



HOUSE & GROUNDS

Summer is coming to a close which means children are returning to school, our pool is closing, cooler temperatures, OSU football will be televised in our club for every game, election of Governors, a new Commodore, lots of events, and the start of projects long in need of completion. Lets get started...

Pool closing – Sunday September 12, 2021 at sunset our pool will be closed. Its been a great year for swimming. Many of you have gotten to know Patrick, our pool bar expert in the art of mixology.

The covered dock project will begin October 5, 2021. The wooden sidewalk, all docks, and the roof will be removed. A new seawall, new docks, and upgraded electric service will replace all that is removed. The seawall is 5 gauge steel sheet pile driven six to eight feet into the hard pan providing sufficient strength from collapse. Each walkway is steel, thirty inches wide, twenty-four feet long, covered with Trex (same material as the club porch), with an electric outlet centered on each walkway for ease of use. The distance between each walkway is twenty-four feet providing two slips of twelve feet each. There are twelve slips affected by this renovation. Any member who has a lift under the current boat roof, it will be removed, stored, and put back at club expense.

REMINDER: For those affected by this construction – you must have your boat and all personal belongings removed by October 1, 2021. Anything remaining after that date will be removed with demolition.

Next on our seawall replacement agenda, we have contracted with IBI Engineering to start the west pier, east pier, and front seawall of club replacement project. Our first step is to confer with ODNR and the Army Corp of Engineers as to what they will allow us to do. Up until now, our seawall projects have followed the club footprint on property we own. Although we built the west pier, east pier, and front of club seawall, this part of our footprint is on ODNR property. We project it will take at least three months of discussions with ODNR and ACoE to come to an agreement on what they will allow us to do. Once this is complete, we will submit our final plan for replacing what is left of our piers. After we submit our final plan, it will be a period of time, maybe a year, to get our permits to build. This is all contingent on what ODNR and ACoE approve in the first step of this project.

We now have our chlorine injector and pH reader in place. It's only been since October 2019 that we ordered this. Covid and lack of workers to build the unit are the culprits for delay.

Final construction plans for parking lot gates, key entry system, new gates for our docks and front entrance are completed. Contractors are in place with construction to begin soon. As we move forward with this project you will be kept informed of all that is needed to enter the club.

Pets are not allowed on the island except going to and from your boat. Smoking or eating in the pool is prohibited.

Drinking in the pool in a plastic cup is permitted. Please discard all trash in appropriate containers.

In case you didn't notice, the following 2021 projects have been completed to date: Bar resurfaced, floor behind bar replaced, new oven, new kitchen prep table, replaced porch floor and front of club siding, replaced all wood decking on west pier, jet ski docks & seawall behind club, flags for docks at Eastport and area 800, new ice machine, car & boat shows, and so on.

If you missed the Cardboard Boat Races you certainly will want to place it on your bucket list calendar for next year. It was amazing!! Seven boats, all made of 100% cardboard, tape and paint. I venture to say there were 200 people watching this main event. Be a watcher next year or better yet, build a boat or volunteer to assist.

Remember, while crossing the bridge to the club when damp, wet, snow/sleet covered it is slippery. Grab the handrail to help avoid falling.

This is my last House & Grounds article. I will be moving forward to Commodore and another Governor will be taking my place. It is a pleasure to have had this position for almost five years.

Membership Application Waiting List

The BLYC By-Laws allow applicants for membership to join from October 1st through January 31st and not be invoiced for the following year. After reviewing Club Membership numbers, the Board of Governors voted to open up membership for 2021-2022 on October 1st for the first 30 applicants on the New Member Waiting List that have completed all requirements (Online Application and letters from 2 Club sponsors on file.) Each applicant on the Waiting List will be notified of the Governors decision and invited to complete their Membership Application and remit payment of all fees. The Waiting List is determined by date of application and the date of receiving sponsorship letters.

Membership fees for 2022 are due on March 1, 2022. In March after the fees are collected, the Governors will review how many new memberships can be considered for 2022. The new member waiting list for 2021 will carry forward through 2022 until all that have completed requirements are considered for membership. If you have been asked to write a sponsor letter, please forward through BLYC contact information to the Membership Governor ASAP so that all applicants can become eligible for membership.


How Many Members Can BLYC Manage?

RACE & REGATTA

On Saturday, August 7th, Buckeye Lake Yacht Club hosted the Inaugural Cardboard Boat Regatta. It was a perfect day for the event with sunny skies and a temper ature in the lower 80's.

We had 7 boats making an appearance in this year's event. It was amazing to see the difference in the design and structure as well as the ingenuity expressed in the vessels. The crowds started arriving early and by race time, we had well over 200 cheering fans on the island enjoying the spectacle.

People come to such events for two reasons; 1) to view the different interpretation of what their builders would consider a sturdy cardboard boat, and 2) to watch the inevitable crash and burns. This event offered both. There was some discussion about the length of the course — would anybody be able to finish or would the course be too easy as to not challenge the integrity of the boats? The route started at the bridge to the entrance of the club on the north side of the island. It wound around the exterior of the island past the swimming pool and finished at the entrance of the basin on the south side of the island, roughly 200 yards long. Markers were used to identify the course boundaries. Out of the 7 boats competing, 3 did not finish either succumbing to the forces of gravity or forces of water eating away at the structural integrity of the cardboard. Participants of this year's event ranged in age from 10 years to over 60 years.

Given there were 7 boats, the decision was made to have 7 heats where each boat would maneuver solo around the course. The order of appearance was done by lottery picking the start number out of a bowl. From that time going forward, the boats were identified by the number they picked.

The four boats that successfully navigated the course received a time as follows:

Fourth Place with a time of 8 minutes and 5 seconds
was Boat # 4 piloted by Cheryl Boggess.

Third Place with a time of 4 minutes and 34 seconds
was Boat #3 piloted by Michael Smith.

Second Place with a time of 3 minutes 55 seconds
was Boat #2 piloted by Mia and Kait
(BLYC wait staff)

First Place with a time of 3 minutes 33 seconds
was Boat #7 piloted by Mark Moyer, Mark Watson and Jeff Rice.

This group of fearless sailors not only set the record time but also set the record for the most weight in the boat. Rumor has it the combined weight of the three men exceeded 600 pounds. They also set the record for the oldest group which we will politely point out was over 60 years old.

We used the regatta as an opportunity to raise funds for the Junior Sailing Program. That fundraising consisted of voting for Best In Show at \$1 a vote as well as bets on which boat was most likely to sink or to finish last, which boat would finish

first in time or distance and what would be the finish boats for first, second and third. Best in Show was awarded to Boat #7 with 176 votes cast in their favor. The fund raising efforts resulted in a donation of \$913.50 to the Junior Sailing Program.

The day was highlighted with much laughter, companionship, and community. In my humble estimation it was a very good day for BLYC. It was amazing watching the crowd follow the boats around the course.

It is my understanding that more than 600 photos were taken of the activities many of which have already been posted to the BLYC website. The excitement during the day was palpable and many comments were heard about being a contestant for next year's event. I want to take this time to thank all the volunteers that made this happen and would also like to thank the competitors who took the time to build their boats and show up for our inaugural event. A number of people have come up to me asking to be on the committee for next year's event and I look forward to working with all of them to make this a standout event on the club's calendar.

In other regatta news — the Sail on Sunday Summer series wrapped up with the following winners: in third place team *Endless Summer* skippered by Tom Reynolds, in second place Team *Runaway* skippered by David Paligo and in first place Team *Alberg* skippered by Bill Reynolds. On Sunday, August 15, we began the Fall Series of Sail on Sunday. Start time is always 1:00 pm and we invite the membership to come out on the porch and watch the sailors do their thing.

Carmen Ohio, Columbus City Water, and BLYC...

Charles "Brownie" Cornell was the Commodore of BLYC in 1924. He is one of only four of BLYC's Commodores for whom I haven't found a good photograph — which is odd. Not odd that a photograph may not exist for someone who lived so long ago, but definitely odd as "Brownie" wasn't just *any* member of the Club.

He was apparently a very active member, very involved in the central Ohio community, and particularly quite the character too. The August 10, 1921 issue of *Motorboat*, reported on the "new" feature of powerboat racing at the annual I-LYA Regatta at Put-in-Bay along with a recap of the traditional sailing races and other activities. Included in said article was the following, "A comical feature was added to the sailing program by Brownie Cornell of the Buckeye Lake Y.C. The first boat finishing in the ladies' cat boat class was that of Cornell, who had 'dolled up' as a woman." I guess there's a long tradition of BLYC members' "interesting" behavior at Put-in-Bay — that should give many of us comfort.

OK, not having a picture of a cross-dressing sailor might not be odd, but while obviously quite a character, Brownie was much more. Commodore Cornell was one of the chief engineers on both the O'Shaunessey and Hoover Dams — providing water for the City of Columbus. There is a small, relatively unknown, park dedicated to him on the east side of the Hoover Reservoir. The plaque designating the park reads,

CORNELL PARK

Dedicated in Honor of
C.B. "Brownie" Cornell
1880 – 1961

Who devoted his life to the development and construction of water supply facilities. His foresight and outstanding abilities in his chosen field are everywhere evident in the Columbus Water System.

Pretty impressive! Our friends at Hoover Sailing and Leatherlips Yacht Clubs owe, in part, the existence of the waters they sail on to a Past Commodore of BLYC.

Oh... and what does Carmen Ohio have to do with all of this? At one of the BLYC Tailgate Parties a few years back, P/C John Geiger asked the trivia question, "Who wrote Carmen Ohio?" At the time, I felt like I knew the answer, but just couldn't come up with it. I was certain that I'd read it somewhere before. As it turns out, I read it in the BLYC Log! In Commodore Limes' "Did You Know..." article in the March, 1982 Log, he mentioned Commodore Cornell and his works as an architect and engineer. He went on to elaborate that "It was Commodore Cornell's brother Fred who wrote the words of Carmen Ohio, OSU's Alma Mater... The year was 1902, four years before the founding of BLYC." 
