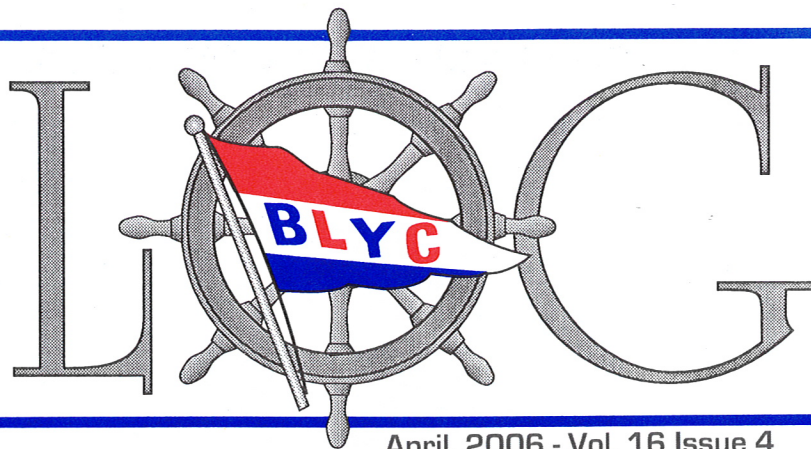

## House & Grounds

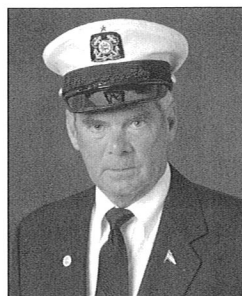

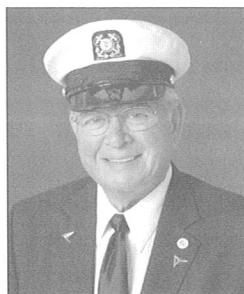
Cathy returns with TOP CAT KARAOKE on Friday, April 14, from 7-11

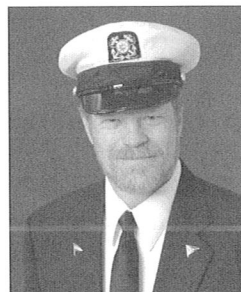
## Welcome Spring... And Do It At The Club

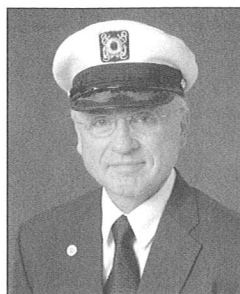
# An Open Invitation To Be Part Of BLYC Sailing Race and Regatta

Wow! What an eye opening experience the "Race Management Seminar" (held Saturday, February 25 at BLYC) was. Approximately 20 people took the course. Attending from BLYC were: Don Harris, Will Price, Bruce Pfahl, George Fisher, Tracey Davis, Matt Davis, Steve Harris, Jim Fortuna and myself. The course ran from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and covered a lot of information. There was an optional test offered at the end for "Club Race Officer" qualification. Not everyone took the test and "pass/fail" notification will be by mail.

I think I was probably the only "non-sailor" taking the course. As a "power boater" I have always enjoyed going from point "A" to point "B" in a straight line. I always thought that sailing was probably relaxing and easy. When you are "cruising" that is an accurate statement; however, after crewing for a few years (in competition) I can honestly tell you that sailing can be a lot of hard work. It truly is amazing to watch a skilled skipper read the surface of the water and tweak the sails to get maximum performance out of his boat.

You can feel a boat accelerate (and seem to get stronger); and, sometimes you can feel it decelerate (and lose all momentum). Both types of boating have their advantages and their disadvantages. So I guess it's a toss-up for me; and it would be difficult to choose one over the other.

Getting back to the seminar. I really have to commend BLYC on the way we've run our races. The United States Sailing Association states that a race management team should consist of ten (10) members. They call for a Principal Race Officer, a Mark Setter, a Wind Reader, a Line Sighter, a Sounder, a Scorer, a Spotter/ Recorder, a Signaller, a Timer and a Committee Boat Operator. We usually run our Sunday races with three or four people. Granted we don't keep all the records that they recommend; but, we do keep adequate records to accomplish the task at hand. With this in mind I'm issuing a plea for

members to help run our races this year. You don't have to be a sailor or to know anything about running a race. I'm hoping to get some help from our junior sailors, also. We will teach you what you need to know to help us have a successful season of racing. Our races will start at 2 p.m. and run until approximately 5 p.m. (no races start after 4:30); so, you will be working with us approximately 3-4 hours. The more help we have the easier it is for everyone. I will put a sign-up sheet in my mailbox in the Club office. Please, consider helping us this year. You will enjoy it.

Saturday, April 29, we will be hosting a Thistle Regatta. Last fall, 16 boats registered and we had some great races. Hope we have an equal or better turnout this time.

May 6, we will have the first Club sailing event of the season. The Centennial Committee has requested a "sailing exhibition" to be part of the Centennial Kick-off activities (see the Notice of Race).

Sailing season is rapidly approaching; so, let's get ready to launch.

That's not exactly an Irish jig that Rosa and Howard Clark are doing to the tunes from *Unsung Heroes*.

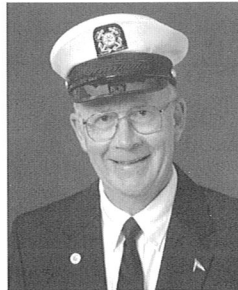
## Welcome Aboard To Our Newest Members!

### Proposed Change To BLYC ByLaws

#### Present Language:

#### Article I, Section 9

- (a) ASSOCIATE MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, each must be at least twenty-one years of age and less than thirty five years of age. Each associate member is entitled to the same privileges as those of an active member excepting Electoral Privileges.
- (b) Associate Members shall be required to pay one-third of the initiation fee upon application for membership and at least one-third of that initiation fee each year until such fee is fully paid; however, that initiation fee must be fully

- paid by the member's thirty-fifth birthday.
- (c) Associate Members may become active members at any time by completion of payment of the Active Members Initiation Fee required at the time of their entry into Associate Membership.

#### Article I, Section 9

- (a) ASSOCIATE MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, each must be at least **eighteen** years of age. Each associate member is entitled to the same privileges as those of an active member excepting Electoral Privileges **and Rental Privileges**.
- (b) Associate Members shall be required to pay one-third of the initiation fee upon

application for membership and at least one-third of that initiation fee **plus a \$120 surcharge** each year until such fee is fully paid. **The initiation fee must be fully paid by the second anniversary of the member's election to Associate Membership.**

- (c) Associate Members may become Active Members at any time by completion of payment of the Active Members initiation fee required at the time of their **application for membership, in which event the surcharge will be prorated to the date of such payment.**
