Membership

Recently, I have received a number of requests regarding the classifications of Membership in Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. Below is an abbreviated review. Please contact me if you have any questions.

<u>Active</u> <u>Membership</u>

Active members must be at least 18 years of age and may be of any place of residence. Active members have full privileges of the Club, including electoral, rental, and charge privileges.

An application for Active Membership must be accompanied by the entire Initiation Fee and First Year's Dues.

Children of Active Members becoming Active Members:

Under the age of 21:

Children of Active Members in good standing may become Active Members without paying the initiation fee provided that they do so prior to the age of 21 years (or 23 if an a full-time college student between the ages of 21 and 23)

Between the ages of 21 and 40:

Children of Active Members in good standing who do not qualify for the above option, may become Active Members by paying 1/2 of the initiation fee provided that

they do so prior to the age of 40 years.

Associate Membership

Associate Membership is available to persons at least 21 years of age, but not yet 35 years of age. Associate members are afforded the option to join the Club by paying the First Year's Dues and at least 1/3 of the initiation fee. Each following year, at least 1/3 of the initiation fee must be paid with the annual dues until the full amount is paid, at which time they become an Active Member.

Associate Members have all privileges of Active Membership with the exception of electoral privileges.

Provisional Membership

Provisional Membership is available to all persons over 21 years of age. Provisional members are afforded the option to join the Club by paying the First Year's Dues and at least 1/3 of the initiation fee. Each following year, at least 1/3 of the initiation fee must be paid with the annual dues until the full amount is paid, at which time they become an Active Member.

Provisional Members do not have electoral, rental, or charge privileges.

Non-Resident Membership

Non-Resident Membership is available to persons at least 21 years of age who reside outside an 75-mile radius from the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club and not temporarily residing within that radius for a period of longer than 8 weeks per year. Non-Resident Members have a lower dues rate than Active Membership.

Non-Resident Members have all privileges of Active Membership with the exception of electoral privileges. them I am certain they will have been a success. Soon it will be time for election. I do not have to run this year but those that do need your consideration. We have a great slate of good people willing to work for your Club, so please come out and support them. Thank you for all of the help you have given me the last 3 years and hopefully I will have next year.

Re-instatement of Membership

Former members of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club who have been non-members for one year or more may resume Active Membership status by payment of the *difference* between the initiation fee originally paid and the current initiation fee, or by the payment of all dues and fees that would have been required during such absence, whichever is the lesser amount. See Article I, Section 6 of the By-Laws for specific information.

RESERVATION POLICY

For purposes of clarification, and to avoid misunderstanding, the club's reservation policy is outlined below:

OPEN DINING:

Reservations are encouraged but not required. Advance reservations help management to assure that staffing is at an appropriate level to provide the best possible service. If the dining room is busy, those with reservations will receive seating preference over those without. Members are always welcome, reservations or not.

SPECIAL EVENTS:

Reserv-ations are a must. Our chef prepares a special menu and prepares quantities according to anticipated attendance. You may attend without a reservation, and our staff will attempt to accommodate you, seating and food quantity permitting.

You may not reserve a table if you are not coming for the meal. If you plan to attend for the entertainment only, do not make a reservation. Doing so causes increased waste and expense for the club, and will result in the price of the meal being charged to your account.

We have no cover charge, entertainment costs are included in your dues, and members are always welcome. However, entertainment only seating is on an as available basis.


