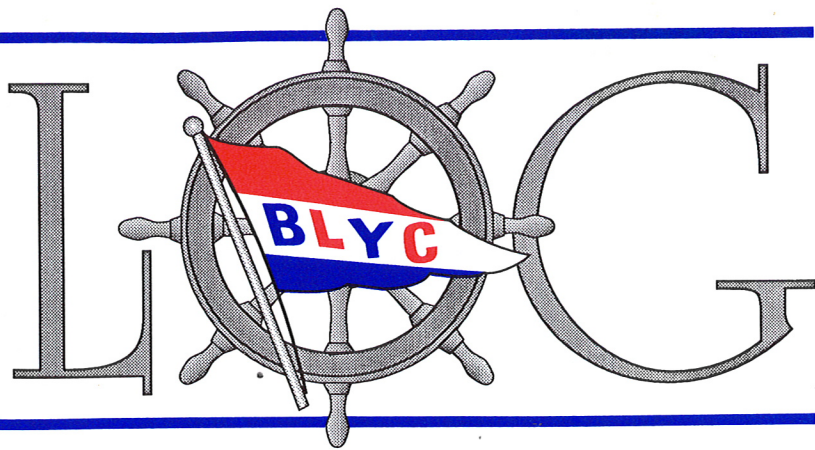

This last month has been hard on the Club with two members we lost — Martha Schell and Becky Sproat. We all will miss them. Also, Brett Pfahl



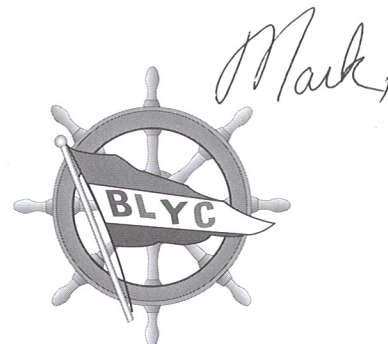

# Off-Season Project List Outlined

## House & Grounds

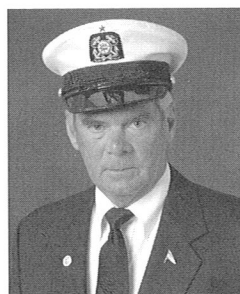
Ahoy mates, it's been a great year and 2006 promises to be even better. I'd like to thank my wife, Joni, for spending many hours on the phone arranging for photo sessions for our new picture directory. The response has been wonderful. We will have a make-up session for those members who were unable to attend our September and October sessions. I will hand the membership duties to Governor Don Harris and he will select a date later in the year for the make-up session. I would also like to thank the Board of Governors for their confidence in selecting me for the position of Rear Commodore. I was flattered by their support and will do my best to live up to their expectations.

This year I will have the responsibility for House and Grounds. I want to take a minute and list the projects that are currently under consideration and various stages of completion:

- The back steps to the kitchen have been repaired with new concrete and steel. They now need a fresh coat of paint. This will require a good deal of rust removal prior to the paint job.
- The carpet for the new side steps to the front porch has been installed. We will be steam cleaning the remaining carpet prior to the onset of colder weather.
- The driveway that leads from the parking lot to the bridge at the front of the Club needs to be repaired in order to prevent the gravel from shifting west toward our gas meter. I have two bids for this job and it will be completed as soon as possible.
- The contract for our lawn care service is up for bid this year. I have two companies that will be submitting bids for next year. The contract will include mowing the island, the overflow parking area, the rental homes, and the Eastport boat stor-

age facility. It will also include weeding and mulching the flower beds at least twice during the season.

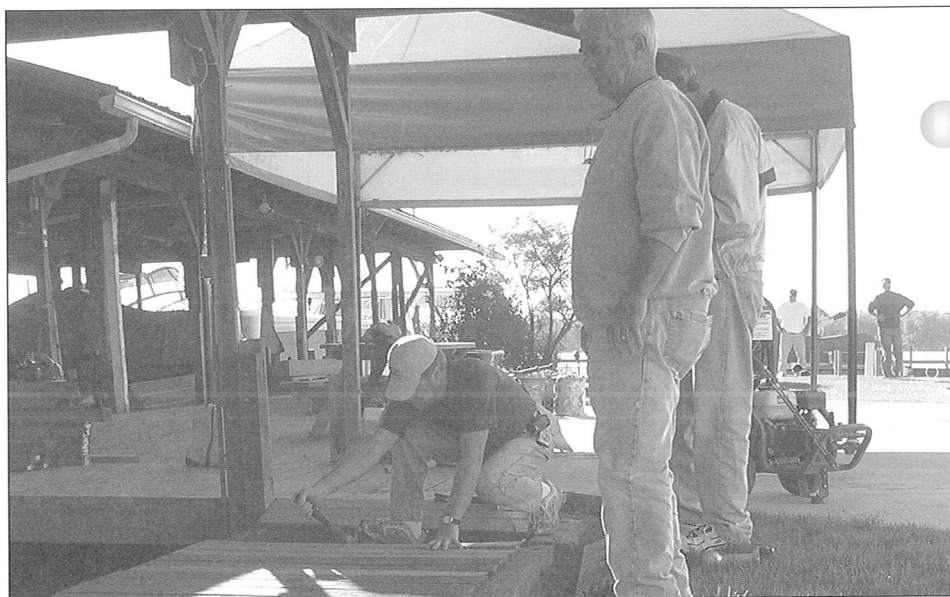
- The wooden walkway in front of the covered docks will be replaced. The new boards will be screwed together so we can remove them when we repair the seawall later in the year.
- The ceiling tiles and lights in the ladies restroom will be replaced. The lights will be canister style and will

# Help Keep Boatyard In Ship Shape

## Rentals and Docks

The time has come when those of us with watercraft will have to plan off-season storage. Seasonal service, proper storage and protection from the winter weather will extend the life and retain the value of your watercraft. I would like to take this time to remind all members who have rented spaces in the Eastport Boat Yard, please make sure that your boat or trailer is in the right slot. If you are not sure, there is a current listing on the DOCKS bulletin board, located on the front porch of the clubhouse. Consideration should be the key. Please help to keep the Eastport Boat Yard in proper order by following a few simple guidelines.

Make sure your boat is in your assigned and rented slot.

(Because you have a rented dock at the Club doesn't mean you get a slot at

the Boat yard. They are separate rentals)

PLEASE identify your trailer(s) by having your name displayed on the front; so from time to time, when I have to move things to their right locations, I know where it goes and to whom it belong. Unidentified units will be removed and poachers will be billed.

Please make an effort to locate your watercraft within your designated slot and perpendicular to the fence. This gives the people next to you their proper amount of space. If you have "stuff" in your slot that spills into your neighbor's slot, please take the time to rearrange or remove said "stuff."

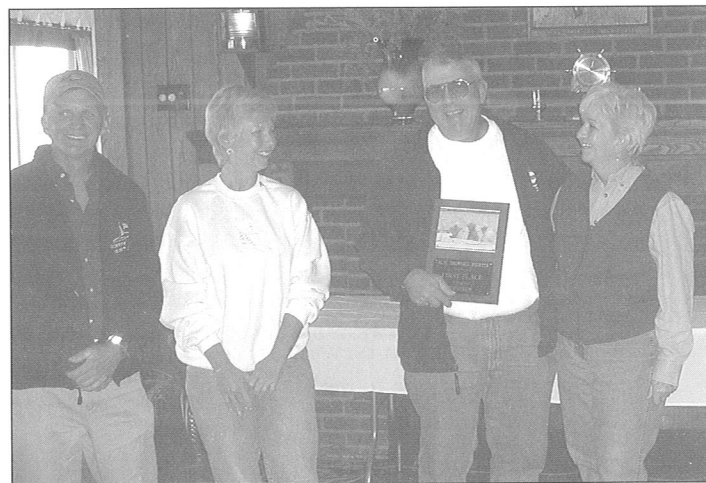

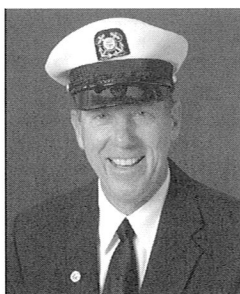
### Junior Sailing

As a person with over 40 years of sailing experience, from Rhodes 19's in Newport Rhode Island to Rebel 16's in San Diego bay, I have some ideas about sailing and teaching sailing. The hardest thing for me to learn was upwind VMG (velocity made good), which simply means getting to the windward mark first. Every winning racer understands

how important this is, and how difficult it is to master. I would like to see our junior sailors acquire an understanding of this, and a higher level of skill at the

end of this racing season. I also found I have learned almost as much from reading about sailing, as I have learned on the water. We have a very limited sailing season. Especially with school and other sports in the Spring. I would like to start a reading program this Winter, focused on tuning issues for each one design in our racing fleet, and

Dinner will be served from 5:00 p.m.

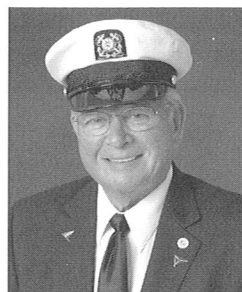
until 9:00 p.m., our regular winter hours.

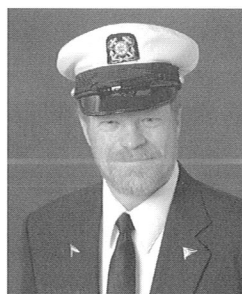

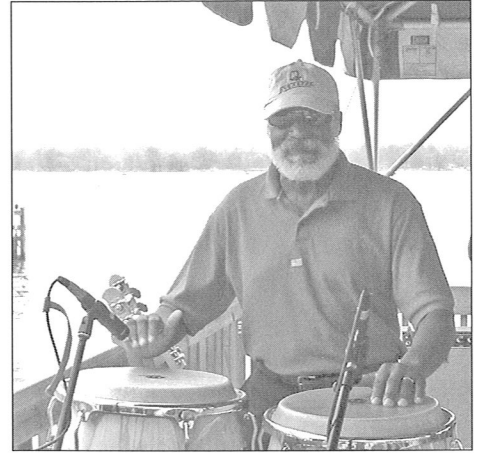


# Buckeye Lake Jam No. 2

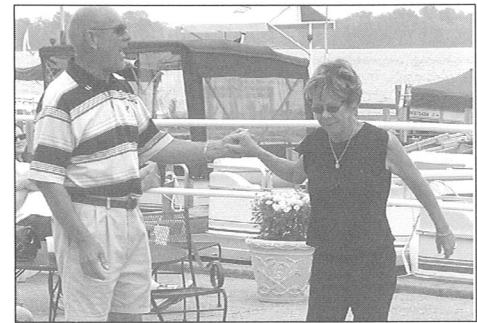
Howard Everitt belts out *Kansas City* with some help from his friends.

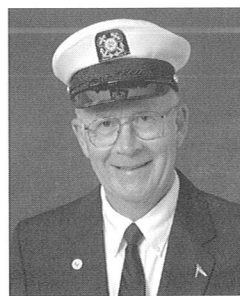

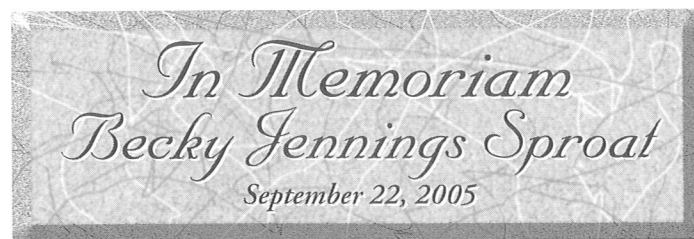
