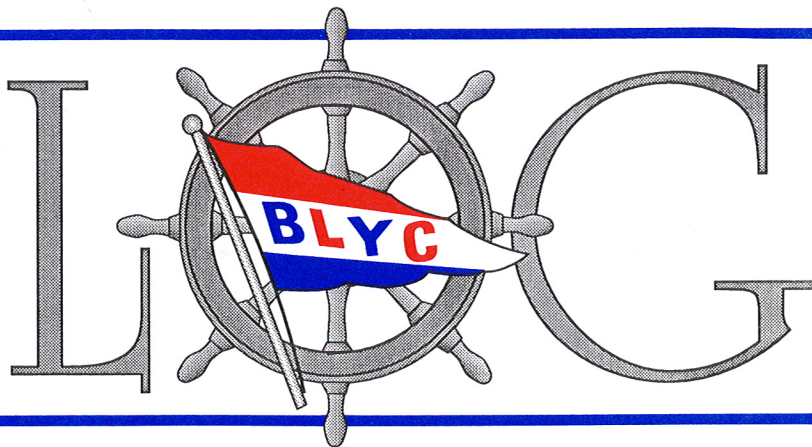

# Kitchen Activity Up, Come And Enjoy!

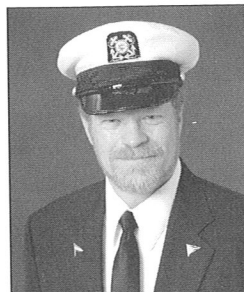
## Bar and Kitchen

# Clubhouse, Grounds In Good Shape

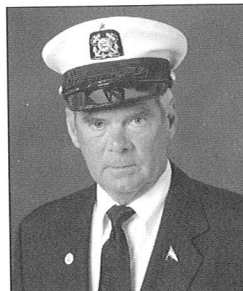
## House & Grounds

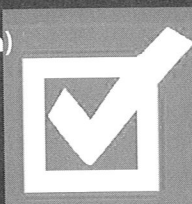

## Entertainment

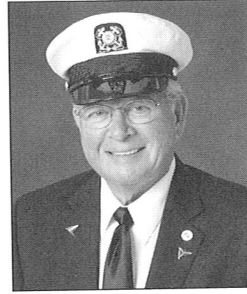
Summer is easing into the cooler days of September and things are beginning to slow down on the lake. However there are still lots of nice days to enjoy the Club!

# Four New Members In, One More On Deck

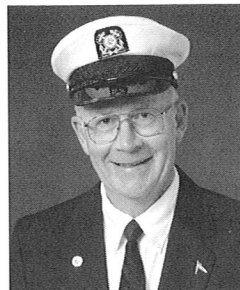
## Membership

## Race and Regatta

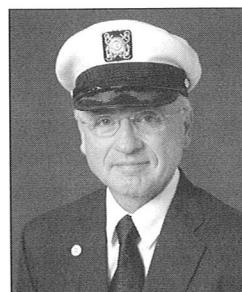
After last month's tabloid (and due to computer problems) this article will be as brief as possible.



As you read this, the Junior Sailing program is winding down. We have had a great season!

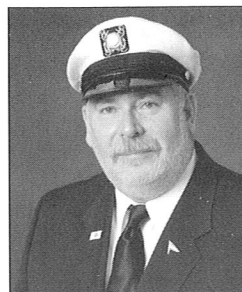

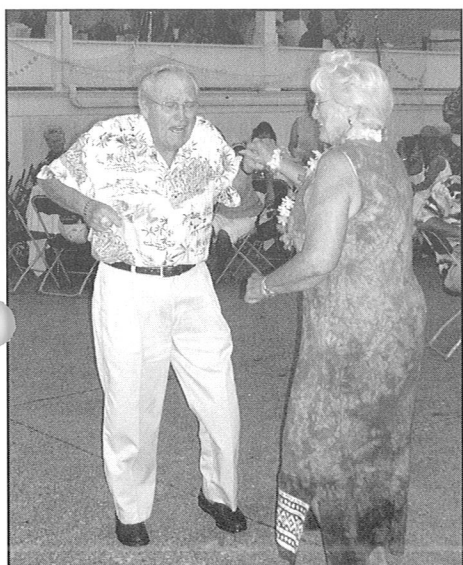
# *A Tropical Evening ☆ Of Fun!*

It was a perfect evening to be on the lake – and to welcome our newest members to BLYC.

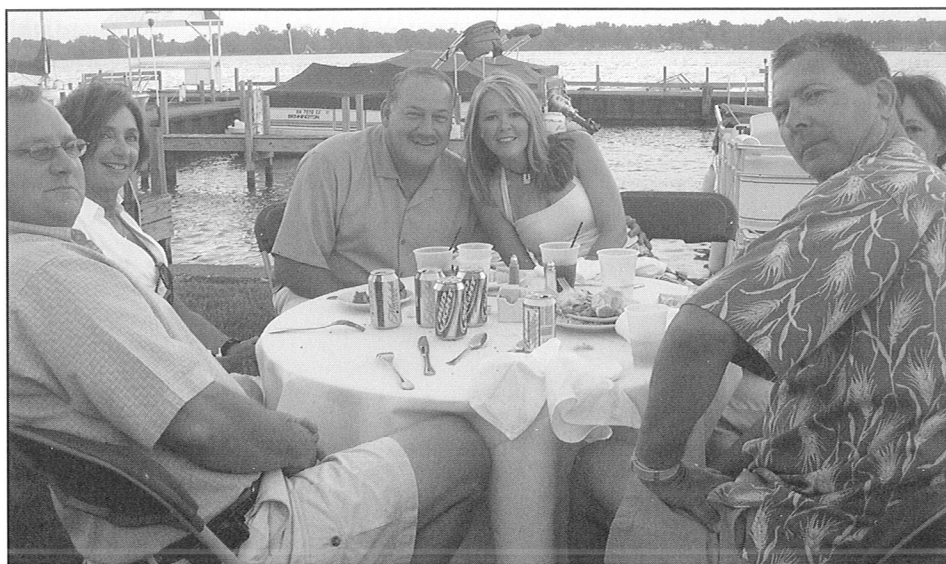

**A strong turnout of Members and guests filled both the porch and the front yard of the Club to enjoy a Hawaiian buffet and an evening of fun and fellowship.**



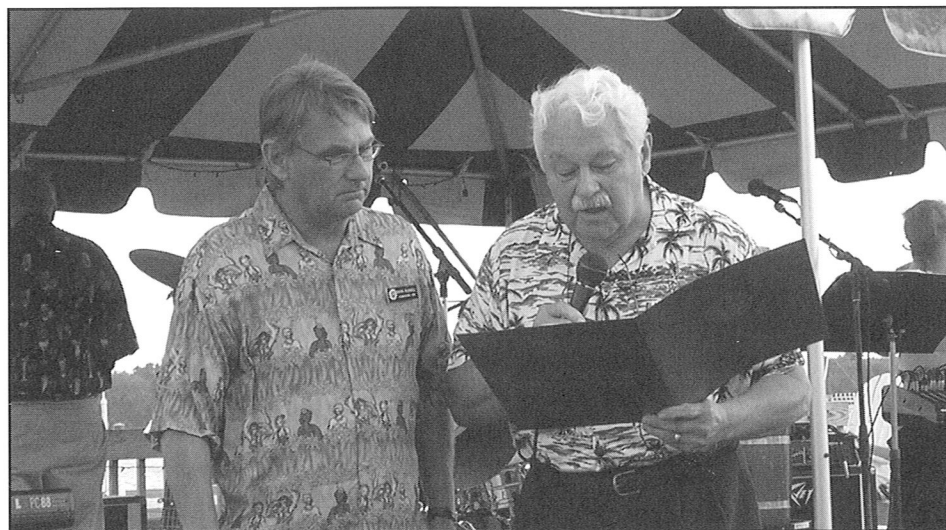

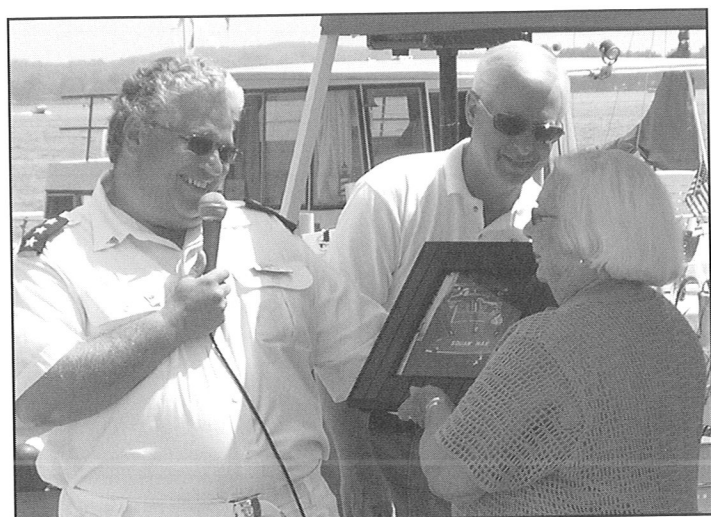
# A Boatload Of Activity At Annual Antique Regatta



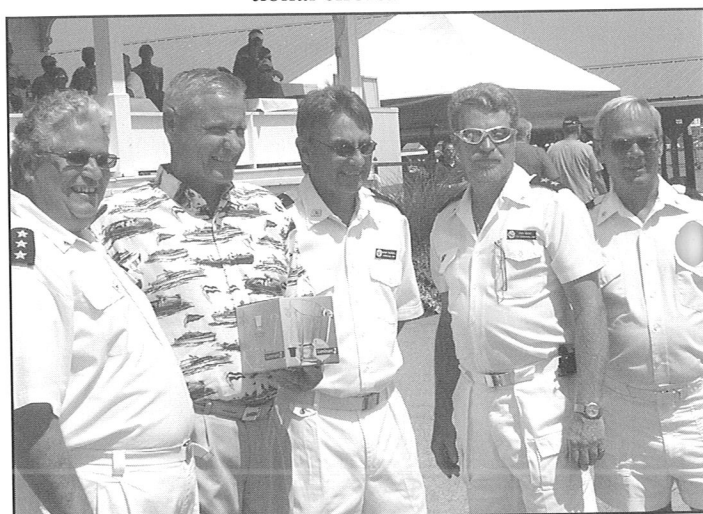

The 2006 edition of the Antique & Classic Boat Show was undoubtedly the most successful to date - a record 57 boats registered!

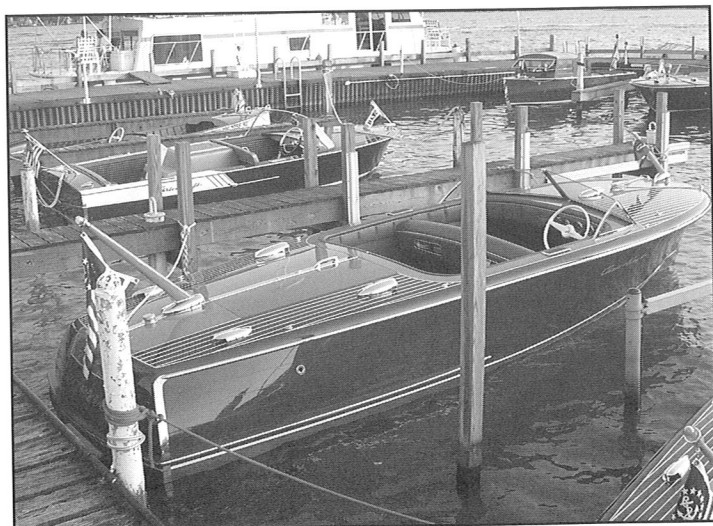

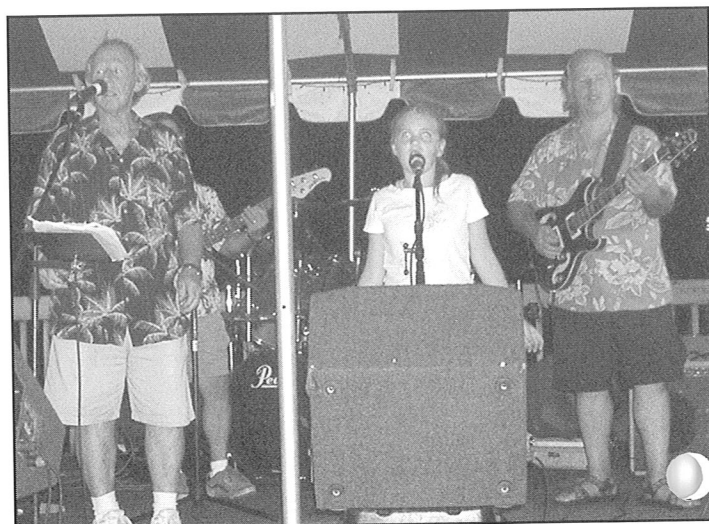
