

House And Grounds In Ship Shape To Start Season

House & Grounds

Things are beginning to come together around the Club as the season approaches. The stone pillars in front of the entrance to our parking lot have been rebuilt. The original design used wood to support the top of the pillars and over time the weather destroyed the wood and the concrete began to fail. The flower beds are ready to be planted and all of the old landscaping has been removed. Our garage units are sporting 10 new steel doors.

The biggest project on our agenda for this year is the replacement of the steel seawall that surrounds the docks and walkways on the island. The existing seawall has rusted to the point that it will fail. No one knows when, but it will fail.

Three different contractors have looked at the project and they are preparing bids for the Board to examine. I can't mention costs in this article because the project is still

in the bidding process. But it is safe to say that it will be expensive. When you consider that we haven't spent any money on the seawall for over 30 years, it's easy to see why the time has come to completely replace it.

The contractors have suggested waiting until our boating season is finished prior to starting the seawall replacement. The biggest factor in the timing of the project is the need to remove all of the docks that are currently attached to the old seawall. Once the new seawall is in place we will begin constructing new docks. The new docks will be of the same general design as Eastport. There will be a walkway between slips that will be shared by boats on either side of the walkway.

There are many details to work out over the next months but we are committed to the completion of this major project.



In other news, the proposed by-law change was approved, expanding the opportunities for BLYC membership. A few changes were made as a result of discussion among the Board of Governors, but the essence of the proposal as published in last month's Log was adopted. Exact wording is published below, and is also available on the BLYC website.

Lastly, the long awaited new club directory has been completed, and is currently at the printers. Hopefully, it will be available to the membership by time of the Centennial kick-off.

New By-law language:

Article I, Section 9

(a) ASSOCIATE MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, each must be at least eighteen years of age and less than thirty-five years of age. Each associate member is entitled to the same privileges as those of an active member excepting Electoral Privileges.

(b) Associate Members shall be required to pay one-third of the initiation fee upon application for membership and at least one-third of that initiation fee each year until such fee is fully paid; however, that initiation fee must be fully paid by the member's thirty-fifth birthday.

(c) Associate Members may become ac-

tive members at any time by completion of payment of the Active Members Initiation Fee required at the time of their entry into Associate Membership.

Article I, Section 10

(a) PROVISIONAL MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, each must be at least eighteen years of age. Each provisional member is entitled to the same privileges as those of an active member excepting Electoral Privileges, Rental Privileges and Member Charge privileges.

(b) Provisional Members shall be required to pay one-third of the initiation fee upon application for membership and at least one-third of that initiation fee plus a \$120 surcharge each year until

such fee is fully paid. The initiation fee must be fully paid by the second anniversary of the member's election to Provisional Membership.

(c) Provisional Members may become Active Members at any time by completion of payment of the Active Members initiation fee required at the time of their application for membership, in which event the surcharge will be prorated to the date of such payment.

Article I. Section 11 **CREW MEMBERS This section was** formerly numbered Section 10, and is unchanged other than its numbering in order to accommodate the new Section 10, PROVISIONAL MEMBERS.


