

### **BLYC ELECTIONS**

The Board of Governors is the governing body for the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. The Board consists of the Commodore, Vice-Commodore, Rear-Commodore, Sceretary/Treasurer, and six Governors. The Commodore has primary responsibility for the Club and monitors all activities, events, and chairs the Board of Governors meetings.

The six Governors are elected by the Club membership each September. Depending on vacancies, three to four Governors are elected in alternating years. The name of the member provided on the Club membership application is the individual authorized to vote in Club elections. The members have the opportunity to vote for up to four candidates on Election Day. The candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall join the Board of Governors for a two year term.

There are events planned each year to provide the membership the opportunity to be involved in the election process. On Friday, September 5th, th candidates will gather at the club for "Poster Night". Candidates will have campaign posters that will be displayed in various areas of the club supporting their candidacy. That same night, candidates will bring a sufficient number of letters to be mailed to each member's residence. The letter will provide information as to why that candidate should be considered for the Board of Governors. All candidates will place a copy of their letter in one envelope and mail to the membership. That way the member only receives one envelope with all candidates' data.

On Thursday, September 11th, all candidates are invited to attend the Board of Governors business meeting. This provides the opportunity to ask questions and gain insight as to how meetings are conducted.

All candidates will attend "Candidates Night" on Friday, September 12th. Following dinner, each candidat will have a few minutes for the opportunity to provide their concerns and ideas for the electors' consideration.

"Election Day", begins with a breakfast on the porch with each candidate providing food items for the memrship. The voting poll will be open during this time for authorized members to vote for their favorite candidate.

Immediately following the election results, the new Board will meet in order to elect the positions of Vice-Commodore and Rear-Commodore for the coming year. The previous Vice-Commodore is elevated to the position of Commodore. Once these positions have been elected, the Board members will have a short meeting to determine the duties of each member. The Vice-Commodore, Rear-Commodore, and the six Governors are assigned specific responsibilities for the coming year. Those responsibilities include:

Such infusions have sustained that continuity without which the Club never could have attained its present state of development.

as a group of human beings. Important as these are to the life of the Club, they constitute only the club.







Fritz Schilling, Evan Miller and Halle Harklau 5th Place - Championship Fleet




