




From the Desk of the Club Manager

Before I left Raleigh, North Carolina to come up here, three out of ten restaurants were closing their doors. Some had been in business for a very long time. The tables were set up with table cloths, china and wine glasses (for prospective buyers), but nobody was there. It was eerie. Not the case here. We are taking reservations for events in June already. This Club is very much alive and we are going to have a full summer beaming with activity. Trust me that is a very good thing. A good indication of our stability.

There are mixed feeling about sharing the Club with the public on big events and for private parties. The club gets crowded and there are unfamiliar faces everywhere intruding on your member privilege. It puts wear and tear on the building, staff, and organizers. However, most clubs use it as a part of membership so a member can host a party for friends, family and business. Golf Clubs have Tournaments and Outings; we have the Antique Wooden Boat Show and "The Danger Brothers." Having a member hold his daughter's wedding here is one of the most rewarding roles of my job. Yes, management encourages, (not promotes) private parties for the income, but here only to offset bar and kitchen expenses protecting the general fund. We have a break even budget. There has never been "Huge Profits" on anything. In 2008 the total income in the bar and kitchen was \$423,000 and of that \$52,000 was in private party income or 12%. That is not a lot of activity. It is not a big number but if eliminated and absorbed into membership dues it would be to some members. To my knowledge there has not been a vote on any monthly food and bar minimums, the norm for most clubs in Ohio.

Summer Hours are coming. We would like to have the Pool open by May 15th. There will something to do for everyone. I am looking forward to this time in great anticipation as well as the staff. May your summer be safe and full of everything you want it to be. I am tired of being cold and I just got here March 5th. See you soon.




