

Junior Sailing Camp also begins this month. I will be working with Governor Will Price during these camps and hope I can pick up some sailing knowledge during the process.


Lambrecht Cup competition began May 21. I will keep you informed as the season progresses.



100 Years Ago Today On This Same Island...

On Saturday, May 6, a group of approximately 65 BLYC members, family and friends made the journey by boat to Orchard Island to commemorate the first meeting of our Club, held there 100 years ago on May 6, 1906. While the morning was a bit overcast and slightly cool, everyone enjoyed the brief ceremony and the first of five "Historical Vignettes" detailing the history of our Club.

Commodore Frank Foster III delivered a delightful, informative, and entertaining detail of the founding of the Club and the first 20 years of our history (1906-1926).

Following the ceremony, everyone returned to Watkins Island for an enjoyable lunch, camaraderie, and a chance to peruse the historical display created by Commodore Frank Foster III and his daughter, Janice.

Right on schedule, at 3 p.m., the Centennial Kick-Off Sail Race began. Although it is very early in the season, there were three competing boats in the Cruising class and one one-design boat that came out for some cool, early season racing. At the time of the warning signal, it appeared as though the wind may die out and the race would need to be postponed. However, right with the preparatory signal, as though our forefather BLYC yachtsmen were present and helping, the wind freshened and a very competitive and exciting race followed

Don Harris with crew Dan Knaul and Stone Parker brought home the Cruising Class Trophy and John Van Gilder and his crew won the one-design fleet.

Throughout the afternoon, there was much fun and fellowship at the Club and games for the children.

"It was a great day and a great start to our Centennial," said Commodore Mark Russell.


