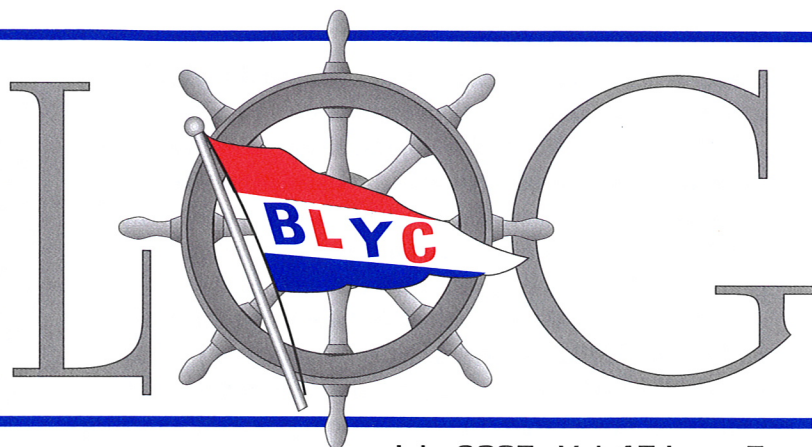

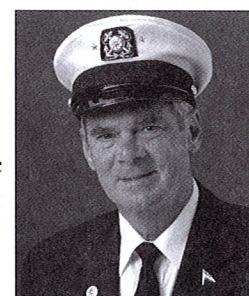
This is going to be a great summer at the Club. Easy living on the porch and fun at the pool. See YOU there.

## Race and Regatta

This sailing season has begun as badly as last year's. As of this writing we've had four days for competition; and, nothing to show for it.

Sunday, May 20th (our first meet for the Lambrecht Cup Club races), we had a total of three boats show up to race; however, we did not have three boats of one class. Since we had "set" a course we went ahead with a "start" and allowed the boats to sail anyway. The participants were Scott Evans (new member) and Walter Grubb. Chuck Bendig was practicing flying a spinnaker for the Memorial Day long distance race.

Sunday, May 27th, we thought we had a "great" day of sailing ahead of us; however, the weather people issued a storm warning and the sky really darkened in the west. At 1:30 we raised the "AP" flag and postponed the start. Around 2 p.m. (original start time) we had several bands of rain move down the lake. Several times we could not see the lake from the front porch. After the storm(s) there was absolutely no wind anywhere. At 2:45 p.m. we abandoned racing for the day.

Monday, May 28th (Memorial Day) Sally and I were at the Club at 8:00 a.m. to prepare for the Commodore Edward S. Metzger "long distance" race. Joe Miller came out to help us. After setting a pretty long course we started to be concerned; because (once again), there was a serious lack of wind. At 10:30 we raised the "AP" flag and postponed the start. At 1:00 p.m. we abandoned racing for the day. We did have four (4) cruisers (Chuck Bendig, Russ Green, Don Harris and Mark Russell) and two (2) Flying Scots (Walter Grubb and John VanGilder) waiting to race.

Sunday, June 3rd, Sally and I arrived at the Club at 11:00 a.m. to get ready for a great day of sailing. There was just a hint of a wind; so, after getting everything ready (except for setting a course) we went into a holding pattern. We were disappointed again. At 1:30 we raised the "AP" flag and postponed the races. At 2:00 we raised the "N" over "A" flags which indicates that "all races are abandoned" and that there will be "no more racing today". We did have two skippers present at the time of the "skipper's meeting" and a third was available if we had attempted to race; however, it is not fun to be in a sailboat in the sun with no wind. We are now looking forward to Sunday, June 10th, to get our first race(s) run and get on with the rest of the season.

Sunday, June 10th. When Sally and I arrived at the Club we were greeted by a steady wind of 5 mph plus. This wind held to just about "start time" (2:00 p.m.). We did have a PHRF fleet and we did start our first race of the season. At 2:25 we were five (5) minutes away from abandoning; however, a decent wind returned and we finished in 46 minutes. The first three boats across were a "photo finish." The finish order was Harris, Bendig and Green. After adjusting

for handicap the finish was Bendig, Harris and Green. The second race was quicker (approximately 30 minutes) and the results were: Bendig, Green and Harris. We had one Flying Scot participate manned by Jim Owen and Will Price. We had time for a third race; but, one of the cruisers had to drop out and our day was finished.

Bill Reynolds and Bob Snow have indicated that they will begin racing sometime in mid June. All I can say is we should have some good racing IF we manage to have some races. We still have twelve weekends of racing scheduled and two long distance races remaining. In addition to that we have the Snowball Regatta October 6th and 7th.

Just a reminder to all skippers. The July 4th Commodore Earl Williams Long Distance Race will begin at 1:00 p.m.. Club ceremonies begin at 11:15 a.m.. This is a PHRF event and ALL boats will be competing for first, second and third place trophies and medals. It will be a "long distance" race (once again, IF we have wind).

The Buckeye Lake Yacht Club Centennial Committee has just received a limited number of copies of *"An Illustrated History of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club, A Narrative of the Origin and Development of the Club Through Its First Century: 1906-2006."* Your reserved copy is waiting for you. The book is nearly 150 pages in length and contains a narrative history of the Club from its beginnings in 1906 through the Centennial Year festivities in 2006, edited and written by member Tony Lisska. In addition to the narrative text, the book contains several pieces by BLYC historian, Commodore Frank Foster III. Before our Club existed, read about how Buckeye Lake was a shallow swamp unfit for boating, and how George Watkins (after whom our BLYC island is named) assisted in finding the necessary funds to transform the swamp into a navigable body of water, how the original and the second more permanent clubhouses were constructed and financed, how the early members depended on the interurban cars for transportation to and from Newark and Columbus. How the KKK came to the Lake in the 1920's, and how the Club survived the depression-laden 1930's. Our former Commodores provided many recollections for the contemporary sections of our story.

The narrative concludes with a substantive collection of Greg Miller's color photographs from the Centennial year, with many of you and your friends pictured enjoying the many festivities. Over 100 photographs, some of an historical nature from the files of Chance Brockway and a full rendition of color photographs of the many centennial events, enhance the pages and assure your reading enjoyment. You will never regret purchasing a first edition, numbered copy of the history of your Club.


## Entertainment
