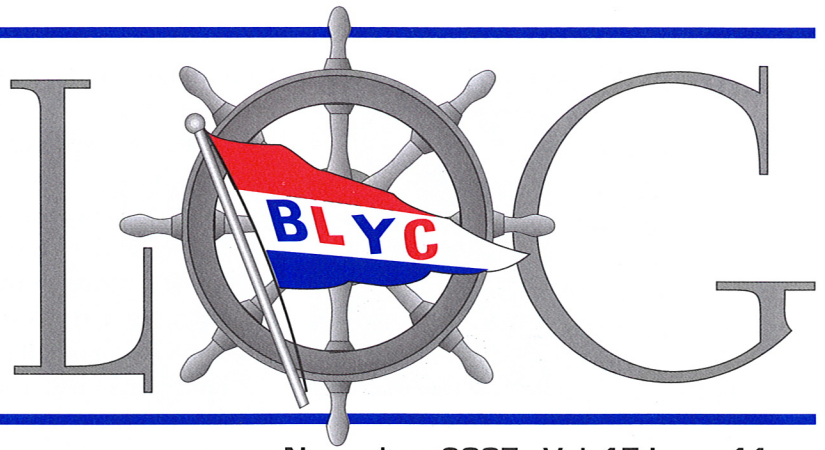

I wish to thank all of you who came out to support the candidates on election morning. None of us do this just for an extra title to add to our obituary, but from a genuine love for the Club.

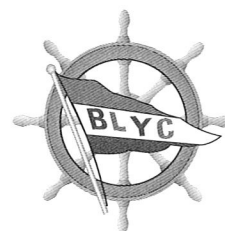
