The 2024 Boating Season begins in April. BLYC has a limited number of boat docks available for lease at below market price. If you are a current dock holder, now is the time to let us know that you want to continue with your dock and/or exchange docks. Those who were temporarily moved from the island, will be moved back to their previous dock slips when the front basin project is completed.

If you would like a dock, please complete the Dock Request Form on the BLYC website. There is a waiting list for each dock area (Island, Area 8, and Eastport) and docks are given according to the rules in the Constitution and By-Laws. What's the Story Behind the Oars?

This past month, the ceiling tiles were replaced in the bar and the fireplace room. As part of that renovation, the "gutters" in the fireplace room were repainted along with the wall above them. It looks really nice. To prepare for the work, pictures and plaques needed to be taken down and some questions naturally arose...

First, why is there a "gutter" around the room?

Until just a few years ago, there was neon lighting encircling the fireplace room in that "gutter." This "cove lighting" was the Ladies Auxiliary's main Clubhouse improvement project of 1967. As announced in the April, 1967 issue of the Log, Paul Doritan and Norm Yoerger donated a great deal of time to installing the lighting. Mr. Yoerger was the owner of the Yoerger Sign Company in Columbus and, according to an "In Memoriam" announcement in the Log in 1987, had donated BLYC's iconic neon sign as well. He joined BLYC in 1917 at age 18 and served on the Board of Governors in 1951 and 1952. He was the 1953 recipient of the Heber Yachtsman Merit Trophy. Mr. Doritan was the father of current long-time member Vic Doritan. I will have to reach out to him and see what history tidbits he may have. Due to safety concerns owing to its age, the neon tubes and transformers were removed a few years back. Perhaps someday, we can replace them with LED lighting to return this nostalgic accent to the room.

Why's Gob's Mess?

Commodore Foster tackled this question back in October of 2005 when a curious young Commodore had asked him this very question..

Commodore Steve Harris suggested that I look into the origin and meaning of "gob's mess". Why would a yacht club name a bar room "gob's mess"? He said

"gob" was a term for a sailor.

The sources I saw tell me that the word "gob" originates from the Irish word "gob" which means "beak" or "bill". In British slang it came to mean "mouth". In middle English "gobbe" meant a large morsel of food or a large mouthful. One modern meaning is a large mouthful of food. Another is a large mouthful of something that is chewed and not swallowed, such as tobacco. Now it begins to sound like there is some connection to sailors, doesn't it.

The word "mess" means a quantity of food or a group of people who eat together, especially military or naval service people. That sounds familiar. The dictionary says that one meaning of "gob" is a sailor, usually an enlisted man in the U.S. Navy, but the origin of that meaning is unknown. Large mouthfuls of food or tobacco sure sounds to me like a sailor. Anyway, the Commodore is right. But why name a bar "gob's mess" when the food is mainly served in other rooms. Why not "Gob's Bar" or something more imaginative?

Comm. Kyle Armstrong's history provides the answer. The existing clubhouse was built in 1912 and 1913. In speaking of its opening, Comm. Armstrong said "Upon opening of the Club's ninth season, in 1914, its facilities overall were vastly augmented, improved and magnetically attractive to women as well as to men. The new clubhouse was ready for limited use, its utilities finally having been put into some kind of working order. Its large veranda and "ladies' room" scarcely could be denied the women-folk at any time-when on the island with their men-folk. Also, on such occasions, their use of the big lounge and "gobs' mess" could not well be refused when needed." Today that may sound a little sexist but remember, BLYC was a men's club then. In reference to 1916 Comm. Armstrong said "Meals were served in the "Gob's Mess" upon reservations, and a-la-carte service was available on order." So, it's called "Gob's Mess" because it was the room where members and sometimes female guests

ate, all fantasizing themselves as sailors of course.

Comm. Armstrong goes on to say "By the time Comm. Gettrost took the helm, the Gob's mess had been far outgrown as the Club's only mess room. Frequently, there had been overflows into the lounge. So, under apparently favorable conditions and with the enthusiastic leadership of the commodore, the Governors assumed responsibility for adding the present, glazed-in, dining room. Its construction proceeded during the season of '25, evidently without the Buckeye Lake Building Company having been bothered about it." This added dining room is, of course, the room on the West side of the clubhouse now overlooking the pool. The "lounge" is the current fireplace room.

Moving to 1947, Comm. Armstrong reports "During winter, the house committee had asphalt, tile flooring laid in the Ladies' Room and Gobs' Mess, moving the old bar from in front of the kitchen door and rebuilding it in its present location along the north wall." I will have to ask Comm. Gus Schell to tell me about that. He was here then. At that time the North wall was the back of the present bar.


When I joined BLYC in 1976, the bar was in the present location but shorter than the current, extraordinarily beautiful bar that replaced it. Was that the bar from 1947? In 1976 the era of the bottle club was just ending. We had obtained a club liquor license. No longer was it necessary to bring your own bottle, mark it and store it in a locker upstairs. I suspect that was an important function of those upstairs lockers. I recall that, when we had to open some of those steel lockers because the members who had them had gone or we didn't know who they belonged to, we found bottles in some of them. They were put to the good use for which they were intended.

So, it becomes clear. "Gob's Mess" was the place where the sailors ate. They might have had a little to drink too. May this BLYC tradition continue ad infinitum.

So.. What about the oars?

This one is a bit tougher. A reading of Commodore Armstrong's history suggests that, in the early years, BLYC's "regattas" were not exclusively sailing events. In fact, we know that until amateur powerboat racing was made illegal in the 1930's by the state of Ohio, the Club's annual holiday regattas were as popular for their motorboating events as for their sail races. For his history display at the centennial commemorative event marking the first meeting of BLYC in May of 1906, Commodore Foster included an old photo of young men rowing a canoe clearly marked "OSU" on Buckeye Lake.



Through my investigation into our 2nd Commodore, Charles Lynch (January, 2018), I learned that most "regattas" in the early years also included "other sports." Among these were swimming, diving, and rowing. Commodore Lynch was heavily involved in the Amateur Athletic Union and also the US Olympic Committee. As a Club with the "promtion of yachting and aquatic sports" as a key part of its mission statement, it is certainly plausible that BLYC held rowing events, perhaps even intercollegiate competitions, in those early years.

In 1993, our Race, Regatta and Junior Sailing Governor was Fred Wright (Commodore, 1997). He reported in his May *Log* article that, wanting to know more about BLYC's history, he approached Commodore Chris Lambrecht (1939). Chris' reply was "Well, you can't find anyone older than me and I know a lot about the club and its history. There are two things I know nothing about and they are the oar and skiff paddle that are above the light valance over the door between the fireplace room and the bar."

Chris joined the Club in 1922 as a junior member. One can probably assume from Chris' comments that the oars were already hanging there when he joined. Maybe their significance was already forgotten by that time. We may never know the answer. Whatever the history behind them, they have hung in the fireplace room for over a century! Now returned to their original location after the ceiling replacement, may they continue to do so for another century as well.

A Special Work of God's Providence

Most of us can recite the common stories associated with the Pilgrim Separatists and their coming to the New World to seek religious freedom and a new life. I'd like to highlight one lesser-known event that Governor William Bradford relates in his biography *Of Plymouth Plantation*.

After a couple false starts, the *Mayflower* was finally enroute to America. The second ship that was to make the voyage, the *Speedwell*, was grounded because it began taking on water. So, many of *Speedwell's* passengers crowded on the *Mayflower*. Fewer than half of the 102 people on board were Separatists; they were mostly young to middle-aged men who were going to America for adventure or to seek their fortunes. Some of these passengers were not kind to the Pilgrims, making fun of them for their strict religious beliefs and chaste behavior.

Bradford tells of one young man whose demise, in Bradford's opinion "was a special work of God's providence." In his own words:

"There was a proud and very profane young man, one of the seamen, of a lusty, able body, which made him the more haughty; he would alway be contemning the poor people in their sickness and cursing them daily with grievous execrations; and did not let to tell them that he hoped to help to cast half of them overboard before they came to their journey's end, and to make merry with what they had; and if he were by any gently reproved, he would curse and swear most bitterly. But it pleased God before they came half seas over, to smite this young man with a grievous disease, of which he died in a desperate manner, and so was himself the first that was thrown overboard. Thus his curses light on his own head, and it was an astonishment to all his fellows for they noted it to be the just hand of God upon him."

The Apostle Peter reminds us "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble" (1 Peter 5:5, ESV). During this Thanksgiving season, let us remember to humbly thank God "from whom all blessings flow."


