


Hope to see you all at the Club very soon.







US Sailor of the week



George Fisher

"Us Sailor" has awarded George Fisher as their US Sailor of the week for March 19-25, 2008. If George Fisher is one thing, he is consistent. So consistent that he has competed in more than 50 of the last 60 Lightning St. Pete Midwinter Championships, even spending his honeymoon there with his wife, Marty, in 1953.

Aside from that, there isn't enough space here to include all the other things George is to his family and friends, but we'll give it a try. George is "modest, a gentleman yet a fierce competitor. It is a coveted spot to be on his boat," according to an old friend. George is "a great mentor, and has been a mentor for many sailors in a lot of classes," says his son Greg.

His efforts have not gone unnoticed. In 2001 he received US SAILING's W. Van Alan Clark, Jr. Sportsmanship Award and currently serves as that committee's chair. He is also current chair of the One Design Class Council. It all started in the late 1940's in Ohio where George started sailing and eventually bought his first Lightning, #721. He has owned 9 Lightnings since then and now races #15181, a boat that sailed him to victory at the 2007 Masters North Americans and the Masters Midwinters. He is also a past Masters NA champion in the Snipe and Flying Scot classes. He was runner up in the MC Scow Masters NA's and has won the Interlake Class National Championship 13 times.

Health issues have kept George off the starting line lately, but even at his last regatta he was sailing at the top

of his game. He was as proud of his 5th place finish at the 2007 Lightning Frigid Digit regatta in Annapolis last October as he was of his crew: his oldest son Greg, an accomplished sailor in his own right, and Greg's wife, JoAnn. Sailing has always been a family affair for George, who followed his children through junior sailing and beyond, never pushing but always encouraging. Now he is bringing up a new generation, supporting his grandkids and other junior sailors at the yacht club where he started, Buckeye Lake Yacht Club in Ohio.

As boaters, we need to participate fully in the request initiated by Boat US below. This action is requested so that our elected officials hear from us in large volume, so that our wish to remove recreational boating from the criteria currently being proposed. These ecological actions are needed, but for commercial vessels, and most importantly for ocean-crossing commercial vessels.

Now, the release from Boat US: March 19, 2008

We need your help now to pass NEW federal legislation in the Senate that would provide a permanent exemption for recreational boats from the upcoming EPA discharge permit requirement. Remember that if we don't get legislation passed, we all need to get EPA permits to operate our boats effective 9/30/08.

We appreciate the time that many of you have already taken to let your Senators or Representatives know your support of S. 2067 or HR 2550, "The Recreational Boating Act of 2007." Now there is a new Senate Bill #2766, "The Clean Boating Act of 2008," which is more politically viable, and our best chance to eliminate the permit requirement before it comes in effect on September 30, 2008.


Please pick up the phone or email today and ask your Senators to sponsor and vote YES for S 2766. Although Congress is on recess this week and next, we need their staff to hear from us so that this bill can move as soon as the Senators are back in Washington. 
