

Also at the meeting, our Guest Speaker was Andy Hollenbach, Buckeye Lake's new Watercraft Officer. He discussed his role at the lake and his desire to work with us at BLYC in promoting safe and responsible boating activity. We, as the Yacht Club, should set the example for all boaters in the area of safety and seamanship. The Club also presented a commendation to Commodore Frank Foster IV for his heroic rescue efforts on Buckeye Lake, May 1st. As most are already aware, that day a fishing boat carrying two men capsized on our lake and one unfortunately lost his life. Thanks to Frank's quick response, however, the other boater's life was saved. We, as boaters and vachtsmen, can learn from his selfless example and should be willing to render assistance to our fellow boaters whenever possible.

The Annual Commodores' Ball on May 21 was once again a very successful and enjoyable event. Vice Commodore Mark Russell did a wonderful job putting the event together this year to recognize all of our Commodores. On behalf of all BLYC Commodores, Thank You, Mark! That same day,

BLYC hosted the I-LYA Inland Icebreaker Iunior Regatta. Rob Harklau did a fabulous job coordinating all of the many details of this event. Thanks, Rob! This event was the kick-off for the 2005 Junior Sailing season in the Lake Erie region. The regatta included both on- and off-the-water clinics and coaching as well as racing. We were very fortunate to have Park McRitchie, I-LYA's Junior Training and Education Chair and 2003 U.S. Sailing Coach of the Year, as the lead coach/instructor making this event a positive learning experience for many Junior Sailors in the region.

THANK YOU TO EVERY-ONE FOR HELP with the Thistle regatta, and with getting the racing season underway. Racing is a great





Bar & Kitchen

As Mother Nature shows off her color palette in the form of beautiful "May flowers" and we begin to enjoy the



anticipation of Governor Terri Gatton long lazy summer days, our lake is once again the place to be! The BLYC porch is a wonderful vantage point to watch the world go by, grab a bite to eat with friends or simply gaze at our lake and think about how lucky we are to be able to enjoy it!

This year a conscious effort has been made to encourage the Club Manager and Chef to function independently regarding day-to-day operations of the Bar and Kitchen.

Initially, I spent time with both the Club Manager and Chef to familiarize myself with the current processes to get an understanding of what they thought their job descriptions included. Together we went through processes and identified areas that needed to be assessed, and developed a plan to implement changes.

Some of those include having a specialty night such as Mexican and Italian, bringing back Happy Hour drink specials and implementing Early Bird Dinner Specials. These were chosen because members had asked for these changes but more importantly, because these changes demonstrated we (the Board and Management) were listening to our members concerns and valuing their input.

The numbers indicate the Club is experiencing decreased membership that is due to many factors; age of the majority of current members, drops, demits, demographics (statistics show younger folks are much less likely to join a private club) as well as economic issues that impact the membership numbers. Since I have had the opportunity to be out of the state this year, I took this

opportunity to contact several private clubs and yacht clubs to see if they were experiencing the same phenomenon as BLYC. The majority of the seven clubs I spoke with had similar concerns and they told me that they:

- Have a disproportionate number of "older" members.
- Are experiencing a marked decrease in membership.
- Have stopped looking at their kitchen operation as a revenue producer in fact most were using it as a "value added" marketing tool, choosing instead to concentrate on the bar as a profit center.
- Look for alternative methods of funding club operations such as endowments, grants, etc., versus using membership as the driver for operations.

In spite of these statistics, our Club is holding its own. This not only speaks to the loyalty of our membership and their consistent attendance, but also to the fact that the Club Manager and Chef have stepped up to the plate and have been doing a good job with daily operations and monitoring expenses.

There is still work to be done as we enter into the summer season. I am in regular contact with the Club Manager and Chef to ensure we continue to control cost and keep putting processes in place that will ensure we come as close to the operating budget as possible. We also realize there are still operational issues to address, including getting our wait staff service to a consistent and efficient level and implementing further inventorying processes. We will strive to make sure we do everything we can to keep controls in place while making our members experiences as pleasant as possible!

Come on out and enjoy the springtime at the Club!
