

We had three (3) PHRF cruisers and one (1) Flying Scot (sailed by John VanGilder). Since the Flying Scot was the only one-design in the fleet he sailed as a guest boat (with a PHRF rating). John finished first in both races (scratch time and handicap). Congratulations to all three. We also were glad to see Will Price breaking in the Cal 22, which is a new competitor in the PHRF fleet this year.

Sunday, May 28, was a beautiful day for everything BUT sailing. While we did not have enough boats for a "fleet," we did have enough to at least attempt to have a race. We did have a start at 2; however, we abandoned about ten (10) minutes later because the boats were making very little progress. There




