The ceiling tile replacement project started on Monday, October 16th and was completed on Friday,






October 20th. This project included new lighting installed in the bar and fire place room ceilings. In addition, three


There's been a lot going on in the Clubhouse this past year new ceilings, updates to the dining room, seawall construction and more. Sometimes, as we make progress, it's also good to take a look back to see how far we've come. It occured to me recently as I was looking out the new windows in our lakeview dining room, that 2024 will be the 100th year of our use of that dining room. Previous to the 1925 season, it was a porch. Here is Commodore Foster's 1985 article about that porch — SGH

The West Porch of the Clubhouse

Have you ever sat in the west dining room and looked west across Buckeye Lake? Did you ever wonder what the same view looked like about 71 years ago? Like the Commodores' Lounge, the west dining room was once a porch. The left photograph is dated August 19, 1914 and looks west. The lake looks the same, the trees are many and small and the column of the porch is identical to those now on the front porch. The railing appears to be wainscot like the type found in the upstairs of the club. The floor was wood and so was the furniture. It would be interesting to stand outside the club and see if the present very large tree still standing on the island is one of the trees in the photograph (Editor's Note: the tree to which P/C Foster refers was removed in 2003 due to disease and decay). It probably is. The other photograph is marked with the same date. I will need someone to tell me what it shows.

These photographs were received by Governor Greg Alspach when he was *Log* Editor. They were sent to him by Mrs. M. F. (Ruth) Howard. My sincerest appreciation. I will retain these photographs for future display. If others of you have old photographs around the lake and especially of the yacht club, I would appreciate any copies.



CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

A One-Sided Christmas Surprise

You've seen the famous oil painting by Emanuel Leutze, and you've heard the phrase "Washington Crossing the Delaware," but do you know the story of the first Commander-in-Chief's Christmas nautical adventure? Independence had been declared in July of that year, 1776, but this was only the beginning of a long and difficult slog toward the young nation's true independence from Great Britian. Several times through that summer, fall, and into December, the under-equipped Continental Army had encountered the vastly superior British forces and had escaped total annihilation due to Washington's cunning and through apparently Providential interventions. Now, the Americans, after having retreated across New Jersey and into Pennsylvania, were encamped on the west side of the Delaware, hoping that the river and the winter weather would keep the British forces at bay.

Washington needed a decisive victory. Morale was low among the men, and most of their enlistments would come up at the end of the year. He devised an ingenious plan to make a surprise attack on the Hessian mercenary forces stationed across the Delaware in Trenton, New Jersey. This attack would come in the predawn hours of December 26. Surely the Hessians had celebrated all Christmas Day, and the schnapps would have flowed freely, causing them to sleep heavily that night.

As the Continental troops stealthily loaded into boats and started across the river, a violent snow and hailstorm came up suddenly, reducing the visibility to near zero. At first this seemed like a blow to the American effort, but the effect was actually reversed. Most of the enemy sentries took cover inside and, besides, what general in his right mind would purposely mount an offensive under such conditions?

The surprise was so total that the Hessians could not believe what was happening. Henry Knox was there, and in a letter to his wife a few days later he said, "The hurry, fright, and confusion of the enemy was not unlike that which will be when the last trump will sound." The American victory was overwhelming. Only 5 men were injured on the Continental side, but the British forces suffered 22 killed, 83 wounded, and 800 missing or captured. Once again quoting Henry Knox, he told Mrs. Knox that "Providence seemed to have smiled on every part of this enterprise."

The Apostle Paul said in Romans 8:31, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" God proved He was "for us" by sending His beloved Son on that first Christmas, to live and die on our behalf, so we can have the assurance of total victory when the last trumpet sounds.

May you and your family enjoy the Holidays!

It is time to renew your dock lease and/or Eastport Boatyard storage lease. The leases are included with your 2024 membership invoice. Each year you need to sign and return the leases with boat and/or trailer information which includes a copy of the current boat registration and the declaration page of your boat insurance. The current BLYC insurance carrier requires this to be on file in our office. Thank you for being compliant with this requirement. If your lease agreement is not included with your invoice, please contact me at docksandrentals@ buckeyelakeyc.com.

Please note that construction on the front basin is on schedule and we expect all boats will be returned to Watkins Island this spring. The amenities on the island will include water and electricity for all boat docks.

Our Dock Rental fees for 2024 are as follows:

Eastport Docks — ^{\$}1,200 Area 8 Docks — ^{\$}1,300 Watkins Island East — ^{\$}2,100 Watkins Island Front Basin — ^{\$}2,100 Watkins Island West Basin — ^{\$}2,100 Watkins Island Back Basin — ^{\$}620

Eastport Storage (Nov 1 through Oct 31) — \$450

If you are interested in changing docks or getting a dock for 2024, complete the Dock Application on the website under Docks and Rentals. We also have storage areas available in the Eastport Boatyard.

I hope this Membership update finds you enjoying the holiday season here at the club with your friends and family.

As mentioned before, membership is at capacity with a waitlist for new members. If you sponsor a prospective member, they will be added to the waitlist once I receive their online application and two sponsor letters. Remember, only the actual member and not the first mate can sponsor a new applicant. Also, the only applicants not subjected to the waitlist would be a member's adult child who is under the age of 40.

Effective December 1st, securing a spot on the waitlist will also require a refundable \$500 deposit, which will be applied to the initiation dues once the prospective member comes off of the waitlist. Also, if a prospective member's circumstances change (e.g. move...) the \$500 will be refunded to them.

The main functionality currently is that you can view all of your club charges in real time and pay your monthly bill online. More functionality will be added in the future as this will be the hub for everything!

If there is anyone you know, like and care about that you think would be a good member for the club, have them submit an online membership application and get on the waitlist. 2024 is going to be an amazing year with the completion of the front basin project.




