For you kayakers, Gleich Beach is no more but, there is a platform in the west basin that junior sailing sometimes uses. I am sure we can all work together and you can use it for kayak launching as well this summer.

We have 21 open spaces in the Eastport Boatyard.

We've — Attended Traveler Series Regattas — Engaged a US Sailing certified Sailing Instructor in our Sailing Camps...Susannah Schroeder — Had our 1st BLYC Sailing Camp on Buckeye Lake in 3 years — Engaged a BLYC "born & raised" Racing Coach that is so talented...Michael Davis — Had very successful fundraising activities: BLYC Golf Outing Hole Sponsorships and Mulligan sales, Auction, and Pancake Breakfast — Held a Matt Fisher "fireside chat" about his lifelong love of sailing — Participated in and excelled in I-LYA's Junior Sailing Championship (aka Jr Bay Week at P-I-B)...a 6th place finish and Sportsmanship Award

Sailing Camp was great. Susannah Schroeder, US Sailing certified instructor, had the help of Katy Schroeder and Olivia Smith to lead 13 youth, ages 7-14, through the 3 day course. When I walked in on the last day, I was greeted by kids and their parents, all complimenting the instructors and the coaches! It's back!

A big thanks goes out to Jeff Clark who organized the Golf Outing this year. He donated all "hole sponsorship" monies and mulligan sales to Junior Sailing…over \$700. Thank You!

Tracey Davis led the charge on the Auction and the Pancake Breakfast. But many others, including the Juniors and their parents, played roles in donating items for the auction and food for the breakfast and in labor to set up, cook, serve, cleanup, and collect money at the door. During this time we even received donation checks from several members. These two events resulted in close to \$2,500 in fundraising!

Michael Davis, the first BLYC "born and raised" sailor to become BLYC Coach in recent years, was coach all week. He did a great job coaching and with safety situations. We had seven racers — five Lasers and a 420. The sailors were: 420 - Abby Headlee (2 years at JBW) and Katy Schroeder (4 @ JBW); and Lasers - Clay Headlee (2 @ JBW), Cora McVey-Steele (2 @ JBW), Matthew Davis (5 @ JBW), Olivia Smith (4 @ JBW), and Susannah Schroeder (5 @ JBW).

- Monday & Tuesday: 3-5 knot winds
- Wednesday: 0-3 knots (flat and hot); went in 2+ hours early

Thursday: 12-14 with up to 18 knot gusts with rolling seas (depth finder on BLYC Coach/Safety boat...42' swell followed immediately by 26' valley...16 foot difference): only 1 Race on each course.

Our racers, in individual races, placed as high as — Abby & Katy - 13 out of 35 — Clay - 2 of 35 — Cora - 16 of 35 — Matthew - 20 of 35 — Olivia - 17 of 35 — Susannah - 17 of 35

Clay Headlee took sixth place overall out of 35 racers in the Laser class. *Way to go Clay!*Relatively new to Lasers, he has spent most of his training racing an Opti — Look for great things in the future from Clay. 

When the Klan Came to the Lake

The Lake that most of us know as a peaceful and tranquil respite from our busy lives also has several dark spots in its history. Buckeye Lake was established as a watershed for the Ohio Canal, built beginning in 1826 from a marshy area that Native Americans called "The Big Swamp." With the demise of the canal age for travel in the late Nineteenth Century, George Watkins — after whom Watkins Island is named — was instrumental in getting the reservoir donated to the State of Ohio for recreational purposes. The interurban line from Columbus to Zanesville then constructed a spur line from Hebron to the Lake and assisted in establishing the amusement park. The flatlands of central and northeast Ohio and most of central and northern Indiana served as easy land for the construction of interurban rail tracks. It was this massive interurban system that provided the means of transportation to the Lake from a wide catchment area. Among those taking advantage of these trains were members of the Ku Klux Klan. The Ohio Electric Company even ran special cars to transport the Klansmen and women — called "Camellias" — to Buckeye Lake.

The Ku Klux Klan experienced a second major revival in the early twentieth century, and by the 1920s Indiana and Ohio were burgeoning areas for recruitment. The Klan was especially influential in state governments. During this time, the Indiana governor was a Klansman and locally the mayor of Newark wore the hooded white robes and masks. The "Grand Dragon" of the Indiana Klan, D.C. Stevenson, had a summer home at Buckeye



Lake. Under Stevenson's leadership, in 1923 and 1925 two large Konclaves were held at Buckeye Lake. The 1925 gathering

was billed as the "largest Konclave in the United States," with estimates of nearly one hundred thousand persons attending this second event. While these attendance numbers might be inflated, nonetheless the shores of our peaceful lake served as a massive meeting ground for this quite toxic organization. National speakers dominated the KKK platforms and even Klan marriages were performed on the shores of Buckeye Lake.

While certainly not a pretty picture historically, these two Konclaves were significant yet now largely unknown historical events. Stevenson was eventually charged and convicted with manslaughter of a young woman he kidnapped and drugged; he was sentenced to life in prison. Likewise the Indiana governor and the mayor of Newark were indicted on corruption charges. With the leadership largely undergoing serious legal problems, by the end of the 1920s the influence of the Klan withered away to almost nothing. There is no historical evidence that the Yacht Club was involved with this eyesore, although one might surmise that some members of the Club were associated with the Klan.
