A narrative of the origin and development of the Club through its first century: 1906-2006

Don't forget to place your order for the BLYC history, a two-year project of the centennial committee. The Illustrated History of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club is about ready to go to the press. The book is nearly two hundred pages in length and contains a narrative history of the Club from its beginnings in 1906 through the centennial year festivities in 2006. In addition to the narrative text, the book contains several pieces by BLYC historian, Commodore Frank Foster III. Over one hundred photographs, some of an historical nature from the files of Chance Brockway and a full rendition of color photographs from the many centennial events will enhance the pages and assure your reading enjoyment. This hardback, professionally produced publication will offer years of enjoyable reading and photograph gazing. Read about how Buckeye Lake before our Club was pretty much a shallow swamp unfit for boating, how George Watkins, after whom our BLYC island is named, assisted in finding the funds necessary to render the swamp into a navigable body of water, how the original and then the second more permanent clubhouses were constructed and financed, how the early members depended on the interurban cars for transportation to and from Newark and Columbus, how the KKK came to the Lake in the 1920s and how the Club survived through the depression laden 1930s. Read about the second half century of the Club's activities from the BLYC members jaunt to Peru for an international regatta to the advent of the successful junior sailing program and the I-LYA events. Our former commodores provided many recollections for the contemporary sections of our story. The narrative concludes with a substantive collection of Commodore Greg Miller's color photographs from the centennial year with many of you and your friends pictured enjoying the festive year. You will never regret purchasing a first edition, numbered copy of the history of your Club.

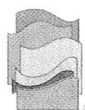

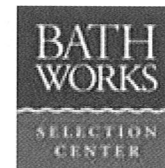
