

How the Clubhouse Came to be...

The BLYC Clubhouse was officially dedicated on Sunday, May 4, 1913. It has faithfully served the needs of the membership for over 110 years. The story of how it came to be, however, includes several twists and turns, the dedication and philanthropy of many members, natrual disasters, and definitely a bit of luck. Last month, I profiled Commodore Harry Holbrook (1914-1915). While his contributions were great, he was far from the only member who made it possible.

As discussed last month, the upstart Buckeye Lake Yacht Club faced significant difficulty in finding a location for its clubhouse. It also faced nearly impossible financial challenges as well. As a new club, there was no treasury and they quickly discovered that any building would require raising significant funds for construction and materials. How did they accomplish that?...

The Buckeye Lake Building Company.

The Buckeye Lake Building Company was founded in January, 1907 as a for profit corporation separate from the club itself. It was brought into existence by club members with the stated purpose of "constructing and erecting buildings at or in the vicinity of Buckeye Lake, to be used for boat houses, club houses, or any similar purpose, and to acquire land and hold real estate necessary therefor; to build and equip, rent or sell sail, row or power boats; to erect and construct docks and wharves; provide harbors and anchorage facilities for boats; and to do any and all other things necessary or incidental to the execution of the afore said objects." — essentially, anything and everything necessary to have a "real" yacht club. It would then rent said facilities back to the club.

As discussed last month, by 1912 the membership's desire for a "real" clubhouse was strong. The BLYC board appointed a committee to investigate the possibilities. The committee reported back that construction of the building on Watkins Island would be the responsibility of Buckeye Lake Building Company, not that of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club as the Building Company held the lease on the island; and, that the Club itself, owning only about 160 shares of the approximately 500 sold by the building company, thus far, was not

in a position to control the corporation. Furthermore, it was within the power of the company to sell to any member or members of the Club any part or all of the nearly 500 shares still lying in its treasury. The situation also was complicated by the fact that a considerable number of individual stockholders were no longer members of the Club. Hence, it was not beyond the realm of possibility that control of the company and its property, and therefore that of the Club, could be manipulated out of the hands of the Club and its members. To prevent such possible calamity, the Club itself would have to acquire a majority of the company's total of 1000 shares of authorized capital stock.

Fortunately for BLYC, several officers of the Building Company were also officers of the club. In particular, sitting Commodore Harry Freeman, a well-known Columbus real estate developer, Walter Whitacre proprietor of a lumber and building products company, and architect Harry Holbrook. These men, with others, set out to secure enough shares under the Club's control to drive the project forward to erect a new clubhouse... which they did. Using their influence, they proposed that the Building Company erect the clubhouse and lease it back to the Club. In exchange, the club agreed to purchase the remaining unsold shares of the Building Company. Asset-rich and cash-poor (BLBC had less than \$20 in the back, the rest was in investments), they agreed and somehow financed the project at a cost of approximately \$5,000 (~\$150,000 in today's dollars.)

Construction began that summer and the new clubhouse was "substantially completed" by mid-February, with the second floor being finished by a group of club volunteers (as was also the case with much of the construction). Less than a month later, on March 31, the new clubhouse was completely awash — Watkins Island had reverted back to "Sunken Island" in the Great Flood of 1913. Coincidentally, that very same day, the directors of the Buckeye Lake Building Company met for their annual meeting. At that time, the Building Company had sold 776 shares of its authorized 1,000 total. Of those, Buckeye Lake Yacht Club controlled 663. With full control of both the meeting and the corporation, the Club moved forward making arrangements to buy the remaining shares and purchase the Clubhouse.

The following years would bring many

difficulties for the club — among other challenges, the Great War, a tornado nearly destroying the Clubhouse in 1928, and the Great Depression. Our history is unclear on how the Club managed to stay afloat financially and manage its debt during those years, but somehow the club survived. On November 25, 1938, at a sparsely-attended meeting of the Building Company, the club controlled 842 of the 844 shares in the corporation with Commodore Freeman owning the remaining two. The decision was made to dissolve the Building Company and transfer all of its physical properties and liabilities to the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. The club finally owned its home outright!

But, how did financially struggling BLYC gain control of so many of the Building Company shares?

The Wolfe family has long been associated with Buckeye Lake and improvements in the area. Robert F. Wolfe was an early member of the club. His son, Edgar would join following service in World War I and remain a loyal member of BLYC until his death. Edgar was an avid boater, both here and at Lake Erie. A very succesful and influential businessman, Edgar Wolfe was equally well known for this philathropy — as his obituary read, "The dominant motivation of Edgar Thurston Wolfe was the civic improvement of this community." Through the years, we was very active in the Club and often came to the club's aid in times of real need. He served as Commodore of BLYC in 1934 and of I-LYA in 1937. ... You may be thinking, "but what does this have to do with the Clubhouse?"

By the 1930's, many of the shares in the Building Company that were "under the control of BLYC" were, actually, owned by Edgar Wolfe. Over 50 years after the Club assumed control of the clubhouse, it was revealed by 1938 Commodore Bob Irwin that, for a number of years, Wolfe would meet annually with the Commodore to discuss the state of the club and that, at the end of such meetings, he would cast some of those shares into the club's fireplace. The final shares were so burned in the fall of 1938 in a meeting with 1939 Commodore Chris Lambrecht. Just days later, on November 28, the Building Company was officially, legally dissolved.

But then, we still didn't own the island — we leased it from the State of Ohio. There was no dining room — it and the Commodores Lounge were porches — no front patio, no pool... another story for another *Log*.


