

With two successful sailing regattas this fall, we have seen and heard the benefits of bringing organized sailing back to the BLYC. Our Club is the most logical place to showcase these events.

The first phase of the reorganization of Eastport Boat Yard, which began in October '04, has opened that area, and some eyes, to allow the space needed for larger regattas. It has also brought Club members off the island to become involved in activities at Eastport. This renaissance has stirred the imagination of many people. There is talk of a permanent facility to house restrooms with showers and storage. This would replace the port-a-johns and the deteriorated little, red building that currently exist.

We are moving forward with the one design platform that was part of the original renovation plans. The problem-

by many of our members has finally been completely rebuilt after many years of neglect and now works like a charm. The water supply to the hose at the lift

has been repaired and replaced, again, (please make sure you shut the water off when you are finished using it, thank you).

I have spent some time going over the 2006 calendar with Commodore Russell and Past Commodore Steve Harris and have decided to make a few minor changes for next year. The past few years we have begun Lambrecht Cup competition on Mother's Day. In 2006, we will begin sailing one week later on May 21 and continue through September 10.

Sunday races will still begin at 2 p.m; however, instead of the 3:30 p.m. cut-off, we will now have a 4:30 p.m. cut-off. This extra hour per Sunday will hopefully bring out more boats and

allow skippers to participate in more races and qualify more easily during the season. This will provide 40 hours of scheduled races (our old schedule would have provided only 24 hours). If this works well this season, we may look at splitting the season into two halves next year.

There will be no sail-offs for the Lambrecht Cup series. The names of the winning skippers of all participating cup-eligible classes will be placed on the Lambrecht Cup, in the order of lowest overall series score to highest, along with the name of the class in which the skipper sailed.


The traditional Long Distance Races on holiday weekends will continue to be sailed as non-Lambrecht Cup races. There will be other regattas scheduled and announced as soon as they are confirmed by the various organizing authorities.

There will be no One-Design Races scheduled for Wednesdays. They were shown on the 2005 calendar and not utilized. The extra time being provided through the extended racing hours should enable the one-designs to qualify easily.

We will be re-evaluating the cruiser PHRF ratings sometime in December or January. If any skippers have comments or suggestions, please get them to me ASAP.

Thanks to Dave Levacy and Steve Harris the Club pontoon has been put away for the winter. Governor Frank Laskowski is going to work on the outboard engine again before we put it back on the lake in the spring. Frank was able to make it usable for the last two regattas and I'm confident that he will be successful again.

As we put the finishing touches on 2005 and look forward to 2006, Sally and I wish you and yours a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! See you at the Club.



Junior Sailors Will Be Active Through Winter

Junior Sailing

I attended the I-LYA Traveler Series meeting with Ray and Ruth Ann Kent in Sandusky on October 22. Our Club will host a Traveler Series clinic here on May 20, 2006.

We expressed an interest in hosting one of the Traveler Series races for the 2007 season. Generally the requirements include three courses,

two launch ramps, Saturday only racing, and a separate start for the Green fleet of Optis. We will be able to meet those requirements. The current Traveler Series includes a regatta on June 10, 2006 at Hoover Reservoir.

The total number of races is seven. We will have to race in four of seven to have an eligible year. If we want to be considered for hosting in 2007, having teams race this year will be a big help. The Traveler Series is a great first race opportunity.

We also committed our Juniors to a team race September 16, 2006 at North Cape. We will enter at least six racers for an eligible team. This will extend our racing beyond Bay Week (July 17-21, 2006), which will give us a full season of racing.

We need to get out on the road if we are going to get competitive experience. Other potential races include:

• Tuesday evening races at Cleveland Yacht Club. They will provide boats, so it is just the road time.

 Opti championship races will be either August 5 or August 26 at Sandusky.

We have established the calendar for our Junior race schedule and for our fundraisers. I am still looking for a coach. Patty Harklau and Greg Miller are helping with the search. I also discussed our interest with people at the Travelers meeting and will keep looking.

Our Winter reading and training program is underway. We had our first meeting on November 20, and will meet monthly through April to study different aspects of trim, tuning, boat speed, and right of way. I also will be sending by e-mail articles and information of interest.

Greg Fisher sent me a very helpful e-mail on good books for Optis, Lazers and general junior sailing. I have ordered them, and will read them and request our Juniors read the ones that apply to their boat.

Equipment issues focus on the leaking CJ. We have to either get it fixed or look into replacing it. The CJ is being phased out of the I-LYA regatta at Put-In-Bay, so we might decide to buy another 420. The CJ also needs new sails, but I am holding off on that issue until I know where we are with the hull.

We are going to have an active, informative junior 2005-2006 sailing season. After all this cold weather activity, we will be on the water early to check out all our new information.

The Club will host Top Cat Karaoke on one Friday night of each month from December-May. As these photos clearly show, a good time is had by all! Join us December 9 for the next performance.



What Meeting is This? — An UNsolved history mystery.

The Way We Were By Comm. Frank H. Foster III BLYC Historian

This is the most interesting History Mystery I have ever seen and I can't solve it. Perhaps you can help.

It all began several years ago when my son, Comm. and Mayor Frank IV was doing some construction work for the Club on the second floor. It necessitated his going into some deep, dark nooks and crannies up under the roof. He found stashed away amid the thick dust a 10"x15" framed photo of about 110 distinguished-looking men dressed in their finest suits and attending a banquet in a pretty nice looking hall. What made it so interesting was the multitude of BLYC flags on the walls and one that appears to be draped over a long submerged tree stump. If ever there was a fitting symbol of Buckeye Lake, that is

it. Hanging from a line extending across the banquet hall were eleven nautical signal flags. I have not displayed this picture because I thought it was a real history prize and my experience has taught me that historical memorabilia has a way of disappearing as new governors take charge and adopt their own views of what should be displayed at the club, without returning things to me for safekeeping for future generations.

What meeting could this be, where was it held and when? The BLYC flags were not the one we know. It was the one that Commodore Kyle Armstrong tells us was adopted at the meeting on Orchard Island on May 6, 1906 to begin the BLYC and replaced by the present burgee at the meeting of September 18, 1910. That narrows the date range. There is a replica of the old flag in the Commodores' Lounge made by Mac

Rising, wife of a former board governor, George Rising from Lancaster.

So, to try to find the place and time I turned, of course, to Commodore Armstrong's book. He describes the early meetings of the club at that time when they were engaged in promoting membership.

The first annual meeting was held at the Lake Tourist Hotel on September 23, 1906. The club had 80 members at that time but there were more in the picture and I doubt that the Lake had a banquet hall that big. But I really don't know. Maybe you do.

The first Tar Social was held at Leachman's in Columbus on January 15, 1907 but Commodore Armstrong said there were about 70 in attendance too few for the picture. But I have never seen Leachman's.

The second Tar Social was held at

the Columbus Rifles Armory at Gay and Front in Columbus. In 1907 the club had about 51 members, but Comodore Armstrong says that there were also guests, largely prospective members, and that the club recruited a "goodly number" of new members. I have never heard of that building, let alone seen it. But if you have any idea what it looked like inside, maybe you can help solve the mystery.

The first "Newark Tar Social" was held on December 17, 1908 with dinner at Kuster & Co.'s restaurant, which was "especially arranged and decorated befitting the occasion". The decoration description fits the photo, but you Newark people will need to look at the photo, if you know what the interior of that restaurant looked like.

"BIG IMPROVEMENT JUBI-ILEE" was how the fourth Tar Social was announced. Held on February 18, '09, two months after the Newark festivity, it was staged in the United Commercial Travelers' new building at 24 West Goodale Street in Columbus. But Comm. Armstrong said 250 people attended, too many for that photo, unless 150 of them all went to the men's room at the same time when the photo was taken. But, there were no empty chairs in the photo.

"MID-WINTER REGATTA"—So the Fifth Tar Social, on February 21, 1910, was advertised. "Tars of BLYC and their landlubber friends", aggregating about 150, again cruised to mess in U.C.T. Hall in Columbus. Everything was appropriately nautical, and other ILYA clubs were well represented. That is about the closest to the number of people I counted and maybe miscounted. But what did the interior of the U.C.T. Hall look like?

There may have been other meetings that Comm. Armstrong did not write about. But this photo obviously memorializes an important event in the history of BLYC. What event was it?

So, how can we solve this mystery? Well, those who have historical books with pictures, especially books that show photos of old buildings, can look

at this photo my son found and then look in your books to see if you can find the room in which it was taken. Maybe it's lost to history. But maybe it can be rediscovered, with your help. If you solve it, I will buy you a dinner with all you can drink of your favorite beverage!

But, what about the nautical signaling flags you nautical types and vexillologists ask? Boy, have I wrestled with that. The photo is not in color and some flags don't appear in the guide to The International Code of Signals, that began in 1855. There appear to be, from right to left, eleven flags with two spaces. I say from right to left because, read in that direction the best I could get was BXY1 NEWARQ O where the underlining indicates letters I feel fairly confident of. Maybe you can do better. It looks an awful lot like BLYC NEW-ARK O[HIO]. Maybe this was the Dec. 1908 Tar Social held in Newark at Kuster & Co.'s restaurant. They didn't have all the flags, figured no one would notice, so used what they had. If so, we noticed in 2005!






