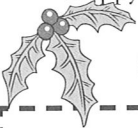
article, we are looking to purchase another Flying Junior and hopefully another Laser by next spring as well.

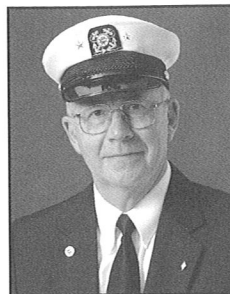
## Bar and Kitchen

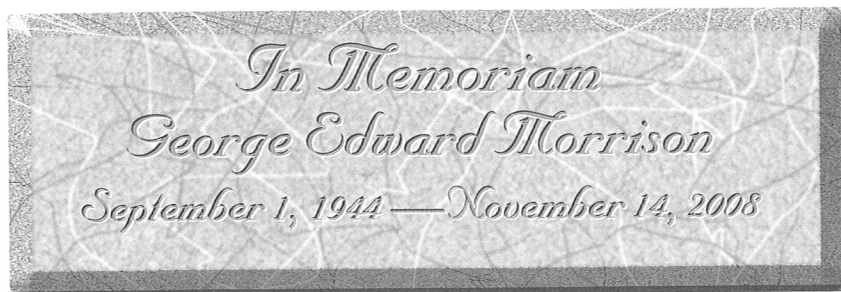
