

# Buckeye Lake Yacht Club

# **BLYC Good Neighbor Committee**

It is that time of year once again. The Good Neighbor Committee will sponsor a children's Christmas party for the children of Buckeye Lake Village. It is our way of giving back to the community that our Club calls home. You may not be aware that Buckeye Lake is the poorest community in all of Licking County. Just drive a few blocks from the Club in any direction and you will see ample evidence of the poverty. Each year we sponsor as many children as our member's generosity will allow. We ask the members to adopt a child for the cost of \$50. The members can choose to shop for their child and promise not to spend more than \$50, or they can write a check to BLYC Good Neighbor Committee and we will do the shopping for you.

We limit the ages of the children to 12 and under. We will provide you with the names, ages, and a desired gift for each child. The Yacht Club does not select the children that attend the party. In the past we have used the LEADS organization and a local church as the agencies that select which children to invite. The party is always on a Sunday afternoon in December. Many of our members have become corporate sponsors and provide us with pizza, cookies, and winter clothing. When you see the list of gifts that these children ask for it will tug at your heartstrings. In the past we have had requests for blankets, socks, and "something for mommy."

If you would like to sponsor a child or donate items to this worthy cause please see Commodore Joe Campbell, Joni Campbell, Commodore Greg Miller, or Dwight Joseph. A sign-up list will be posted at the Club within the next week.

## Rentals & Docks

After an absence of two years, it's nice to be "working" again. 2005 (2006 & 2007) I ran for the board at the request of Mark Russell and the encouragement of Steve Harris and many others. At that time, I informed everyone that I would serve for only two years and that I would be done. I also requested to be Race and Regatta governor for those two years and it was done. Little did I realize how much I would miss "not" being on the board. So... to make a long story short I decided to run again. Just let me say "Thank You!" to everyone who voted me back onto the board for 2009 and 2011.

My assignment is Docks & Rentals. After being briefed by Rear Commodore Bob Zeiher I think I am "ready to go." The first good news I received after my "briefing" was that the crane in the storage yard was not functioning. I lled the people who service the crane on Sept. 28th, they came out on the 29th and the crane is now operational again. I also learned a new definition from this and that is "side loading."

It seems that when using the crane it is very important to pick a load up vertically and not from the side. In other words, if the chain from the crane to the object to be lifted is not straight up and down, Do Not lift it because the hoist will come off the rail. Please use the crane in a safe manner.

I have been working with Scott Evans to help train Rick Meyers to be Race & Regatta governor. Rick is a little like me in that he did not know too much about sailing to start off; but, he will be up to speed by next spring.

Rent-A-John has been contacted and the "john" in the boat yard will be removed by November 1st and reappear April 1st.

Next time you go by the boat yard prease notice that the fence along 79 has been painted. I've felt for a long time that BLYC should be a good neighbor by cleaning up our storage yard. Sally

(my 1st mate) and I accomplished this task in two days, (approximately 20 hours). This will be an on-going task next spring, summer and fall; and, I'll be asking for help from everyone (especially those who use these facilities).

A couple things I learned from this adventure are: (1) that on a very windy day, (Saturday, 10/3) a roller pan liner with paint in it will blow out of the pan (twice) and (2) to always look before stepping off a ladder because you just might knock over a can of paint with a loose lid. A couple other times we tended to get a little "testy" with each other.

I definitely would not recommend fence painting as a "family activity." Thank you Sally for your help, dedication and inspiration. I could not have done it without you.

I know I tended to be a little windy with my Race & Regatta monthly articles.

I don't think that will be a problem with Docks & Rentals; but, I'll try.

































### **Race and Regatta**

Several have asked who won the wine basket that was raffled off.


