

It's cooling down outside but things are heating up at the Club. We start off with our popular Halloween Party on Saturday, November 1. Prizes will be awarded for the







Many of our friends are heading south for the winter so the rest of us will just have to party twice as hard this winter. I know John has lots of neat parties planned.


Sad note, we have had boats at Eastport broken into and damaged twice. Although I think the perpetrators are coming by water, I have found the far east gate open several times.






