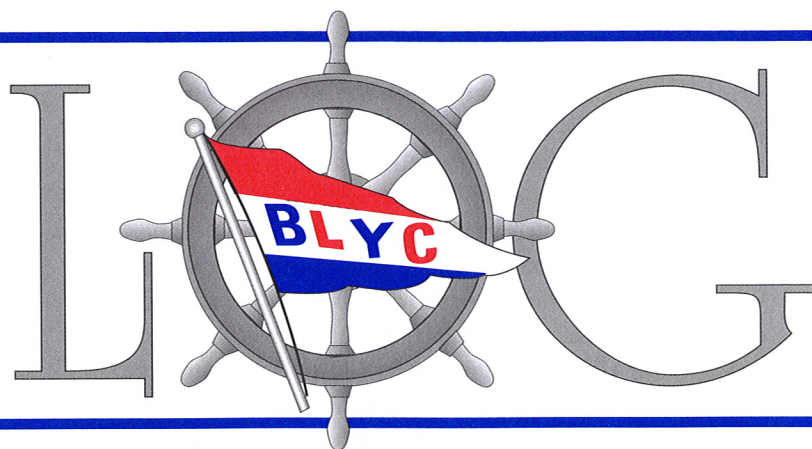

Picking up where I left off last month... June 17th, we ran two Lam-brecht Cup races. Race #1 results were: 1st – Chuck Bendig, 2nd – Don Harris and 3rd – Russ Green. Finishing times ran from 38 minutes to 54 minutes and the wind measured from 3.5 to 7+ mph during the event.

June 24th, the weather took a step backwards. We did have a little wind (5+ mph) and managed to run one race. The results were: 1st – Don Harris, 2nd – Chuck Bendig and 3rd – Russ Green.

July 1st, we had very good sailing conditions and completed three races. Race #1 results were: 1st – Bill Reynolds, 2nd – Russ Green and 3rd – Mark Russell.

John VanGilder competed in all three races in his Flying Scot and finished very well; unfortunately, since there was no “fleet” of Scots his finishes do not count in the overall standings. Thanks to Sally for her help, again. A special “Thanks!” to our son, Andrew, who flew in from San Diego to spend a week with us. I hope you got a chance to meet him.

July 3rd, we were at the lake to watch the fire works. Marie Doneff invited me, Sally, our daughter Megan (and three granddaughters) and our son Andrew to join her (and Howard) and her son Tom and wife Katie (from Stewart, FL) to join in with some neighbors for the evening. We had a great time.

July 4th, the Commodore Earl Williams – Long Distance Race. The best day we’ve had for sailing this year. At 12:20 we measured winds at 10-12 mph. At 1:10 (just after the start) we measured 12-13 mph. Our highest reading was at 1:55 with 15-17 mph. We had eight boats participate (1 Thistle, 2 Flying Scots and 5 Cruisers) and six finished. Two cruisers dropped out with equipment problems. 1st place went to Walter Grubb, 2nd place to John VanGilder and 3rd place to Bill Reynolds. The “Bringing Up The Rear” award went to Russ Green (by default with the two DNF’s). The

Thistle skippered by Fritz Schilling was the “scratch” winner; however, this was a PHRF event and after adjusting his time he finished 4th. We had a real battle between Don Harris and Bill Reynolds at the finish with Don winning by one (1) second. Ask either one about the finish. Thanks to Joe Miller for his assistance setting the marks.

After the awards ceremony I decided to go pick up the marks and our son Andrew went with me. Storms were forecasted and the horizon was threatening; but, I wanted to get them so we could enjoy the rest of the day. We got the windward mark with no problem and headed for the leeward mark. Just as we entered the “no wake” area of Cranberry it started to sprinkle and looking west I knew we were in trouble. The pontoon only has a twenty horse Honda on it and it was “wide” open (after the no wake area). We got the mark and pulled out the boat cover for protection. Thunder and lightning was getting closer so I headed for the north bank. I had already decided to dock almost anywhere when I realized that I was not far from Dave and Fran George’s. As fortune would have it, they were home and offered us shelter (and a brew) while the storm passed. After the thunder and lightning ended we continued toward the Club and finished picking up the markers at the “start/finish” line. Needless to say, we were both totally soaked. Thank you, Dave and Fran, for your hospitality.

July 8th, was another great day for sailing. The wind was between 8 and 10 mph most of the day and we had six PHRF cruisers and two one design boats. First race results were: 1st – Russ Green, 2nd – Bill Reynolds and 3rd – Don Harris.

The 3rd race was started; but, when the boats arrived at the windward mark location there were no marks and the race had to be abandoned. The marks (2) were apparently “borrowed” by someone. If you happen to see a yellow tetrahedron (triangle) and/or a white sphere (ball) with or without about 15’ of anchor line would you please pick it up and return it to the Club. Both have BLYC markings on them. Thanks to John Watson for helping me reset a course for the 4th race.

Fourth race results were: 1st – Bill Reynolds, 2nd – Chuck Bendig and 3rd – Don Harris.

The Buckeye Lake Yacht Club Centennial Committee has just received a limited number of copies of *"An Illustrated History of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club, A Narrative of the Origin and Development of the Club Through Its First Century: 1906-2006."* Your reserved copy is waiting for you. For those who have not reserved a copy, just send your name, address and money to the address below.

The book is nearly 150 pages in length and contains a narrative history of the Club from its beginnings in 1906 through the Centennial Year festivities in 2006, edited and written by member Tony Lisska. In addition to the narrative text, the book contains several pieces by BLYC historian, Commodore Frank Foster III. Before our Club existed, read about how Buckeye Lake was a shallow swamp unfit for boating, and how George Watkins (after whom our BLYC island is named) assisted in finding the necessary funds to transform the swamp into a navigable body of water, how the original and the second more permanent clubhouses were constructed and financed, how the early members depended on the interurban cars for transportation to and from Newark and Columbus. How the KKK came to the Lake in the 1920's, and how the Club survived the depression-laden 1930's. Our former Commodores provided many recollections for the contemporary sections of our story.

The narrative concludes with a substantive collection of Greg Miller's color photographs from the Centennial year, with many of you and your friends pictured enjoying the many festivities. Over 100 photographs, some of an historical nature from the files of Chance Brockway and a full rendition of color photographs of the many centennial events, enhance the pages and assure your reading enjoyment. You will never regret purchasing a first edition, numbered copy of the history of your Club.

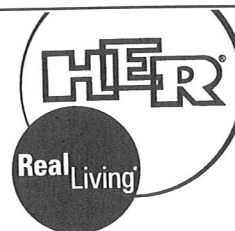
