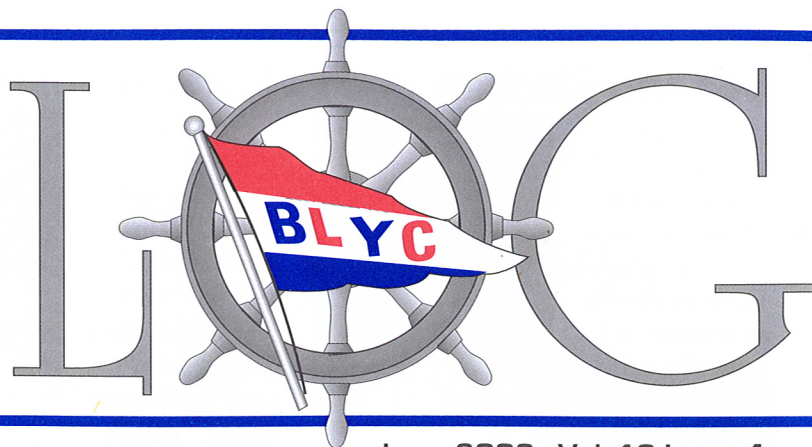

The long time members take many of our traditions for granted and sometimes forget that new members don't have any idea what we are talking about when we use terms like "Eastport", "Area 8", and the "Snowball Regatta".

I asked each of the Governors to explain these items in future articles. I would like to encourage the new members to ask any Governor for information, the Board will be more than happy to take the time to explain our rules and by-laws to you.

Speaking of the Board, how does one become a member of the Board and what are the qualifications for running for a position on the Board? The Club

has elections each September and a number of Governors' positions will be available. To run for office you must be a member. When you joined, most of you included your husband or wife on the application. The first name on the application becomes the member and the significant other has full use of the Club and all of the privileges of a member but only the member can vote, rent a dock, or run for office.

There are 10 members of the Board including a secretary-treasurer and nine elected Governors. You can recognize the Board members by their uniforms. Each Governor wears one gold stripe on their uniform. The top three members of the Board are elected by the Board itself. The top three positions are referred to as the "Flag Officers." The Flag Officers wear one, two, or three gold stars on their uniforms. The rear commodore has one star, the vice-commodore wears two stars, and the commodore wears three stars. Each governor serves a two-year term. The commodore serves for one year.

It is a tradition and a show of respect to refer to the current commodore and all past commodores by the term "Commodore." Once a commodore, always a commodore. That is why you will often hear several members referred to as "Commodore" when they are on the island.

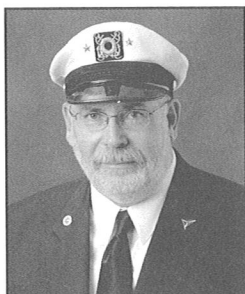

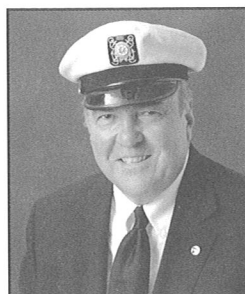

Publications

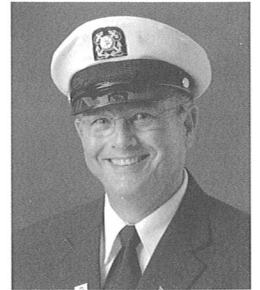
Welcome to our new members.

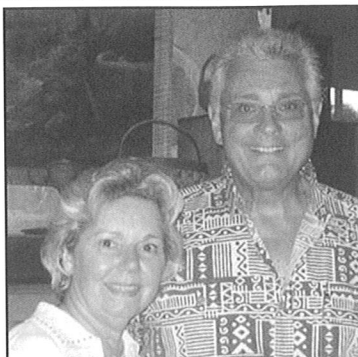

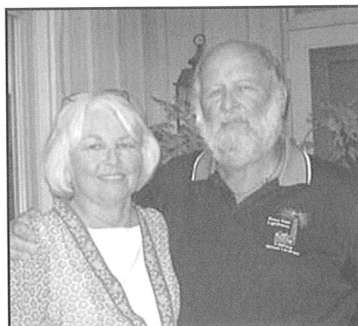

Don't forget the Commodores Steak Fry on July 12th. These guys will surprise you at how well they can cook your steak.

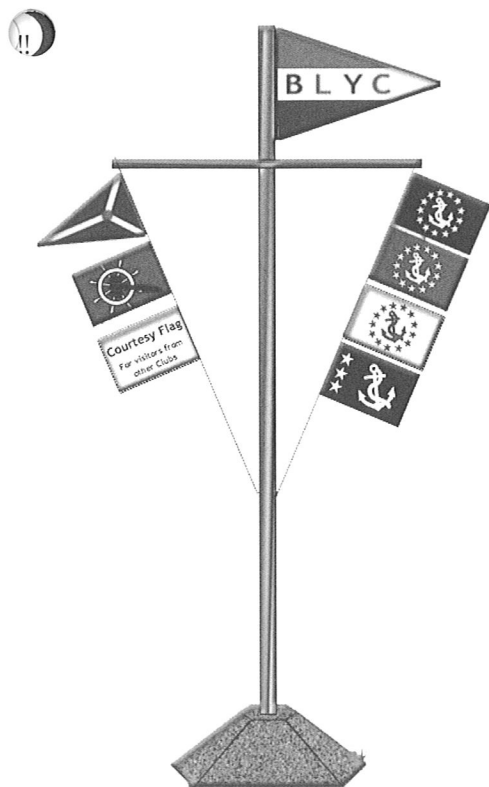

The Yardarm



At the TOP

At the top of the mast, above the yardarm is the burgee of our Club, BLYC. Every Yacht Club has their own burgee used to designate club membership on board and ashore. The history of our burgee is detailed in the history archives of our website at www.buckeyelakeyc.com

STARBOARD SIDE

Officer's Flags are flown in recognition of the Club's Officers. Official etiquette dictates that these flags are to be raised when these officers are on the island and lowered in their absence. Usually at BLYC, we fly these flags in their honor all of the time.

In order from top to bottom: Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Past Commodore

PORT SIDE

At the top of the port side arm is the burgee of the Inter-Lake Yachting Association (I-LYA). I-LYA is an organization of about 150 yacht, boat-

ing, and sailing clubs throughout the Lake Erie region. Each year, I-LYA hosts three major regattas for members at Put-in-Bay. All BLYC members are also members of I-LYA. More information on the I-LYA can be found on their website at www.i-lya.org. BLYC has been a member since 1907 – the first inland Club admitted. The history archives on the club website include an article on this historic admission.

Below the I-LYA Burgee is the burgee of the International Order of the Blue Gavel. "Blue Gavel" is an association of Past Commodores of Yacht Clubs and has thousands of members worldwide. More information about Blue Gavel can be found on their website at www.iobg.org. Currently, the BLYC chapter is re-organizing.

The third spot on the port side of the yardarm is reserved as a "courtesy" location. This is reserved to fly the burgee of visitors from other Clubs.

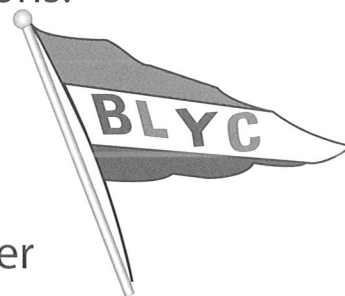

BLYC is now a Wi-Fi Hotspot!

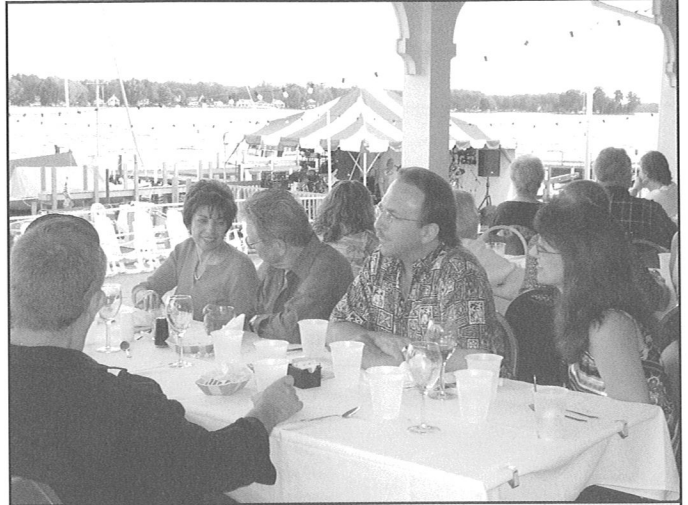
