


The Club will get one directory and several pages of Club activity pictures for no charge for each member that has a picture taken. For every 25 members that show up for a portrait the Club will receive additional color pages for free. So if 100 members show up for pictures we would receive 100 free directories and 4 free pages of Club photos. If we were to attempt to provide all 500 members with a directory, the cost of the additional 400 directories would be \$4000. Like it or not, one of my duties as membership Governor is to control expenses and the Club cannot afford \$4000 for directories. So please do your part and sit for a portrait.
