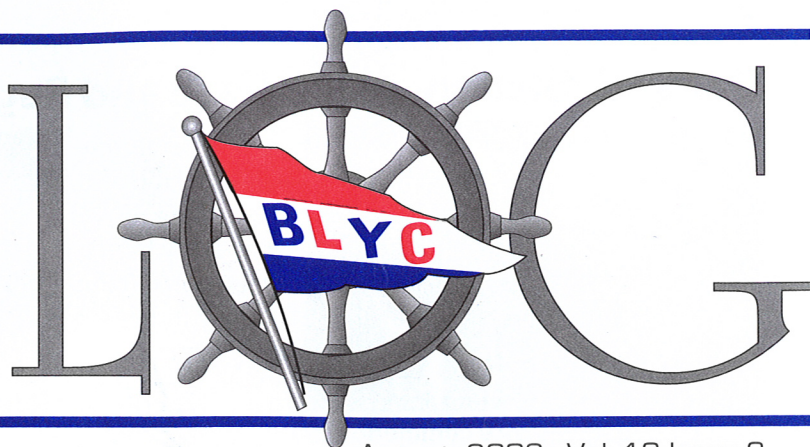

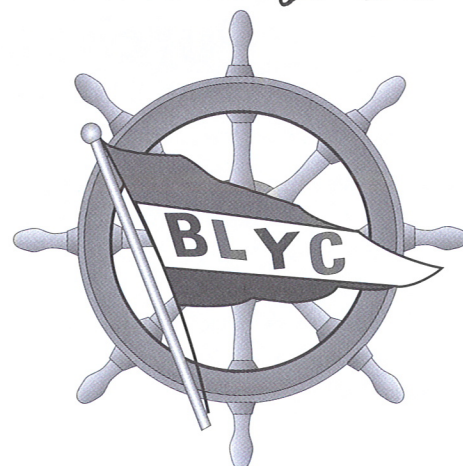

House & Grounds has been very busy. We still have some problem areas that we are working steadily to rectify. The pool has been a large expense this year.

As I write this, I was informed that the pool heater has a seal leak, which is allowing the loss of 2-3 inches of water per day. The pool pump also required replacement. In the Spring, we were required by the Health Department to install an "Anti-Entrapment Device." Not a bad idea to keep a small individual from becoming trapped by the pool suction, but very expensive.

We have a few issues that I consider to be safety issues but for the most part the primary task is painting. So, we are planning to have a paint party on August 16th at 10:00 AM. The primary objective is the row of garages next to our parking lot. It is a rather large task and anyone available to do some scraping and painting is very welcome. Some paneling will also need installing on the garages. There are also areas around the Club that could use some paint but the garages are the largest project.

We had a great Spring Work Day this year and it would be fantastic if we can generate the same involvement for painting. Please, if you have a scraper and paint equipment, bring them and we will provide the paint. A roster will be posted at the Club for you to sign to get an idea how many people we can expect..
