

Bar and Kitchen

Thanks to all of you that supported my election to the Board. I will try to live up to your expectations. As Bar and Kitchen Governor, I have my work cut out for me this year.

The Annual meeting was lively and much discussion centered on the profit and loss situation in the Bar and Kitchen. That aspect of the operation will be my top priority this year.

The Bar and Kitchen helps underwrite the cost of several member events throughout the year. We charge \$180 for a keg of beer for private parties. However, for member events such as the Snowball, Golf Outing, and various other time-honored events we charge the members \$100 for the same keg. We do not want to make money on the backs of the event chairpersons, but we do not want to be in the position of driving up the cost of goods either. Our cost for a keg of beer averages \$65. If we sell it for \$100, our cost of goods is 65%. We have a goal of keeping our cost of goods at or near 41%. Once the Bar incurs a cost of goods of 65% it takes weeks to recover. So effective immediately the cost for kegs for a member-sponsored event will be \$120. I think this is fair to everyone. The event chairpersons will have to increase the cost of their entry fees by a few bucks and the Bar and Kitchen will no longer

have to incur unreasonable cost of goods figures.

Another recent change involves fixed hours of operation for the winter season. The new hours are posted on the doors to the Club. There is also a separate banner ad in this edition of the LOG.




We have a number of smart new members who are taking advantage of this great opportunity.




