LOOKING AFT...

The following is a reprint of a July 1980 "Did You Know..." article from then Club Historian, P/C Whitey Limes:

How Cranberry Marsh Came to Be

Cranberry Marsh, Bog, or Island, whichever you wish to call it, is a Sphagnum Bog. The definition of sphagnum, according to the Webster Dictionary is; 1) any number of related grayish mosses found in bogs; peat moss, 2) a mass of such mosses used to make fertilizer, to pack and pot plants, to make surgical dressings, etc. - to say the least, the writer has never seen any surgical dressings made out of moss!

The name Cranberry Marsh, Bog, or Island comes from the fact that it is overgrown with little creeping vines of cranberry. The writer has eaten some of these cranberries which were picked by Wm. "Bud" Sayre and preserved. The cranberries are a little smaller than those one can buy in the food markets at Thanksgiving time... So much for definitions and preliminaries. The unusual thing about Cranberry Marsh is that normally a sphagnum bog will grow from the shore into the water. But, Cranberry Bog or Marsh is an island completely surrounded by water. How did this come about?

You will recall from an earlier article that, "the gouging, grinding, and bulldozing effect of the last ice age of glaciers" left a depression which eventually became the Big Pond and the Big Swamp. Craberry Marsh was part of the Big Swamp. In prehistoric times it was much larger than it is now. It was here that early settlers and Indians stopped for food, clothing, dye, and medicine from the abundant crop of cranberries.

Between 1825 and 1830, an embankment was built at the west end of the Big Pond to create a lake to be a source of water for the new canal system. As the depth of the water increased, a portion of the bog broke loose from the bottom and rose to the surface, thus creating Cranberry Marsh or Island. At that time (1830), the Island or Marsh contained some 420 acres. It has deteriorated over the years due to wind, weather, wave action, ice, etc. to the present which is less than 19 acres.

Along with cranberries, there are many other plants on the Marsh such as poison sumac, orchids, toothed arrow-wood, sundew, chokeberry and cotton grass.

Cranberry Marsh, with it's long and interesting history, has been a botanist's paradise. Recently, it was made into a wildlife preserve. It is the finest sphagnum Cranberry Bog remaining in Ohio. Every effort should be made to preserve it.
