


Sunday, Aug. 26th, no wind, again! We postponed at 1:30 p.m. and abandoned at 2:50 p.m. Thanks to Tom Green, Russ Green, Don Harris, Stone Parker and Sally for helping.

Sunday, Sept. 2nd, no wind, again! We postponed at 1:30 p.m. and abandoned at 2:30 p.m. Thanks Tom Green, Stone Parker and Sally.

Monday, Sept. 3rd, we regretfully sailed the Labor Day Long Distance "marathon." We once again had questionable wind; however, we had five skippers who wanted to sail and I had three trophies and medals I wanted to award. After a two hour delay we started the race at 1:01 p.m. with winds measuring 4 to 5 mph and not constant. To make a LONG story short it took the first place boat (Bob Snow) 2 hours and 48 seconds to finish. The second place boat (Don Harris) took 2 hours, 32 minutes and 40 seconds to finish. The third place boat (Bill Reynolds) took 2 hours, 56 minutes and 28 seconds to finish. Two boats (Stone Parker and Scott Evans) dropped out. Thank you Stone and Scott! Thanks to Russ Green, Tom Green, Don Harris and Sally for helping.

Sunday, Sept. 9th, was another day to forget. Sally and I arrived at the Club at 11:00 and walked in rain to the island. The forecast was not good; however, a few hardy skippers showed up. We postponed at 1:35 p.m. and abandoned at 2:10 p.m.

Thus ends the Lambrecht Cup competition for the 2007 BLYC sailing season. We managed to sail a total of twenty

races in all, with Russ Green competing in all twenty. You had to sail a minimum of fifteen races to qualify with your best ten finishes contributing to your final score. First place went to Chuck Bendig. Chuck started 16 races (finished 15) and his final score was 13. Second place went to Russ Green. Russ started (and finished) all 20 races and his final score was 17. Third place went to Don Harris. Don started 15 races (finished 14) and his final score was 23. The last skipper to qualify was Mark Russell. Two previous winners (Bill Reynolds and Bob Snow) failed to sail the required number of races to qualify. Awards will be presented Oct. 7th at the conclusion of the Snowball Regatta.

We had a total of sixteen Sundays set aside for the Lambrecht Cup competition. The first three Sundays were cancelled; but, the balance of June and July were very good to us with eight straight Sundays of racing. August and September we only sailed one of five scheduled Sundays.

Please, plan on attending the Snowball Regatta on Oct. 6th and 7th. This year will be our sixty-first event and we usually draw boats from all over central Ohio and neighboring states. This is not a "sailors only" event – none of our events are. So, I urge you to come out and enjoy some good sailing and make a lot of new friends.

Well, now that I've brought you up to date (sailing wise) I'll sign off AGAIN. I wish nothing but success to the new Commodore, Vice-Commodore, Rear-Commodore and all six Governors. I know how hard we all worked in 2006 and 2007. I know the new board will continue to work for the success of the Club and I urge ALL of you to consider running for office. THE BUCKEYE LAKE YACHT CLUB CONSTITUTION BY-LAWS AND RULES

ARTICLE VII. THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Section 8. Now reads:

EACH GOVERNOR SHALL SERVE WITHOUT SALARY or other remuneration, except that the Secretary may be remunerated as deemed advisable by the Governors.

Proposed change:

EACH GOVERNOR SHALL SERVE WITHOUT SALARY; however, all Governors shall be permitted to attend all Club functions "free of charge" (this will not apply to a spouse or significant other). The governor must be in uniform to receive this privilege (no exceptions

will be made). This will cover the cost of food (and entertainment if applicable) only. Beverages (non-)lcoholic or alcoholic) will not be included.

The Secretary may be remunerated as deemed advisable by the Governors.
