### MARINE THEFT PREVENTION

Three factors that will discourage thieves and vandals are; TIME, NOISE, and VISIBILITY.

Get to know your boating neighbors. Report suspicious activity.

SECURE your vessel when leaving it unattended. Remove keys and valuables.

When away from your vessel, close doors, draw curtains and snap down canvas covers. (Remember - out of sight, out of mind.)

Store valuable items at home. Examples: fishing gear, depth finders, radios, tools.

Put identifiable marks on equipment and keep records of make, model, and serial numbers.

Upgrade locks and hasps on doors, windows, and hatches. Install an alarm system and, or pressure mats.

Use locks on props, gas tanks, outboard motors, and trailers.

Visit your vessel, regularly.

Turn off the electric to boat hoist when not in use.

Keep gates on docks LOCKED. (Most unauthorized access is from land, not water.)




