or better finish in a National event. The best race was a 13th overall. The result would have been even better but for an OCS 64th place where they were judged over the line early, but did not get a hail with their boat number from the committee boat. With a fleet of 63 boats crowded onto the same starting line, I can see how it would be a real challenge to figure out which boats are over early, and then make sure all the numbers are called promptly. Wind conditions varied from light and variable to 15 mph plus blows. In one race, it was blowing so hard Walter was able to sail downwind without using the spinnaker, and plane right up with the rest of the fleet. "Just a little bit of sail, when you go out in a gale" Congratulations and Thank You for representing our Club so well at a national event.

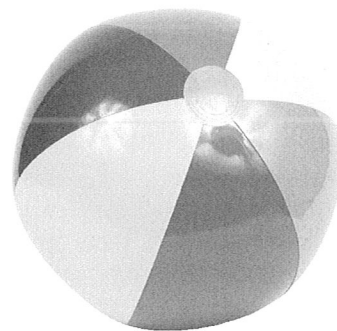

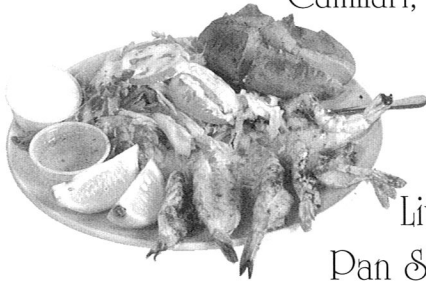
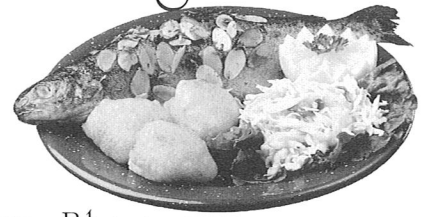
