Summer is officially in full swing — We have been waiting for this!

The pool looks and feels wonderful! Thanks go out to Governor Campbell, Chuckie, and Trent for all the work they have put in painting and fixing everything. The BLYC Members will be thanking you for the next 3 months!

You may remember last month I said that our bridge would be in before Memorial Day. Well... I am sure you have noticed that it is not in! ODNR is now telling me that it will be the middle of July before the new bridge is installed.

Once the bridge is in, the state will install a 3 to 4' gate on the dam side of the bridge with a sign that indicates that the bridge is to be used to access the Yacht Club only — no loitering or fishing from the bridge. Our committee working with ODNR is very happy about this. We had concerns that it would become a favorite fishing spot which is not desirable. Our old gate will get a face lift and will be placed on the island side of the bridge.

We are anticipating that as the dam remediation project comes to completion, Buckeye Lake will see an increased number of visitors and curious folks who will want to see what the finished project looks like. This is a good thing, but it means that the Club needs to be more aware of security, monitoring our property, and making sure that it is not being used by non-members. We need everyone to help with this. First of all, make sure that you have your parking sticker in your car window. We are placing a notice on cars without stickers, letting them know that our parking lot is private property and that they need to park at the State Park. If you are meeting guests at the Club, please ask the staff for a guest parking pass. We want to make sure that we have room for you and your guests to park when you visit the Club. We are also looking into a card key system, fob or some other way to secure our gate coming onto the island. Again, we will all need to make sure that the gate securely closes. There will be more information on this as our plans progress.

The Boards of Governors and Trustees have approved the funding to connect the Club to city water! This will be happening very soon, and it will be great for our Bar and Kitchen operation! We have also approved the upgrade to the electric coming onto the island — this is necessary to accommodate future projects and to help more evenly distribute the power that we are using.

We continue to work with ODNR and the Army Corps of Engineers to get the approval for the sea walls around the Club. The first phase will be to replace the sea wall around the swimming pool which is desperately needed. It is our goal to have the permit so that immediately after Labor Day, we can get this phase started and completed before the water level is lowered for the winter.

We are making progress and moving forward! Let's all take time to enjoy our family and friends this summer at the Club. The lineup of activities is amazing — sailing, cookouts, pool activities, the wonderful food, and, of course, the entertainment!

Due to the dam remediation project, the club entrance has changed several times. For those who have not experienced this "Mapquest journey," do not despair as it will be changing again soon to accommodate our use of the grassy area by the pool to get that ever so wanted summer tan.

The staff of House & Grounds has been diligently working painting and preparing the pool and furniture to open on time. Yes, all, the pool heater works. But, please keep in mind that the pool is not a sauna or hot tub. We don't want to eliminate the expected experience of "WOOOOOOOO I'll get used to this!"

It has been quite an adventure getting the necessary permits to begin repair on our seawall but with cooperation from ODNR and the Army Corps of Engineers along with IBI engineering, we are finally moving forward.

Soon, we will be switching over to Buckeye Lake municipal water. A new one and a half inch water line will be installed and we anticipate making the changeover by early June. We will still keep our well for special limited use. AEP will be switching our electric service to better accomodate our needs just as soon as they can put our project on the schedule. As you have read, House & Grounds is, as usual, busy. When or if you know of something needing repair or see something that just doesn't look right, please let me know. That's it for now — there will be more.


The Season is here!

The Finance Committee continues to move forward on obtaining the \$10,000 Lakes in Economic Distress Grant from the State of Ohio. Our only significant increase last year was to increase the one-time new member initiation fee to \$1,500 — some members will remember it was once as high as \$2,500. While we

have resisted increases, the Finance Committee will be evaluating some of the necessary capital expenditures and communicating what we find as those future costs come into focus. As Commodore Luttenberger mentioned at the semi-annual meeting, he is leading an effort to develop a capital improvement investment club that would provide for an opportunity for members to contribute financially and receive long-term recognition of their generosity.


We're Back!

The following article was written by P/C Frank Foster and originally published in the March, 1987 issue of the Log. Now that we're getting back out on the water to sail again, I thought it would be a good article to share.

Porch Sitting & Race Watching... a Long Tradition

Public notice of a meeting to form a club was given in late April, 1906. Through the summer and fall of 1906, the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club was formed. That winter, around January of 1907, a corporation was formed to sell 1,000 shares of stock at \$5.00 each for the purpose of acquiring land and constructing a clubhouse. About that same time the incorporators of the building corporation took over a lease on "sunken island" and a half lot on the lake's main shore facing the island. It was a spot of sometimes land with several half grown trees, mostly willows, surrounded by always shallow water and, especially in the spring, frequently flooded completely. They envisioned that it could be raised and enlarged and the waters around it deepened. It offered privacy because it was an island and was located only about 300 yards from the interurban railway. Drawings of a beautiful building were prepared, and I have a copy of it and published it in an earlier log. When the bids were opened, the building was too expensive and the club officers decided to confine their efforts to the bare necessities within their



limited needs. Bids were requested for a simpler building and a contract was awarded for \$1,811.00. Construction began in early summer of 1907 and was completed in November.

In the summer of 1908 a porch was built across the building's outer end extending somewhat past the easterly and westerly walls.

In 1912-1913 the new, present clubhouse was constructed and the old one was modified, later damaged, and ultimately replaced by our current boat houses on the east side of the island.

Thus, it appears that this picture must have been taken between 1908 and 1912. The picture looks north-easterly or east-northeast down toward our present Eastport facility. Much as we do today, it appears that a group had gathered on the front porch and was watching the racing sailors. Others were pursuing their activities. From the appearance of the flags, the wind seems to have been at the same slow speed we often find now

days. As you can see "Sunken Island," now Watkins Island, was raised and a seawall poured around it. The island, in fact, was considerably more circular and smaller than now. Since the porch was so close to the water they must have been able to hear pleasant sounds of the water slapping against boats, docks, and seawall. Our new deck, adjacent the swimming pool on the west side of the island, may afford us an opportunity for the same pleasant sounds.

From the appearance of the shadows it must have been around mid-day, probably a Sunday. Our lawn is certainly in much better shape now that it was

While the building is a neat, old building, I certainly am glad they later acquired a stronger financial position and built the current clubhouse. They sure had the right idea for a good way to spend a Sunday afternoon.

Hope to see you on the front porch this summer!
