

Your Board of Governors has been quite busy over the past month. From an administrative standpoint, the Flag Officers have introduced a new management philosophy for the Club. We have implemented a team management concept, with responsibility divided among "front of the house," "back of the house," and "administrative" areas.

We welcome Andrea Foster to our management team. She will be in charge of "front of the house," with responsibility for staffing and scheduling of the bar and restaurant areas, server training, purchasing and pricing for the bar, and facilitating private party business.

"Back of the house" will be managed by Chef Matt Langstaff. In adlon to his culinary skills, Matt will have responsibility for hiring and training of kitchen staff, menu development, purchasing and pricing for the restaurant, and quality control.

Rebecca Miller will continue in the "administrative" office. She has primary responsibility for billing and collections, payroll, banking, communications, and member services.

The managers of these three areas are working cooperatively with one another, and coordinating their efforts with the goal of providing an efficient and cost effective result for our members.

At the November board meeting, Governor Rick Myers reported on the progress of the Seawall Committee. He has interviewed five consulting firms. The top two candidates will meet with the board early this month to present the findings of their survey of our seawall condition and their recommendations for correction. The end result will be development of a plan and time table for the much needed repairs of the seawall surrounding our island.

Governor John Sproat and his committee have been diligently planning the 31st annual BLYC Antique & Classic Boat Regatta. Although this event does not occur until next August, Governor Sproat is well ahead of the curve, already having commitments from several attendees and vendors. We anticipate that this historic event will be bigger and better than ever.

The reutilization of the upstairs area of the clubhouse is well under way. Chuck and Bruce have reorganized our space for much needed expansion of storage, as well as clearing out many no longer needed items. The junior room was rehabilitated last year through efforts spearheaded by Governor Gayle Fisher-Mulvey, and is being used regularly for Friday night movies, as well as adult card games. There is a child care area available for members to put a small child down for a nap while visiting the Club. There is also a much needed board office, where each board member has his own file drawer for Club related materials, as well as a work area for Club business. We should also be able to provide the Auxiliary with additional space, which they can certainly use. And we're not done yet!

In the very near future you will notice brand new stools at the bar and two new high top tables. These coordinate nicely with the furnishings in the fireplace room, and should serve our needs for years to come. On behalf of the Board of Governors, I want to thank President Carol Donnelly and the Auxiliary membership for providing the funding for this nice addition to our Club. This is but the most recent in a long history of hard work and financial support of the Club by the BLYC Auxiliary.

I hope to see you at the Club soon.

The Gun Club has started and is being well attended. We are also working on several other projects.


