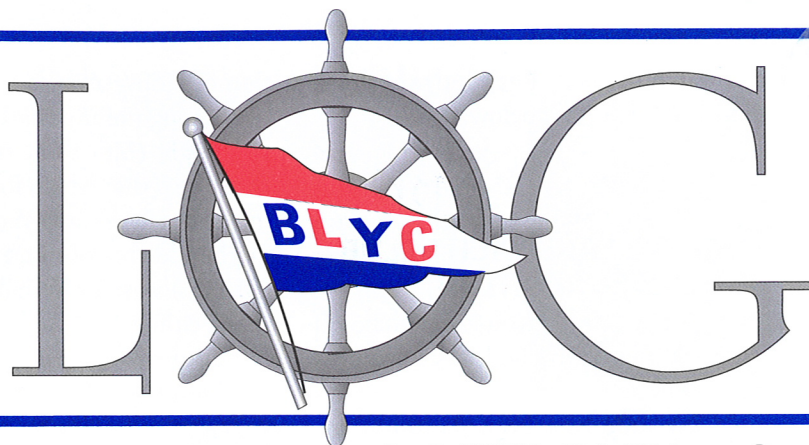
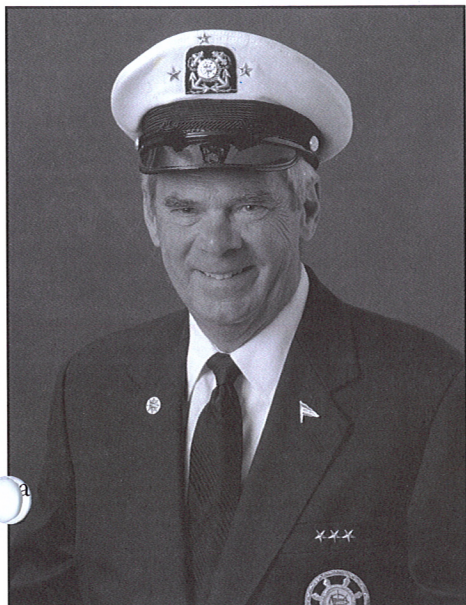

There have been too many funerals in the BLYC family in the last weeks. Past Commodore Tim Maitte, long time member Dick Miller, and a former employee, Travis Trent all passed. Please keep all of them in your prayers.

Since my last article, we experienced two major mechanical breakdowns with our equipment. The ice machine quit working. It was so old that repair parts were not available. Less than a week later one of our furnaces also quit. The furnace was 13 years old. The heat exchanger sent fumes through the heat ducts and back into the building.

The biggest news this month is the membership drive that is in full swing. I asked Rear Commodore Harris and Trustee John Geiger to appoint a Financial Committee of members with expertise in management and finance to look at our cash flow situation and make suggestions as to what we could do to

set a course for the future. Bob Baldwin, Bill Wilson, Gerry Besanceney, and Keith Dotson were the other members of the committee. The instructions they received from me were to look at all options. Nothing was off the table. The Board knew that we could install a monthly minimum, sell one of the parcels of land that we own, or have an assessment of the existing members.

The committee suggested to us that the least costly option to improve our cash flow and increase our volume of business was to increase membership. Each year for last several years, the BLYC lost about 5% of the total membership every year. In order to stay even we had to recruit 20 new members. The Board decided that we wanted to attract at least 100 new members. In order to accomplish our goal we reduced the initiation fee to just \$500 and we are rewarding the primary sponsor of each new member by reducing next year's dues by \$200. If an existing member recruits five new members, the existing member will not pay any dues at all next year. The membership drive will end on May 31st. Any applications received after midnight May 31 will not be eligible for the initiation discount.

The Board of Governors and the Trustees discussed this decision fully. We agreed that our existing members would not support monthly minimums or a one-time cash assessment. The Club is not in serious financial trouble, but our downward spiral of both membership and member participation has to be corrected if we are going to continue to offer all the amenities that BLYC offers. Member dues are the engine that

drives the operation of our Club. New members will pay dues for years into the future and generally, they tend to use the Club on a more frequent basis than the existing membership.

Our vetting process for prospective members will remain the same. An existing member must sponsor each applicant and the Board will review the application over a 30-day period. During those 30 days, the application and a photograph of the applicants will be posted so that members can offer comments to the Board. BLYC is not lowering our standards for membership. We are lowering the initiation fee for a short time in order to attract as many good new members as possible.

I would like to offer my personal thanks to the Financial Committee for their time and effort. They took an unbiased look at the last several years of operation and made a professional and informed recommendation to the Board of Governors.

Just a note to let you know that BLYC sailing is alive and well in southwest Florida.

Sally and I have been vacationing in the Bonita Springs, Estero, Fort Myers Beach area with a side trip to Miami and Ft. Lauderdale.

We've spent most of our time with Brinda Gore; however, we've also spent time with Russ and Pam Green and Joe and Ro Miller.

We've visited Pelican Isle YC and Marco Island YC. Both are beautiful clubs and were very accommodating.

The reason I'm writing is to inform you that I and Stone Parker crewed for Russ Green on his 25' O'Day (Day-dream) in a couple of regattas down here. Russ is a member of the Caloosahatchee Marching and Chowder Society (a sailing club).

On Jan. 26th we participated in the Chili Cook-off Races. We sailed in the "true cruising" class. We competed against a 36' Catalina, a 42' Catalina, a 40' Freedom Cat and a 32'

Jeaneau. The first race (2.25 miles) we finished 3rd (scratch and handicap). The second race (4.0 miles) we finished 2nd (scratch and handicap). Overall we finished 2nd in our class. Not too bad for 3 Ohio sailors. We finished the day attending the chile cook-off where we tasted at least 12 different kinds of chile (including "road kill" and "JackDaniels").

On Feb. 9th we sailed in the Edison Gulf Regatta. We again were in "true cruising" and competed against most of the same boats (take out the 42" Freedom Cat and put in a 44' Brewer). The first race (2.92 miles) we finished 2nd scratch and handicap. The second race (2.48 miles) we finished 2nd scratch and handicap, again. Overall we finished 2nd in our class.

Russ now has two very nicely engraved beer mugs to add to his collec-

tion of sailing awards.

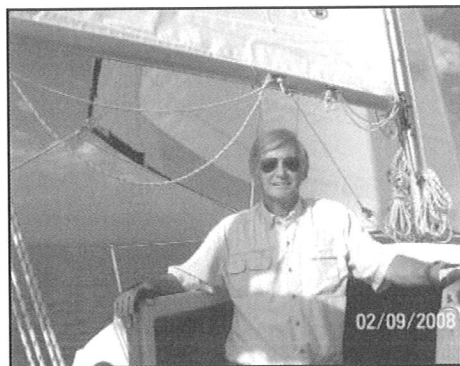

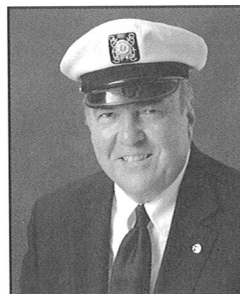

With this issue of the Log, we will be returning to our monthly printing procedure. If you are reading the Log for the first time, you must be a new member.

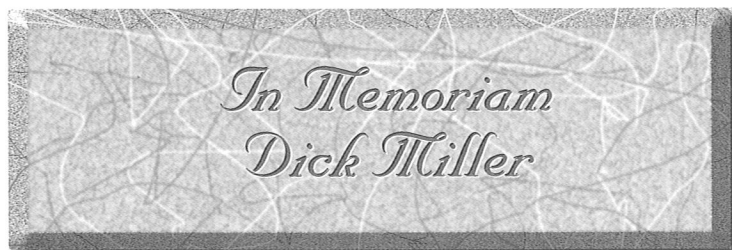
Welcome. We hope you enjoy the club as much as we do. Please do not hesitate to introduce yourself to members and get active.



A better title might be "The way we were — going to be." This is a prediction made in 1912 about how Buckeye Lake would grow and change and what it would become. This was written only six years after the founding of BLYC and the same year construction was begun on our existing Club house.

In 1912 the book *The Story of Buckeye Lake* was published. The author was Joseph Simpson. The copyright has expired and I am certain that the author would be pleased to know that we still care about his writing efforts. Thanks to Governor Bob Zeiher, the owner of one of the few remaining copies, I was able to scan it and upload it to Comm. Steve Harris' fantastic BLYC web site [<http://www.buckeyelakeyc.com/>] to eventually make it available to everyone. The book is 104 pages and full of really old stories. Here is an excerpt which concludes the book. Judge for yourself about the author's foresight.

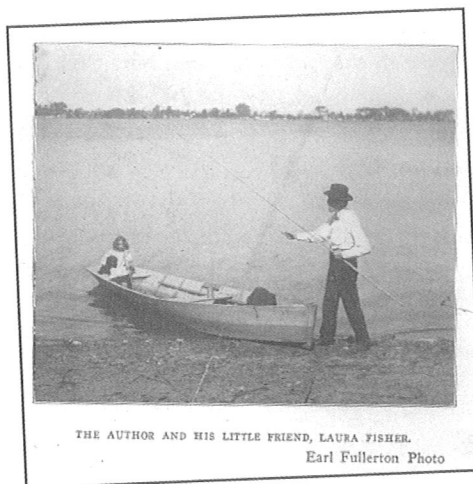
"A Grand Spot

Some day Buckeye Lake will be a grand spot compared with what it is now. It may be fifty years hence or longer when expensive buildings and fine grounds will beautify its shores. With ponderous machines, shallow places now harboring useless herbage will be deepened and broadened, when wide canals and islands will appear forming unique building spots to be adorned with beautiful residences, and gardens and trees, including the tall spear pointed poplars in the distance.

The reader may smile at our picture and call it 'a fancy,' but some day it will come true, too true alas, when you and I and hundreds of others will be dead and gone. The people of Central Ohio need such a spot."

Today, ninety six years later, we can all now see the "expensive buildings and fine grounds." The islands have been and are becoming more and more "unique building spots" "adorned with beautiful residences." The lake could use a little more "deepening" but com-

pared to what it was then, we have had a lot, especially if deepening includes raising the water level. As for ponderous machines, perhaps you have an idea what the author had in mind. But if he meant the big power boats that replaced the little steam driven craft, we have that too. It's been nearly a century since these predictions. What would you predict for the remainder of this century?
