Every August, we remind members that our Club is run by dedicated members who volunteer their time, talents, and treasure. Our Club is very fortunate to have the great volunteerism that we do among our membership. Along those lines... do you want to become more involved? We are seeking enthusiastic candidates to run for the Board this September. Yes, it is a time commitment and sometimes it feels more like work than fun. That said, I can honestly tell you that serving on the Board has been one of the most rewarding experiences I have ever had. If you enjoy BLYC, I strongly encourage you to run and help us to guide our Club into the future. For more information, feel free to ask any Board member or Past Commodore. They will be happy to answer your questions.

Thank you for your continued patience and cooperation as we modify our operations to comply with the ever-changing requirements in an effort to keep everyone safe and healthy. Under the recommendations of national health experts, Ohio and Licking County have added the requirement to wear masks. In addition to social distancing, BLYC members were instructed to wear masks on the island in mid-

July. The guidelines include wearing masks when you are not seated and when moving about the island — both inside the clubhouse and around the grounds. In the pool area, masks are expected when moving about to place orders at the bar, use the restrooms, and interact with members outside your family group. In prior years, we would be have reported on the successes of our sailing team at the I-LYA Junior Bay Week. Unfortunately, this year the races were cancelled along with other events like the Commodore's Ball, annual boat show and annual auto show. Fortunately, we have been able to add extra sailing camps for our juniors, the Auxiliary is diligently bringing to life a scaled down version of the annual fundraising event, and our staff and Past Commodores are planning a modified version of the Commodore Steak Nite. Its encouraging to see the creativity of our members who are working within the pandemic restrictions to continue to host events and activities.

Your Board is continuing to work behind the scenes to plan for needed capital improvements. We received the long-awaited approval from the Army Corps of Engineers to install the seawall on the north and east sides of the island. The sea wall facing the dam will also add about eleven feet to the island along with personal watercraft docks and a kayak launch. Construction is scheduled to begin in mid-September after the pool closes. We also have scheduled to have the roof to be replaced during the same time frame, funded by wind damage insurance proceeds. After the boating season, the east side docks will be removed in order to allow access to the island to install the sea wall. Currently the island is eroding into the lake underneath the docks, which impacts the stability of the island. Our current plan is to install the new sea wall and build new docks on the east side next spring in time for the 2021 boating season.

Please, please, please....

Don't use others' docks! BLYC has several transient docks for your use when visiting the Club by boat, both on and off island. But, most of the Club's docks are rented to members on an annual basis. If a dock is marked with blue and orange tape on the outside posts, it is available for use as a transient dock. Otherwise, it has been rented by a member for their use. Sadly, we continue to have situations where people assume that, since there's no boat in the dock, it's ok to tie up there. It is not! This has lead to a number of instances where members return only to find that they cannot dock their boat in their paid space. Hopefully, as we move forward with improvements to our seawalls, we can make more transient dockage available.

As you will read in Rear Commodore Campbell's article, we are making progress on our seawall and dock repairs. Long overdue and expensive, this has been a difficult process to get started. But, after nearly a decade, we were able to start with the wall around the pool area last year, and we should be working on the rear basin this fall.

We are unfortunately still having issues with our combination locks on the gates to our docks. As Docks & Rentals Governor, I want to both apologize for the inconveniences that have occured and also thank everyone for their patience as we seek the right solution.

As always, if you a question or issue with your dock or other Club rentals, please do not hesitate to give me a call.

The Finance Committee met a few times in July to approve review and approve tax returns, monitor our financial condition on a year to date basis and review funding for capital improvements. We're happy to report that, in spite of the impact of the pandemic, the Club is on track to stay within established budget constraints and maintain a strong cash position. Looking to the next fiscal year beginning in September and the significant capital improvements on the horizon, we are considering an increase in the new member initiation fee for 2021. The committee is also reviewing the major operating expenses like ongoing maintenance, insurance, taxes and health care to assess the need for an increase in member dues for the upcoming year. The finance committee recommendations will be presented to the new Board for consideration.



HOUSE & GROUNDS

I wish all are doing well and COVID-19 is in name only for your family and friends. The club personnel continue to sanitize, practice safe distancing, and wear masks to assist in preventing this pandemic debacle.

As in the past, and as will continue for some years to come, House & Grounds keeps busy...

Pool: Our pool is cleaned every day along with continual filtering 24/7. Unfortunately, it appears that our new pool chairs will not see any bottoms this year. We will continue our temporary policy of bring your own chair unless you want to sit on your beach towel or ground. The pool will close after 8:00 pm on Sunday September 13, 2020. This is in preparation for installation of a new club roof. With debris going wherever, we must cover and close the pool.

Rear Basin Seawall: (Phase II A) We now have permission to start and complete the rear basin seawall & dock project. FYI... it takes FOUR permits: ODNR, EPA, Ohio/National Historical Society, & Army Corps of Engineers. Construction is scheduled to start as soon as all logistical items are revisited, as it has been over a year in obtaining permits, and getting issues resolved. It will be an area for jet ski's, kayaks, canoes, and small sailboats.

Steps from Porch to Pool: By the time you read this, you may have already gone down or up the new stairs on the west end or our porch. The old ones were not in the best shape and had become an issue of safety.

Gates: The combination locks for our dock and club entrance gates have been replaced. The old ones were good but were not designed for exterior use. There were incidents on both sides of the gates. Some couldn't get through the

gate to their boat and some couldn't off the dock to go to the Club. This created a considerable amount of adverse chatter. As of now, the combination for the dock gates is 1906. Press each number then push down the lock handle. Be sure to shut the gate behind you and not give the combination to someone you do not know. The gate to the club will remain pass-through. Press down the handle and walk on through. We will be discussing when to implement the combination to this lock at our next Board meeting. Unfortunately, some of our members were trapped on the wrong side of the gate to area 800 docks... again. This occurred on Saturday, July 13 around 20:30. As Governor of House & Grounds I extend my apologies to those who experienced this situation. We are working on a solution for protection of our member's property that will not fail.

East Side Docks: (Phase II B) Currently we are preparing paperwork for quotes to remove seawall, docks and dock roof on the east side of the island. As this progresses, members will be kept informed.

As with any project, maintenance or just simple repairs it takes dedicated people to get it done. I continue to thank those who have stepped up to assist our Club be great... Mike Smith for the pool steps. He ramrodded a difficult project to perfection. Our own maintenance manager, Chuck Fadley, who continues to be the behind the scenes guy getting it done. Dan Bosworth plumbing. Holland Brothers Electric. Gutridge heating & cooling. *Thank you*. And thank you to our entire staff who put forth continual effort in service to our club members.






History of the BLYC Burgee

The following article first appeared in the December, 1979 issue of The Log, written by BLYC Historian, Whitey Limes.





The drawing above is a drawing of the original Club flag of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club.

It was approved along with the original Constitution (which has been amended several times) at the organizational meeting of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. The meeting was held on Sunday, May 6, 1906 at the cottage of Mr. Charles W. Miller on Orchard Island.

The specifications were as follows: A triangular pennant, the hoist of which was to be 2/3s of the length. A blue field extended to a line parallel to the hoist 5/12s of the overall length. A field of red extended from this line to the tip of the pennant.


The Club emblem, consisting of an eight spoke ship's wheel with B on the upper vertical spoke, L on the left horizontal spoke, Y on the right horizontal spoke and C on the lower vertical spoke on a field of white was centrally located on the blue field.

This burgee was the official flag of the Club until the fifth annual meeting of the Club, held 18 September, 1910. During this meeting, under "New Business," Article III of the Constitution was amended changing the Club's emblem and flag to those still in use today.

My interpretation of the above specifications appear in a poster paint drawing in the Commodores Lounge.

What became of Commodore Limes' "poster print" of the original burgee is unknown. Like many things, it is apparently "lost to history." However, there hangs in the Commodores Lounge today, a hand-sewn replica of the original burgee.

Flying your burgee is a great way to show your pride in your Club and also identify you as a member. On powerboats, the burgee is usually flown from a short staff on the bow, although most pontoon boats display it on a short staff on the back of their bimini. Sailboats typically fly theirs from a halyard on the starboard side of the mast, except while racing.
