



In the left picture (L-R) are Commodore Ivan Rollitt (1973), Marty Headlee, and Commodore General Bob Preston (1976). In the middle picture we add Virgil Bateman (far right) and Tom Greiner (left of Virgil). The picture on the right shows Marty Headlee with son, Chad, and the dedication plaque. Ivan, Murray, Tom, and Virgil were all employed by Columbus Steel. Ivan asked Virgil to draw up plans for the yardarm. It was constructed, hauled up onto Watkins Island and then hoisted up. As always, I welcome your story to share along with your

pictures too.

Classic Boats at BLYC

In 1907, BLYC assumed the lease on Sunken Island (now Watkins Island) and began construction of the first Clubhouse. This Clubhouse, quite spartan compared to our home today (built in 1913), was out over the water along the east side of the island approximately where the race shack sits today. While building the clubhouse was an important first step for the new club, being a yacht club, docks were equally important. As most boats

in that day were of wooden construction, the first docks built were a row of covered boathouses also along the east side of the island (wooden boats don't do well in constant sunlight) as was very common all around Buckeye Lake at that time. Through the years, the boathouses deteriorated and were replaced in the early 1980's with our current covered docks. I have been told that much of the capital necessary for that project was put up by the dockholders themselves! Through the years, classic boats of all varieties have made the BLYC covered docks their home. Not too long ago, as one walked onto the island, you would be greeted by Gus Schell's 1948 Chris Craft sedan, Margus II, Steve Schilling's 1970 Lyman Cruisette, Lybation, George Fisher's Chris Craft, My Gal, Dave Cox's Skiffcraft, Happy Hour, and many others. There were also quite a few old boats in the covered docks at Sayre Bros. Marina. Those docks were, sadly, a casualty of the dam remediation project. Through the years, the number of classic boats has certainly diminished and all boats in the covered docks were removed in the fall of 2014 for repair work on the docks. Now that the dam remediation is over, they are slowly making their way back. Steve has Lybation back in the water and Margus II will be making her return soon as well.

Beginning in 1981, until the dam project, BLYC hosted a Classic Boat Regatta each summer. Resurrected last season, sadly we had to cancel this year due to the pandemic. This event brought even more of these old beauties to our lake and was always a highlight of the season. Several BLYC members own classic boats and this great tradition will certainly continue into the future. They are a throwback to a simpler time, a piece of nostalgia, and a large part of Buckeye Lake and BLYC history.
