


House & Grounds

As we approach the end of the year for the Board of Governors, I thought I would provide a quick recap of the issues that have been prevalent this past year. Many members

are not aware of the day to day issues and some have asked questions concerning the budget and how the expenditures were used to improve the Club.

You will recall that we got an unusually quick start on repairs when Hurricane Ike visited us on Election Day 2008. We also experienced an ice/wind storm in February 2009, which damaged the Club roof more severely, destroyed the support beams under the pool patio, and damaged the docks at Eastport. A tree also fell near the parking lot as a result of the wind. A vast majority of the damage was fortunately covered by insurance.

The pool has been a continual problem. The Ohio Department of Health required the installation of an anti-entrapment device on the pool prior to being permitted to open the pool this Spring. While the device is good in merit, it still was an expense and postponed our attempt to open the pool early in the season. A leak in the pool has also developed and requires additional water daily to keep it at an operational level. The pump has also been replaced and the heater has stopped functioning. My suggestion is to continue as we are until the end of the season. Then we will have to empty the pool and locate the leak or leaks and get them repaired. I'm afraid that if we

wait until Spring to work on the pool, it may postpone the pool opening next season.

There is a pump in the water collection pit located in the parking lot which also had to be replaced. The pump is used to remove the water from the pit and continue the flow down the system.

The Club facility is experiencing the normal issues related to age and use. Paint is a major element of maintaining the Club appearance. Hopefully, by the time you read this item, the storage garages located on the east side of the parking lot will have received a facelift. We plan to install siding at the top of the garage and paint the remainder. Many other areas of the Club have also been painted and have improved the Club appearance.

The Junior Sailing Room upstairs was also remodeled by volunteers and made a significant improvement to that room. The room is now available for group meetings or just a place to sit and read or enjoy some alone time.

Future Boards will face the continual replacement of equipment, materials, and face-lift projects. I would like to thank all the individuals involved with the building maintenance and volunteers who have provided their time and energies towards keeping the Club a place we can be can be proud to call our own. It has been my pleasure to serve the membership as a Board member.

BLYC ELECTIONS

The Board of Governors is the governing body for the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. The Board consists of the Commodore, Vice-Commodore, Rear-Commodore, Secretary/Treasurer, and six Governors. The Commodore has primary responsibility for the Club and monitors all activities, events, and chairs the Board of Governors meetings.

The six Governors are elected by the Club membership. Depending on vacancies, three to four Governors are elected in alternating years. The name of the member provided on the Club membership application is the individual authorized to vote in Club elections. The members have the opportunity to vote for up to four candidates on Election Day. The candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall join the Board of Governors for a two year term.

There are events planned each year to provide the membership the opportunity to be involved in the election process. On Friday, September 4th, the candidates will gather at the Club for "Poster Night." Candidates will have campaign posters that will be displayed in various areas of the Club supporting their candidacy. That same night, candidates will bring a sufficient number of letters to be mailed to each member's residence. The letter will provide information as to why that candidate should be considered for the Board of Governors. All candidates will place a copy of their letter in one envelope and mail to the membership. That way the member only receives one envelope with all candidates' data.

On Thursday, September 10th, all candidates are invited to attend the Board of Governors business meeting. This provides the opportunity to ask questions and gain insight as to how meetings are conducted.

All candidates will attend "Candidates Night" on Friday, September 11th. Following dinner, each candidate will have a few minutes for the opportunity to provide their concerns and ideas for the electors' consideration. Again this year, the Master of Ceremonies, will

be Jerry Besanceney, offering his own brand of entertainment!

"Election Day," Sunday, September 13, begins with a breakfast on the porch with each candidate providing food items for the membership. The voting poll will be open from 9am-1:00pm for authorized members to vote for their favorite candidate.

Immediately following the election results, the new Board will meet in order to elect the positions of Vice-Commodore and Rear-Commodore for the coming year. The previous Vice-Commodore is elevated to the position of Commodore. Once these positions have been elected, the Board members will have a short meeting to determine the duties of each member. The Vice-Commodore, Rear-Commodore, and the six Governors are assigned specific responsibilities for the coming year. Those responsibilities include:

Bar and Kitchen, Monthly Log, Junior Sailing, House and Grounds, Race and Regatta, Entertainment, Docks and Rentals, and Membership.
