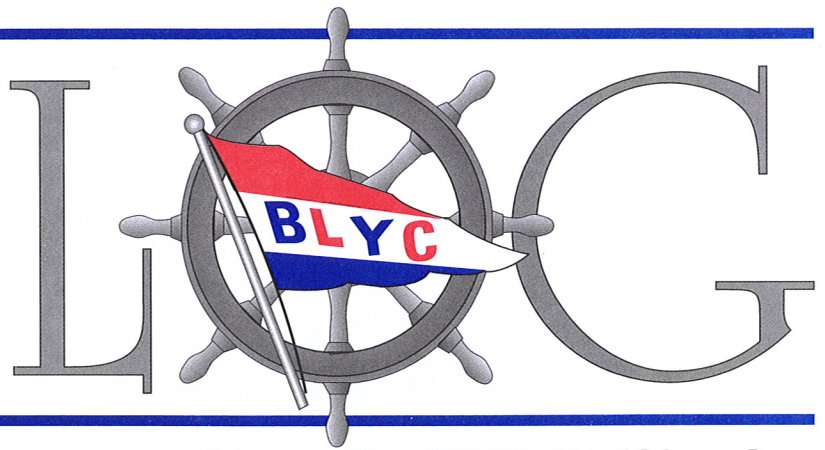

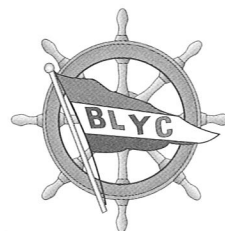
Meet a Member

Meet a Member



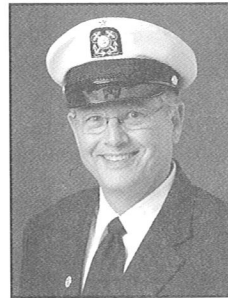
Bob Wolfinger

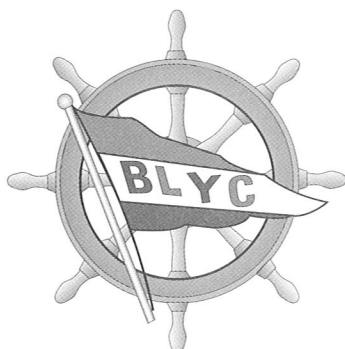
