

# House & Grounds Receive Upgrades


## House & Grounds

## Junior Sailing



Austin Miller won the Commodore Dwight R. Haggard Long Distance Race on Labor Day in a Thistle! He





Trophies and medals were awarded to both “scratch” and “PHRF” 1st, 2nd and 3rd place finishers.

With three (3) weeks remaining for the Lambrecht Cup qualifying we amended the Sailing Instructions to assist skippers attempting to qualify this season. The amendment is posted at the Club.

July 26 thru 29, I was part of a Race Committee from BLYC at the Interlake Nationals held at Hoover Sailing Club. Others on the committee were Steve Harris (PRO), Stone Parker and Tracy Davis. We had approximately 55 boats in 2 classes. We had wind “problems” at Hoover; also, and spent almost as much time setting (and resetting) marks as we did running the actual races. We did not run as many races as we had anticipated; however, we did get in 6 good races for their national event.

The highlight of the whole event was when the “RC” was told it was customary for the committee to participate in the karaoke and/or talent show.





An evening thunderstorm cut short the planned ice cream social, but Members moved inside and spent the evening tapping their toes to the tunes of Dr. Dan.


Overall, it was truly a beautiful summer afternoon that lived up to its billing – a Family Fun Day!






The morning Porch Picnic was available from 9 a.m.-1 p.m., the same time slot available for voting in the election.


The day wrapped up with a reception for Commodore Ray Kent and the new Board – a fun ending to another great Election Day at our Club!

I am currently home now with Krissy and the girls after a long recovery from my accident this past fall. As many of you know, last September I was involved in a car accident that left me paralyzed from the chest down. 
I hope to return to the Club soon to renew friendships put on hold by this event in my life. I look forward to spending time with you all very soon.


