
BAR & KITCHEN

With the holidays in our rearview mirror, everyone on the board is looking forward to another great year at the club. This one will be special due to the pending completion of the front basin project. BLYC will be the place to be on the lake this coming summer!

As mentioned before, membership is at capacity with a waitlist for new members. If you sponsor a prospective member, they will be added to the waitlist once I receive their online application and 2 sponsor letters. Remember, only the actual member and not the first mate can sponsor a new applicant. Also, the only applicants not subjected to the waitlist would be a member's adult child who is under the age of 40.

Effective December 1st, securing a spot on the waitlist will also require a refundable \$500 deposit, which will be applied to the initiation dues once the prospective member comes off of the waitlist. Also, if a prospective member's circumstances change (e.g. move...) the \$500 will be refunded to them.

Like last year, membership will reopen once we see what the attrition looks like from the annual dues cycle. You should be receiving your statements soon. It is important for prospective members to get on the waitlist now so they can be considered once membership reopens.

If you haven't set up your member portal, please get that done. So far, 365 members have signed up. Let's get to 100%! You can go to the club website, www.buckeyelakeyc. com, and click on the Member Portal box on the home page. There is also a link right there for a brief tutorial on using the portal. The main functionality currently is that you can view all of your club charges in real time and pay your monthly bill online. More functionality will be added in the future as this will be the HUB for everything! Also, you now have the ability to receive your monthly statements, monthly *Log* and weekly e-News update electronically. Please reach out to the office to take advantage of this because it saves the club a lot of money by being paperless.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE

The Board of Governors is currently considering changes to Article XI. Rule 24 of the By-Laws regarding DOCK BOXES. As required by Article X of the BLYC Constitution, the changes are being published in the January issue of the Log. The Board of Governors would appreciate all feedback and suggestions from the membership.

CURRENT BY-LAWS

ARTICLE XI. RULES GOVERNING CONDUCT ON PREMISES AND USE OF FACILITIES. **RULE 24 - DOCK & STORAGE RULES**

7b. All gear incidental to storage must be removed immediately after launching or be disposed of. 7c. Boats must be launched by June 1st or demurrage of 2 1/2 cents lineal foot/day will be charged.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE

ARTICLE XI. RULES GOVERNING CONDUCT ON PREMISES AND USE OF FACILITIES. **RULE 24 - DOCK & STORAGE RULES** ADD THE FOLLOWING...

7d. No items or dock boxes are permitted on any pier, dock, or walkway in any of the docking areas.

REASONS FOR REQUESTED CHANGE

The new piers and walkways are only 5 feet in width. Adding a Dock Box and/or leaving items on the walkway would create a trip hazard.

DOCKS & RENTALS

Dock Renewal and Boatyard Renewal. It is time to renew your dock lease and/or Eastport boatyard storage lease. The leases are included with your 2024 membership invoice. Each year, you need to sign and return the leases with boat and/or trailer information which includes a copy of the current boat registration and the declaration page of your boat insurance. The current BLYC insurance carrier requires this to be on file in our office. Thank you for being compliant with this requirement. If your lease agreement is not included with your invoice, please contact me at docksandrentals@buckeyelakeyc.com.

Please note that construction on the front basin is on schedule and we expect all boats will be returned to Watkins Island this spring. The amenities on the island will include water and electricity for all boat docks. Our dock rental fees for 2024 are as follows:

Eastport Docks:	\$1,200
Area 8 Docks:	\$1,300
Watkins Island East:	\$2,100
Watkins Island Front Basin:	\$2,100
Watkins Island West Basin:	\$2,100
Watkins Island Back Basin:	\$ 620
Eastport Storage (Nov 1 - Oct 31):	\$ 450

If you are interested in changing docks or getting a dock for 2024, complete the dock application on the website under "Our Club" > "Docks and Storage." We also have storage areas available in the Eastport boatyard.

Proposed Change to By-Laws. Before construction the piers were 10 feet wide and BLYC permitted dock boxes. The new construction allowed for 5 feet wide piers and smaller walkways between docks. The Board of Governors and New Construction Committee requested that we eliminate dock boxes to prevent trip hazards. As such, the Board of Governors is proposing that we change the BLYC By-Laws and our perpetual dock lease agreement so that we eliminate all dock boxes to improve the safety of our members.

The proposal for change to the By-Laws regarding dock boxes is published in this issue of the *Log* for your review. Please contact myself and/or any of the Governors to comment on this change.

 ${\it Change to BLYC Perpetual Dock Rental Agreement.}$

CHANGE FROM: 6. All items stored in the docking area must be kept in an approved docking box with permission from the Governor of Docks. CHANGE TO: 6. No items or dock boxes are permitted on any pier, dock, or walkway in any of the docking areas including Watkins Island, Area 8 and Eastport docking areas.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

I Am Not Afraid of Storms

In my final pre-retirement role as an educational administrator I worked on a team to establish the Ohio Virtual Academy, one of the first statewide kindergarten through 12th grade e-schools. This was no easy task. Seamless internet access had yet to be established across the state, and many families (and teachers) struggled to implement the new technology employed by the school. The small, initial group of teachers and administrators met regularly to hack through the avalanche of difficulties we encountered.

My birthday fell during the early months of our efforts. Knowing that I was struggling under a lot of stress, the team presented to me a framed version of the famous quotation by Louisa May Alcott taken from her literary classic *Little Women*:

I am not afraid of storms, for I am learning how to sail my ship.

This gift was especially encouraging to me, and I reflected on those words often during the following months.

Our family on my father's side moved to Ohio from Kansas during the height of the Great Depression. The lean economic realities, the harsh conditions created by the dust bowl, and even destructive invasions by hungry, crop-devouring grasshoppers made the move a necessity. Dad tells stories of his father losing his Ford dealership to bankruptcy, and of trying to outrun a tornado as it bore down on their small town. When I catch myself whining about how tough our times are today, I repent when I recall the extreme difficulties my father's family and their friends encountered during those years.

Rough weather hones a sailor's skills. Tough times build character. The God of providence allows us to suffer under these circumstances for reasons that we vainly try to discern this side of eternity. Even so, saints of old in the pages of scripture encourage us to rest in faith knowing that His purposes do work for our ultimate good and for His glory.

Everyone is getting excited about Winterfest, but I haven't seen winter weather yet. I was thinking back the other day to the first Winterfest celebration that the Buckeye Lake Region Chamber of Commerce put on. It seemed like a crazy idea at the time! (Is this really the 10th year? How time flies!) P/C Tim Ryan was active in the planning and he and I were discussing some of the upcoming events over a few beverages at the Buckeye Lake Brewery one evening. Somewhere in the conversation (certainly emboldened by the brewery's offerings), I offered to sail my DN iceboat back and forth in front of the North Shore Ramp during the fireworks. Yes, we actually had ice most of January and February that winter! Well, the day of the event came and it was cold — the wind chills were well below zero. I'm not the intrepid, adventurous sort that perhaps I was in my younger days. The iceboat stayed in the garage that Winterfest. Sadly, there hasn't been another opportunity since. Who knows? Maybe we'll get a deep freeze in the next few weeks. (Did I really just suggest a 6:00 am sail?)

Iceboating at Buckeye Lake


Iceboat racing is popular in northern areas — way north of here — but not all that common in our area. That has not always been the case. In fact, at one time, it was very popular at BLYC! The earliest historical reference I can find is in Kyle Armstrong's Story of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. He states that the lake, in January 1910, "when frozen over... offered some good, clean, unimpedimented, ice-boating thrills." He also reports that in 1912, "Two new ice-boats added to the Club's fleet had raised it's total to six. They were singing all over the Lake's glassy-hard surface." In those early days, most iceboats here were "Skeeter Sayre built" — presumably at Sayre Brothers' Marina, next door to the Club. Zenna once told me that Sayre

Brothers used to be the exclusive builder of iceboats in this area. Was "Skeeter" was one of the Sayre brothers? "Skeeter" also refers to a particular design of ice sailer dating back to the early 20th century so... well, I guess I need to do some more

investigation. Those craft were steered from the stern like most "soft-water" boats — unlike the bow-steered iceboats we see today. Iceboating continued in earnest at the Club, as

conditions would permit, for many years. In the archives, we have a number of old photos of iceboats and iceboating. According to Armtrong, in the mid-twentieth century iceboating was a regular part of the Club's racing program! Either winters were colder then, or Buckeye Lake yachtsmen were much braver. Our history records are peppered with stories of iceboating at Buckeye Lake in the early days of the Club — including one from Frank H. Miller, long-time BLYC member and P/C of Putin-Bay Yacht Club and I-LYA, in which he recalls the 1917/18 iceboating season ending "... with Sid Allen sailing an iceboat on soft, floating ice with Max [Slaughter] and I sailing alongside in his canoe. Nobody thought to take a picture."



I'm not sure that our BLYC iceboaters today are that bold. But, from time to time, we are able to get out on the hard water and scream along the nearly frictionless ice for a thrilling

ride — followed, of course, by an rest inside the Clubhouse to warm up, share stories, and have a drink or two enjoying the company of our fellow BLYC members. Isn't *that*, after all, really the most enjoyable winter activity at our lake?

HOUSE & GROUNDS

As we approach the end of 2023, work continues on the front basin. The I-beams supporting the exterior wall on the west and south sides of the island have been hammered in place and, at the time of this writing, we are waiting for the water levels to drop so that we may weld the horizontal support angle iron to reinforce the structure. You may have noticed that we have adjusted the opening of the basin approximately 12 feet to the east so that it will line up better with the center of the front porch and the newly installed compass rose on the patio. Weather permitting, we expect that the seawall will be installed once the welding has been completed. In addition, you should be seeing the fill that now is located on the south side of the patio to be removed in preparation to use that space for the storage of materials that will be needed for completion of the project.

In our last construction meeting, it was decided that the wharf making up the south side of the basin will be widened from 5 feet to 9 feet to mirror the width of the wharf where the race shack is positioned. This is being done to provide more space for spectators viewing our numerous regattas. Finally, the removal of the old steel should be under way some time at the beginning of the new year. In a perfect world, we would be able to just pull this steel from the bottom of the lake and dispose of it, but because of its age and deterioration, that option may not be possible. We have always anticipated it might be necessary to have divers with underwater torches cut the steel as it enters the bottom of the lake and remove it that way. Prior to taking that step, our plan is to use a power jet system to loosen the material around the steel hopefully making it possible to remove it without the need of cutting it.

We have created a new committee to look into the purchasing of patio furniture for the front basin patio. This committee will also be looking into acquiring large planters so that we may provide green spaces which should go a long way in softening up the large concrete patio. There will be more to come on this aspect of the project in articles to come. The new elevator providing access to the front porch has been ordered and we are told that it should be installed some time toward the end of February. We have also started to take the preliminary steps for the replacement of rear steel staircase located on the north side of the clubhouse. This would include engineering and architectural drawings that are required for the proper permitting of the project.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all our members a happy and prosperous new year and look forward to continuing our efforts in making improvements to our club in the upcoming year.
