Spring is in the air. The ice on the lake is melting, the birds are back (and chirping) and the landscaping around the Club is starting to "green up".

In prepa-

ration for another successful boating season I'd like to review a few pertinent rules of the BLYC Constitution By-Laws and Rules.

Article III: Addendum: Section 1 (a): States "No Member shall bring beer or alcoholic beverages into the Permit Premises: (as defined in Section 2 of this Article).

Section 2: reads "The Permit Premises, as applied to this Article, is defined as the entire Watkins Island but excluding the docks".

Section 1(a): reads "All beer or alcoholic beverages purchased at the Club must be consumed on the Premises and may not be taken from the Premises or Island".

So, I guess it's O.K. for members with docks on the Island to carry beer and alcohol to their boats; but, that's where it must be consumed and you can not drink it on the Island. AND, according to the ODNR you can not consume it on the Lake. Sounds to me as if the easiest way to enjoy a drink at the Club is to purchase it at the bar.

Article XI: Rule 4: reads "No dogs or pets are allowed on the island with the following exception: The dog or pet, may be carried directly to a boat moored at the Island, but shall be transported across the island and not be left on the ground, leashed or otherwise. The pet must then be restricted to the boat".

Article XI: Rule 7: reads "no picnics shall be permitted anywhere on the Club premises, except upon application to and upon permission by the House Governor."

So, I'd say it's O.K. for members

with docks on the Island to carry food to their boats; but, that's where it must be consumed and you can not eat it on the Island. AND, you must apply for and be granted permission by the House Governor. If you want to have a party on your boat I'd suggest you take your guests for a boat ride and anchor somewhere on the lake (and remember the ODNR is out there, too).

The Rent-A-John should be in place in the storage yard by April 1st. I'm also going to have the crane checked and serviced in early April. Remember to use the crane for vertical lifting only. Side loading the crane will cause it to come off it's rail and then no one can use it and we are forced to use the ramp at the state park.

To the best of my knowledge our new bar stools have been shipped (from Europe on a cargo ship). They were scheduled for March 4th departure and I'm told the trip takes approximately three weeks. I've been told that we will have them in early April. Let's hope they are here by mid to late April.

See you on spring work day (4/18). This a good opportunity to meet fellow members and learn how the Club functions. You will have an enjoyable day and the work is not too difficult.
