

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Our True North

Several years ago, my youngest son and his wife accompanied Donna and me on a nighttime sailing adventure on Buckeye Lake. The evening was beautiful and breezy, with a nearly full moon lighting our way. The boat skimmed across the water as we enjoyed the ever-changing scenery. Even though the lights from the surrounding villages and the glow of the moon muted the brightness of the stars, we were still treated to a lovely display of celestial splendor.

As we peered at the stars we began to talk about the North Star, Polaris, and how it could be found by using the "pointer stars" on the Big Dipper constellation. I explained that the North Star is the only star in the northern sky that doesn't move as the other stars seem to travel in an arc around it as the earth rotates. Since ancient times, travelers have used the North Star and the tools of dead reckoning to determine true north and, thus, their location.

The late leadership guru, Stephen Covey, popularized the idea of "true north principles" in promoting his style of organizational leadership. Covey defined true north principles as fairness, kindness, dignity, charity, integrity, honesty, quality, service, and patience. While Covey admitted that there was not always agreement on how these principles should be defined, he said that most people acknowledged their merit. And I think he is right. Even immature children and hardened criminals, because "the work of the law is written on their hearts" (Romans 2:15), maintain a sense of what fairness or honesty looks like. The problem is that there is a tendency in sinful human nature to define these principles in terms of what is best for "me." Our conscience is easily seared by continually ignoring its still, small voice.

For Christians, our Polaris, our true north, is embodied in Jesus Christ who "was full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). We know that His words are reasonable and honest. The writer of Hebrews instructed us to "run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:1–2). Our internal compasses should always orient themselves to the true north instruction we find in the Word of God because, as the author, Jesus wrote the book.

LOOKING AFT

What do all those flags mean?

This month's "history" article isn't so much historical as it is perhaps educational. Recently, as part of the front basin project, we installed a new yardarm on the east side of the new patio. There are a number of flags flying from it, there are more on order, but what do they all mean?

A bit of background.... A "yard" is a horizontal spar on a mast from which sails are set. In the days of the old

sails are set. In the days of the old sailing ships, signal flags were hoisted on halyards (lines) off these yards to communicate with other vessels. According to Meriam-Webster, a yardarm is either end of that yard or horizontal spar. In yacht club vernacular, a flagpole with a yard is often just referred to as "yardarm." Our yardarm at BLYC, like those found at yacht clubs and naval bases all over the world, represents that mast and yard that would be found on a ship and serves a similar purpose.

At the top of the yardarm on the "mast" flies our BLYC burgee. This identifies our "ship," our club. Burgees are also flown on boats to identify the owner as a member of the club as well.

On sailing ships, officer flags are flown to indicate who the ranking officers are that are on board at the current time or which officer in the fleet is in command on that ship. On the right halyard of our yardarm as you look from the porch towards the lake, we fly officer flags for the three "flag officers" of the Club — Commodore (white on blue), Vice Commodore (white on red), and Rear Commodore (red on white) and one for our Past Commodores (3 stars and a fouled anchor; white on blue). At many clubs these are flown only when those officers are present. At BLYC, we typically fly them all

the time to show respect for those officers.

On the left side of the yard arm as you look towards the lake, you will find flags indicating our Club's affiliations with other organizations. In the upper-most spot on that side, we fly the burgee of the Inter-Lake Yachting Association, our regional sailing & boating authority in this area. Below that, we fly a pennant bearing the logo of US Sailing — the national governing body for the sport of sailing — of which we are also a member. Often, Clubs will also have a "courtesy spot" on their yardarm from which they may fly the burgee of another club when someone from that


Club is visiting.

On many yardarms at yacht clubs and naval bases, there is also a gaff — a "sprit" extending from the yard upward at an angle. In such a situation, protocol dictates that the U.S. Flag would be flown from a halyard on the gaff, not at the top of the center pole, as you might assume. This harkens back to the naval traditions that gave rise to yardarms. The national flag couldn't be clearly viewed if it were flown from the top of the ship's main mast. As such it was typically flown from the stern and the yard was reserved for other flags. U.S. Flag Code only dictates that the U.S. Flag must be at the top of flags flown on the same halyard.

Our BLYC yardarm was originally installed in 1976, and dedicated on July 4th of that year in memory of our 1971 Commodore Murray Headlee. Following his term, Commodore Headlee also served as BLYC's Secretary-Treasurer for several years. Commodore Headlee's family is now in it's 4th generation at BLYC. His son, Marty, sailed for BLYC in the 1950s and served on the board in the 1980s. His grandchildren, Tami & Chad, sailed in the 1980s & 90s. In recent years, four of his great-grandchildren — Suzannah, Katy, Clay, & Abby —

have also sailed for the club. This past summer, great-granddaughter Katy Schroeder was our head sailing instructor and great-grandson Clay Headlee coached our team at Junior Bay Week. It is my understanding that the new yardarm will also bear the dedication to Commodore Headlee.

If one looks around the clubhouse, there are certainly other club traditions that may warrant explanation. Some of these are explained in the BLYC History Archives on our website. It can be found under the "Our Club" tab. Here you will find many articles from past Club Historians and myself, the complete text of Commodore Kyle Armstrong's *History of Buckeye Lake* Yacht Club published for the Club's 50th Anniversary in 1956, an archive of past issues of the Log, and much more. There are certainly others that need to be researched and explained. What are you curious about? Let me know and I'll see what I can find.
